In accordance with subsection 189(1) of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 [Schedule 1B Registration and Accountability of Organisations] ("RAO") and prescribed information in respect of RAO Regulation 138, I advise of the need to conduct an election for certain offices of the Australasian Meat Industry Employees Union ("AMIEU").

I provide the following prescribed information:-

(a) The name of each office or position for which an election is required:-

Federal President (ONE) Federal Vice-President (ONE)

(b) The reason for the election is that the term of the offices will expire at the 2006 Federal Council meeting on 4 September 2006.

(c) The offices referred to above arc singular offices.

(d) The electorate for both of the offices is the Federal Council of the AMIEU. A current copy all of all such members of the Federal Council is attached.

(e) There is an ambiguity in the rules of the AMIEU as to the relevant opening and closing of nominations. No opening day of nominations is stipulated at all. Rule 17.8 suggests that nominations may be taken at the Federal Council meeting. Rule 17.9 suggests that nominations must be forwarded in writing no later than two weeks prior to the scheduled meeting.

The AMIEU respectfully proposes the following timetable to avoid any difficulties:-

Opening of nominations: Immediately. Closing of nominations: 18 August 2006.

(f) There is no closing date for the roll of voters. The Federal Council is a static body elected effectively with each quadrennial Branch election. As such, the need for a closing date for a roll of voters is unnecessary.

(g) The kind of voting system to be used in the conduct of the election is a collegiate voting system.

This information is lodged under s.189(1) of the RAO Schedule. I certify that I am authorised to provide this information.
