Scope

We have audited the accompanying accounts for the Association of Consulting Architects Australia comprised of the Balance Sheet, Income and Expenditure Statement, and Notes to the Accounts for the year ended 30 June 2002. The Association's Officers are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the accounts and the information contained therein. 1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The significant accounting policies adopted by the Association are presented below to assist in a general understanding of the financial statements.
