

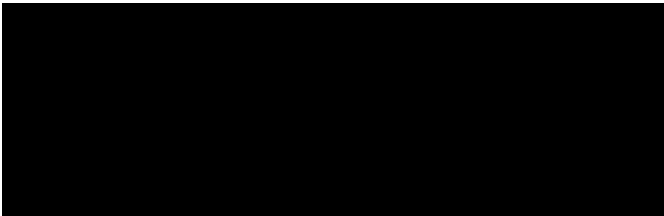
FAIR WORK ACT 2009

Offices/Positions:

A	Brisbane Centre – Alternate Divisional Delegate
B	Melbourne Centre Divisional Delegate
C	Sydney Towers and Terminal Control Units Divisional Delegate

Reasons for election:

Elections for the position marked “A” is required as the previous delegate resigned on 30 January 2025 (see Attachment A).

An election for the position marked “B” is required as the previous delegate resigned on 16 January 2025 (see Attachment B).

Elections for the position marked “C” is required as the previous delegate has submitted his resignation effective 1 May 2025 to take up the position of Vice President Professional from Election E/2024/180 (see Attachment C).

Elected by:

For vacancy “A”, the electorate for the direct voting system is the Brisbane Centre Division which is “All Brisbane based ATCs, who hold en-route and/or approach endorsements for the en-route and/or approach sectors outside the Brisbane TMA”.

For vacancy “B”, the electorate for the direct voting system is the Melbourne Centre Division which is “All Melbourne based ATCs, who hold en-route and/or approach endorsements for en-route and/or approach sectors outside the Melbourne TMA”.

For vacancy “C”, the electorate for the direct voting system is the Sydney Towers and Terminal Control Units Division which is “ATC members based at Sydney TCU, Sydney Tower, Bankstown Tower and Camden Tower.”

Nominations open and close:

As these are casual or extraordinary vacancies, nominations open and close in accordance with a timetable provided by the Returning Officer, delegated by the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC).

Cut off date for roll:

As per Civil Air Rule 35(g), “The roll of voters for any ballot is to be closed on the seventh day before the day on which nominations for the election open”.
