- The following offices and / or positions require elections to be conducted by the Australian Electoral Commission for the reasons given in italics. Pursuant to paragraph 138(1)(d) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations* 2009 (the Regulations) the electorate for each office / position is given under the title of the office or position.
 - 2. Pursuant to subregulation 138(1) of the Regulations, Fair Work Australia is advised that for all of the above offices and / or positions in the Rules of the "Automotive, Food, Metals, Engineering, Printing and Kindred Industries Union" known as the Australian Manufacturing Workers' Union (AMWU) provide that:
 - (a) The returning officer is to determine the opening and closing dates for nominations, provided that nominations shall close no earlier than 7 days and no later than 21 days after the opening of nominations;
 - (b) The roll of voters is to be closed as near as possible to the end of the quarter following the notification of this election to the Returning Officer;
 - (c) A direct voting system is to be used in the conduct of the elections.
