Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 s.189—Arrangement for conduct of an election

Arrangement for conduct of election.

[1] On 18 July 2024 the Western Australian Branch (the **Branch**) of the Australian Education Union (the **organisation**) lodged with the Fair Work Commission prescribed information for an election to fill the following offices for a new term of office:

[2] Rule 2(1)(b) of the 'Federal Branch rules in relation to the Western Australian Branch' provides that, in relation to the members of Branch Council, the number to be elected from each

district is one delegate for every 100 members, or part thereof, in that district. The date for the calculation of district entitlements is 'the final gazetted date of the school year ending immediately prior to the conduct of the election of Branch Councillors'. In relation to this election that is the final gazetted day of the 2024 school year, being 12 December 2024.

- [3] As the prescribed information was lodged by the Branch before this date (and, also, in advance of the day prescribed by regulation 138(3) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009*), the specific number of delegates to be elected from each district could not be specified at the time of lodgement. Nor can it be specified at the time of issuing this decision.
- [4] The rules provide that 'Each district shall elect representatives to Branch Council every two years, during the first school division term'. The new term of office is not due to commence until 20 March 2025. The prescribed information advises that the precise date for opening of nominations is to be determined by the Returning Officer. As such, it is reasonably anticipated that the precise number of Branch Councillors for each District will be ascertained in advance of the call for nominations by the Australian Electoral Commission (the **AEC**) as, in practical terms, this needs to be identified in order for the election to proceed.
- [5] The rules of the organisation have provided that the offices listed above had 12-month terms of office. Rule alterations recently certified by the Commission on 28 March 2024, in matters **R2023/135** and **R2024/38**,⁴ have changed this to a two year term, however these changes do not take effect until the conclusion of the term of office for the incumbent Branch Council members in 2025.⁵ Consequently, the term of office for the Members of Branch Council elected in this forthcoming election (E2024/123) whose term is due to commence in March 2025 will be two years, as it will for subsequent terms (absent any further rule change).
- [6] I am satisfied that an election for the abovenamed offices is required to be held under the rules of the organisation and, under subsection 189(3) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act* 2009, I am making arrangements for the conduct of the election by the AEC.

The number of Branch Council members for each district shall be determined in accordance with Federal branch Rule 2 (1)(b).

The voting system is by direct election. Under Rule 13 (9A), the roll of voters for any election is to be closed seven days before the day on which nominations are opened. Under Rule 9 (8), nominations for election to Branch Council shall be called at least fourteen days prior to the date on which nominations close.

The dates and times that nominations close are to be fixed by the Returning Officer pursuant to the Rules.
