

## **DECISION**

Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 s.189—Arrangement for conduct of an election

**Australian Hotels Association** 

(E2024/199)

Arrangement for conduct of election.

[1] On 14 July 2025 the Australian Hotels Association (**AHA**) lodged with the Fair Work Commission (**Commission**) prescribed information for an election to fill the following offices within the Queensland Branch (**Branch**) of the organisation for a new term of office:

Delegates to AHA National Board (5) (additional to the Branch President as ex officio Delegate)

- [2] The lodgement was late. The Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 (RO Act) requires that prescribed information must be submitted before a specific date, with reference to the organisation's rules. This is known as the 'prescribed day'. Regulation 138(3) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 defines prescribed day as the date two months before nominations are due to open under the organisation's rules. Based on the AHA rules, the prescribed information should have been lodged by 17 January 2025. In correspondence dated 14 July 2025, the National Secretary of the AHA stated that the delay was due to a "change in lodgement processes by the National Branch of the Association at the time of the previous election".
- [3] There appears to be confusion between the organisation and the Branch regarding the responsibility for lodging prescribed information. Branch staff advised Commission staff on 14 July 2025 that the Branch was apparently responsible for lodging the prescribed information. However, when the prescribed information was lodged later that day, it was signed by the National Secretary (albeit submitted to the Commission via email from Branch staff).
- [4] The AHA has stated that the reason for late lodgement was due to changes in its lodgement processes. However, the national organisation (not the Branch) had lodged the prescribed information for the last two scheduled elections for these offices (being E2023/197 and E2022/222). This contrasts with the reason given by the AHA.
- [5] Additionally, the organisation (and this particular Branch) have a history of non-compliance relating late lodgement and non-lodgement of the prescribed information for elections for office, some of which have resulted in Federal Court proceedings and the imposition of civil penalties.<sup>1</sup>

- [6] I am not satisfied that the reason given by the AHA is a sufficient ground to justify the failure to comply with a statutory obligation, particularly given the history of the organisation, and this Branch in particular, in not complying with election-related obligations.
- [7] The normal and reasonable expectation is that registered organisations take steps to ensure they comply with the time-frame requirements set out not only in the RO Act but also in governance-related instruments formulated by the organisations themselves, such as their own rules.
- [8] I decline on this occasion to allow, under section 189(2) of the RO Act, a later day for lodgement. The failure to lodge the prescribed information before the prescribed day may therefore render the organisation liable for a civil penalty pursuant to section 189(2) of the RO Act.
- [9] The refusal of an extension of time under section 189(2) of the RO Act does not, however, affect a determination of an election notification matter for the purposes of section 189(3) of the RO Act, i.e. determining whether an election for these offices is due and arranging for the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) to conduct it.
- [10] I am satisfied that an election for the abovenamed offices is required to be held under the rules of the organisation and, under subsection 189(3) of the RO Act, I am making arrangements for the conduct of the election by the AEC.
