Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 s.189—Arrangement for conduct of an election

Arrangement for conduct of election.

[1] On 8 July 2024 the Local Government, Racing and Cemeteries Employees Union (the **Union**) lodged with the Fair Work Commission (the **Commission**) prescribed information for an election to fill the following offices for a new term of office:

[2] This decision relates to an inaugural election for the Union following recent rule alterations. The alterations effected substantial changes to the Union's rules, including the abolition of the Western Australian Division (WA Division) and modification of the Union

structure to largely replicate that of the now-former WA Division and the existing State Counterpart association.² The new rules set out provisions facilitating the transition to the new structure, including the requirement for an election for all offices in 2024.

- [3] Rule 58 further provides that the Union Conference and Executive shall commence upon declaration of the 2024 election, at which time the currently operating Union Council will cease to exist.³
- [4] I am satisfied that an election for the abovenamed offices is required to be held under the rules of the organisation and, under subsection 189(3) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009*, I am making arrangements for the conduct of the election by the Australian Electoral Commission (the **AEC**).
- [5] Transitional rule 58 of the Union's rules provides that the 2024 election shall occur 'as soon as practicable after certification of the transitional rule.' For this reason, I request that the AEC prioritise the conduct of this election.
