Pursuant to RAO subsection 189 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 and Regulation 138 of the Workplace Relations Act (RAO) Regulation 2003, I advise that elections for the following offices within the Australian Municipal, Administrative, Clerical & Services Union (ASU) are due to be held in 2007.

National President (1) National Vice-President (1) National Secretary (1) Assistant National Secretaries (2)

The Rules provide that nominations open on the Wednesday following the expiration of 28 days after the completion and declaration of all Branch elections for the offices of Branch National Executive Representatives, or the first Wednesday in July, whichever is the earlier.
