Officer and related party disclosure statement under 293J (ORP Statement) for 2018 (ORP2018/1439)

I acknowledge receipt by the Registered Organisations Commission (the ROC) on 6 December 2018 of your organisation's ORP Statement which provides information required to be lodged under subsection 293J of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (the RO Act).

Thank you for providing your ORP Statement.

The ROC aims to help organisations comply with all the requirements of section 293J of the RO Act. Accordingly the ROC requested a corrected ORP Statement to be provided to the members and lodged with the ROC. The corrected statement was lodged with the ROC on 24 September 2019 and included the following:

- The officers were re-ranked based on the amount of remuneration they received during the financial year.
- Reimbursements to officers for disbursements of out-of-pocket expenses reasonably incurred by the officer performing their duty do not meet the definition of remuneration. Therefore, they do not need to be disclosed on the ORP statement. Your branch has properly excluded these reimbursements in the amended ORP statement.

No further action is required in relation to this ORP Statement. The ROC understands that the lodgement of ORP Statements is a new requirement, and your prompt consultation and rectification of the issues is appreciated. Non-compliance with the RO Act exposes an organisation or branch to the risk of compliance action, including the prospect of Federal Court proceedings.

The ORP Statement has now been filed and no further action in relation to this ORP Statement is required.
