IMMEDIATE ACTION REQUIRED:

You must take steps after your recent election E2024/80

An election has recently been completed by the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) for the "Automotive, Food, Metals, Engineering, Printing and Kindred Industries Union" known as the Australian Manufacturing Workers' Union (AMWU) and a post-election report has been issued by the AEC.

This letter explains the next steps you must take, including what information you need to give to members and what information you need to lodge with the Fair Work Commission (the Commission).

What you must do right now

- Let your members know about the election report issued by the AEC
- Arrange financial training for officers newly elected to an office with financial management duties. (This
 includes all members of the committee of management).
- Complete the notification of change and email it to the Commission at regorgs@fwc.gov.au

This letter explains these steps and the tools available to help you.

STEP 1: Notify members

You must put a notice on your website once you receive your post-election report. It must tell your members they can request a copy of the post-election report from you or the AEC (regulation 141). The notice must be on your website for at least three months.



Can we put more information on our website?

Yes! Being transparent is part of good governance. You can publish the whole report or the declaration of results, as well as your notice and leave them up longer than three months. You can always do more than the regulatory minimum.

The Commission will also publish your declaration of results on our website.

STEP 2: Financial training

You may have to arrange financial training for people elected to new roles.

All officers with financial management duties must complete approved financial training (section 293K). For information on when officers must redo training and hints on when to book training for officers taking up multiple offices please see our fact sheet.

There are face-to-face and online financial training packages on the Commission website.

You must act on this now, as affected officers MUST complete approved financial training OR receive an exemption by the Commission within six months of beginning to hold office.



Good governance tip:

Organisations should instruct officer holders about their other obligations. This is especially important for committee of management members.

Our podcast covers the <u>benefits of officer induction</u>. Officers have responsibilities under the rules, the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (the RO Act), and disclosure requirements around conflicts of interest, remuneration and material personal interests. Officers will benefit from our <u>officer induction kit</u> and our <u>podcast, such as episode 17 - conflicts of interest</u>.

STEP 3: Notifications of change



A notification of change must be lodged with the Commission within **35 days** of the change occurring.

We have a <u>template</u> to help you with this, which you can send to <u>regorgs@fwc.gov.au</u>. An officer must sign the completed notification template.

You must lodge a notification of change if:

- any of your officers have not been re-elected;
- · officers have changed offices; or
- you have new officers.

Only notify us of changes that have **already occurred.** If people take up office in the future, you must wait until the change happens before lodging the notification within 35 days of the change.

Note: One election may result in many notifications of change.



Penalties apply

Failing to lodge your notifications of change on time can expose your organisation and its officers to significant penalties.

Real-life example of penalties in Court An organisation failed to make a series of notifications of change on time.

The Full Court said 'The record-keeping obligations imposed under the Registered Organisations Act are treated by the legislature as important and serious, and contravention of those obligations are correspondingly serious.'

The organisation was ordered to pay a penalty. More information is available in our <u>case summary</u>.

Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 s.189—Arrangement for conduct of an election

"Automotive, Food, Metals, Engineering, Printing and Kindred Industries Union" known as the Australian Manufacturing Workers' Union (AMWU) (E2024/80)

Arrangement for conduct of election.

[1] On 17 April 2024, the "Automotive, Food, Metals, Engineering, Printing and Kindred Industries Union" known as the Australian Manufacturing Workers' Union (AMWU) (organisation) lodged prescribed information, and on 22 May and 31 May 2024 lodged amended prescribed information with the Fair Work Commission for an election to fill casual vacancies and insufficient nominations received in previous elections (E2022/182 and E2023/128) in the following offices and non-office positions, for the remainder of the term:

- [2] I note that one of the abovenamed vacancies the Queensland Branch Employed Delegate to National Conference arose after a person was declared elected (unopposed) to that role in March 2023 and was then due to take office from 1 July 2023, but left the organisation before that date.
- [3] In addition (but in converse circumstances), the vacant offices for the Victorian Branch Rank and File Delegate to National Conference and the Victorian Branch Rank and File Delegate to State Conference arose after the person elected to both of those offices in May 2023, had commenced employment with the organisation in June 2023 a date before he was due to take office on 1 July 2023. Due the change of his employment status with the organisation in the intervening period before he took office, the elected person was no longer regarded as a rank-and-file member (which in the organisation's rules excludes AMWU employees) and therefore was ineligible to take up those two Rank and File Delegate offices.
- [4] The organisation's rules, including rules 5B1.1 and 6B.1, provide for the office of Female Delegates to National Council. The rules provide that if the number of women represented on Council is less than 10%, an election would be required. The Commission has been advised that at the time of the scheduled election (E2022/182) being declared, the composition of the National Council was such that an election for Female Delegates to National Council was not required.
- [5] However, following the resignation of the Assistant National Secretary (an ex-officio member of National Council), an election for Female Delegate to National Council may be required, depending on whether the Assistant National Secretary office is or is not filled by a female member.
- [6] I am satisfied that an election for the abovenamed offices and non-office positions is required to be held under the rules of the organisation and, under subsection 189(3) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009*, I am making arrangements for the conduct of the election by the Australian Electoral Commission.
