Arrangement for conduct of election.

[1] On 1 September 2025 the Australian Education Union (the **AEU**) lodged with the Fair Work Commission (the **Commission**) prescribed information for an election to fill the following offices for a new term of office:

- [2] I note that federal rule 35(e)(i) of the AEU's rules also provide for a Federal Executive Member from the South Australian Branch (**SA Branch**). The organisation did not include this office in the prescribed information as the SA Branch has held a longstanding exemption under section 186 of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (**RO Act**) in relation to several offices.
- [3] Section 186 of the RO Act provides that the General Manager of the Commission may if satisfied of the criteria set out in that section grant an exemption from the default position, in the Chapter 7 of the RO Act, that the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) conduct elections in registered organisations.

[4] The effect of the section 186 exemption granted to the SA Branch is that the Branch can arrange its own elections (using a non-AEC returning officer) in relation to several offices, including the office of Federal Executive Member from that Branch.¹ In 2016 and 2017, the Commission conducted a review of existing election-related exemptions and found that the SA Branch was complying with the requirements associated with its exemption.² Accordingly, the exemption was not revoked and continues to operate.

[5] I am satisfied that an election for the abovenamed offices is required to be held under the rules of the organisation and, under subsection 189(3) of the RO Act, I am making arrangements for the conduct of the election by the AEC.

PRESCRIBED INFORMATION FOR ELECTIONS in accordance with Section 189 Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 and Regulation 138 Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009

- I, Nicole Calnan being the Deputy Federal Secretary of the Australian Education Union make the following statement:
 - 1. I am authorised to sign this prescribed information in relation to elections which are required to be held for the undermentioned offices in this Union (Annexure A Federal Executive Delegates).
 - 2. I confirm that the following information is being lodged under subsection 189(1) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009.
 - 3. No rule alterations are pending that will impact the election.
 - 4. This statement is lodged at least 2 months before nominations open for the required elections.

5. Voting System and Number of Positions

The elections that are required are set out in the table in Annexure A. The voting system shall be a collegiate electorate system in all cases.

The number of Federal Executive members representing the General Division in each branch is determined by the formula outlined in AEU Federal Rule 35(2). The number of financial members of the General Division in each Branch as at 30 June 2025 are:

6. **Dates and Times**

As determined by the Returning Officer in accordance with the relevant Branch Rules.

Federal Rule 35 specifies the dates and times by which the elections for the above Federal Executive Member positions must be completed.

Provisions of the various Branch Rules specify the times and procedures to be followed in relation to the elections for these positions.

7. **Closure of the Roll of Voters**

Federal Rule 30 (4) states that the roll of voters is to be closed seven days before the day on which nominations open.
