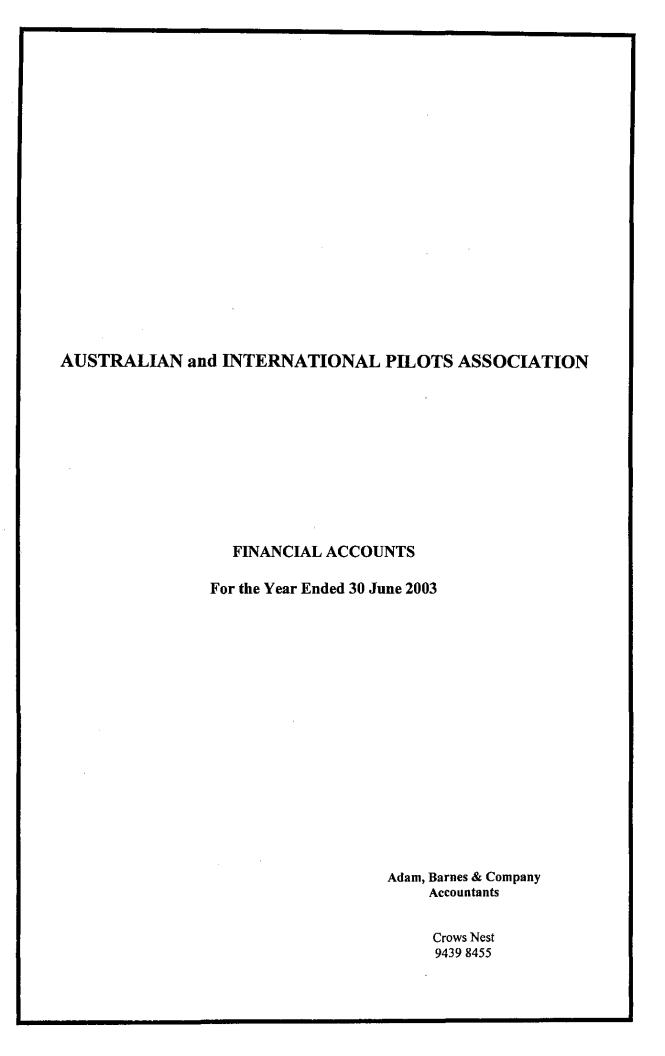

#### Notes to and forming part of the Accounts as at 30 June 2003

#### 1 STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounts of the Association have been drawn up in accordance with the accounting concepts, standards and disclosure requirements of the Australian Accounting bodies, and in accordance with Section 273 of the Work Place Relations Act 1996. They have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values. The accounting policies have been consistently applied.

Set out below is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the Association in the preparation of the accounts.

- (a) No provision for income tax is necessary as Trade Unions are exempt from income tax under the Income Tax Assessment Act.
- (b) Depreciation of fixed assets is calculated on the straight line basis in order to write the assets off over their estimated useful lives.
- (c) Member contributions are accounted for on the accruals basis to the extent that contributions received or receivable subsequent to 30 June 2003, but which relate to the period then ended, have been brought to account as income.

#### 2 INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED TO MEMBERS OR REGISTRAR

In accordance with the requirements of the Work Place Relations Act 1996, the attention of members is drawn to the provision of subsections (1), (2) and (3) of section 274, which states as follows:-

- (1) A member of an organisation, or a Registrar, may apply to the organisation for specified prescribed information in relation to the organisation.
- (2) An organisation shall, on application made under subsection (1) by a member of the organisation or a Registrar, make the specified information available to the member or Registrar in such manner, and within such time, as prescribed.
- (3) A Registrar may only make an application under subsection (1) at the request of a member of the organisation concerned, and the Registrar shall provide to a member information received because of an application made at the request of the member.
