Rule 26(ii) and Rule 76(j) conflict – the Returning Officer determined that the roll would closes 14 days before nominations open, and members eligible to be on the Roll of Voters at that time would be eligible to vote in the election.

Rule 26(ii) states the Roll of Voters closes 14 days before nominations opening. Rule 76(j) states votes cast by members who are not financial in accordance with the Constitution on the day the votes are counted and not valid will be disregarded.

- After the cut-off date (roll close), the roll of voters can only be changed to correct errors (section 143(6)), and to remove the names of persons who have ceased to be members of the organisation.
- A member who was financial on the Roll of Voters cut-off date (roll close), and therefore eligible on that date, but who subsequently becomes unfinancial after the roll of voters cut-off date (roll close), should not be deleted from the roll of voters unless the person ceases to be a member of the organisation.

The Pharmacy Guild of Australia in its response to the Post Election Report for E2020/35 advised that it proposes to amend rule 76(j) so it is consistent with rule 26(ii).

Response to Post-election Report (E2021/206)

I refer to the Post-election Report issued by the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) dated 11 April 2022 regarding elections for The Pharmacy Guild of Australia (E2021/206). In this report reference is made to the following rules that are considered by the AEC to be difficult to apply and/or interpret. A response is also set out below.

Conflicting rules 26(ii) & 76(j) – The Returning Officer determines that the role will close 14 days before nominations open in accordance with rule 26(ii) for two reasons: 1) rule 76(j) cannot be put into place...it will not be possible to identify who is financial on the day of the count and 2) rule 26(ii) aligns with the intention of section 143.

The Guild agrees that rules 26(ii) and 76(j) are contradictory in that rule 26(ii) indicates that the rolls for eligible voters closes 14 days prior to the day on which nominations for the elections open and that rule 76(j) states that votes cast by members that are not financial on the day the votes are counted are not valid and should be disregarded. The Guild also agrees that rule 26(ii) is consistent with section 143 of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009*.

The Guild proposes to amend rule 76(j) so that it becomes consistent with rule 26(ii), that is, clarify that the rolls for eligible voters closes 14 days prior to the day on which nominations for the elections open.
