Reminder of actions required when persons elected to office

The Australian Electoral Commission has provided the Commission a declaration of results for the election [E2015/237]. This letter is a reminder of certain obligations imposed on organisations and persons elected to office.

Section 154D(1) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (the RO Act) requires the rules of organisations (and branches of organisations) to require each officer with financial management duties to undertake approved training that covers those duties within 6 months after the person begins to hold office. Please ensure that relevant officers undertake approved training within the required timeframe.

Please also ensure that all new holders of office are advised of their obligations to make disclosures regarding remuneration, non-cash benefits and material personal interests, the details of which should be provided for in your organisation's rules.

Also, section 233(2) of the RO Act requires that an organisation must notify the Fair Work Commission (the Commission) within 35 days of any changes to the holders of office in the organisation. If the election has resulted in any changes to the holders of office, the Australian Education Union-Victorian Branch must notify the Commission of these changes. In particular, please advise:

- 1. Person(s) who have ceased to hold office:
 - the name of the office vacated;
 - the date of the change of office holder; and
 - the name of the person vacating the office.
- 2. Person(s) who have commenced to hold office:
 - the name of the office now held;
 - the date of the change of office holder;
 - the name of the person now holding the office;
 - the postal address of the person (generally the postal address of the organisation); and
 - the occupation of the person now holding the office.

The notification must include a declaration by the Secretary (or other prescribed officer) that the information is a correct statement of the changes made. I have attached a template notification of changes which may assist you. If any change does not apply until a specific date, you don't need to notify until then (e.g. AGM, 1 January, 2nd Monday in March). If you have already lodged this information, please disregard this reminder.

Section 197(1) of Schedule 1 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 requires the AEC to provide a written report on the conduct of the election to the Fair Work Commission and to the organisation or branch for whom the election was conducted. Further, Regulation 141(4) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 requires an organisation or branch to publish a notice on its web site advising members that a copy of the post election report is available upon request. If a website is not available, publishing a notice in a journal or newsletter would be considered appropriate.

I, Gillian Robertson, Branch Secretary of the Australian Education Union Victorian Branch, am authorised to lodge the following prescribed information in relation to elections in the Australian Education Union Victorian Branch. The information is being lodged under subsection 189(1) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009

As the term of office of **ordinary members of Branch Council** from the TAFE and Adult Provision Sector and the Early Childhood Sector expires on 31 December 2015, elections are required to determine the holders of those offices for the years 2016 to 2018, inclusive. The numbers to be elected are specified in ATTACHMENT 1 and ATTACHMENT 2 and have been determined under Rule 8.

The date and times for the opening and closing of nominations are:

The dates and times for the opening and closing of nominations will be determined by the **Returning Officer from the Australian Electoral Commission** having regard to 48(5). I would suggest the Returning Officer consider the following;

Early, TAFE & Adult Provision Sectors;

23 rd November 2015	Nominations Open
4 th December 2015	Nominations close during the various Sectors' Council Meetings to be held on Friday December 4,
4 th December 2015	If a ballot is necessary it can be conducted at the Sector Council Meetings on Friday December 4.

1. Roll of voters shall close:

In accordance with Rule 57 (2A), the roll of voters closes 7 days before the opening of nominations.

2. Voting system: Direct Method 48(5)

Members shall be elected by a secret ballot conducted at a meeting of members elect of the relevant sector council held immediately following the conclusion of the sector council elections for the purpose of conducting the election.
