Arrangement for conduct of election.

Divisional President

[1] On 11 August and 26 August 2021 the Electrical, Energy and Services Division (the **Division**) of the Communications, Electrical, Electronic, Energy, Information, Postal, Plumbing and Allied Services Union (the **Organisation**) of Australia lodged with the Registered Organisations Commission (the **Commission**) prescribed information for an election to fill the following offices for a new term of office:

Victoria (3)

Queensland (2)

- [2] I note that on 20 May and 1 July 2020, the organisation lodged prescribed information (in matter **E2020/84**) for an election for Division offices, which are the same offices sought in this election matter, **E2021/162**. On 8 July 2020, the Organisation advised the Commission of its withdrawal of the prescribed information in **E2020/84**, noting that submission of a rule alteration application to the Fair Work Commission (FWC) proposing alterations to rule 15 (Elections) of Section B of the Divisional rules was imminent.
- On 10 July 2020, the rule alteration application (R2020/95) was lodged with the FWC and was certified by the FWC on 23 July 2020¹. The effect of the rule alteration was to vary the

frequency of elections, and the length of terms of office, from a one year term to a four year term. The offices for which election is sought in this matter, E2021/162 (and in E2020/84 previously) are among the offices affected by the rule change. Relevantly, the rules also provide for a transitional term of office to apply until the 2023 quadrennial election).²

- [4] It is noted that on 16 September and 17 October 2020, the organisation lodged a further rule alteration application with the FWC (R2020/149 and R2020/165) seeking alterations to Section B of the Divisional rules, in particular rule 7 (Divisional Council), and a further alteration to rule 15 (Elections).
- [5] On 3 November 2020, that application was certified by the FWC³. The effect of those alterations, in particular to sub-rule 7.5 (Annual Meetings of Divisional Council), is that the Divisional Council may determine to hold the annual meeting of the Divisional Council (known as the Divisional Conference)⁴ at a later time than previously prescribed under the Divisional rules, in circumstances where the happening or likely happening of a 'critical event' may render the programming of the Divisional Conference practically or administratively impossible.⁵ This alteration to sub-rule 7.5 has sought to remedy the difficulty that the organisation faced in arranging for the in-person meeting of members of the 2020 Divisional Conference due to the COVID-19 pandemic, at which the collegiate election of offices was required to be held.
- [6] I am satisfied that an election for the abovenamed offices is required to be held under the rules of the organisation and, under subsection 189(3) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009*, I am making arrangements for the conduct of the election by the Australian Electoral Commission.
