Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 s.189—Arrangement for conduct of an election

Australian Education Union

Arrangement for conduct of election.

[1] On 6 May 2021 the Australian Education Union - Victorian Branch (the Branch) lodged with the Registered Organisations Commission prescribed information for an election to fill the following offices:

Branch Council

(Number of officers to be determined in accordance with Branch rule 8)

Ordinary Member of Branch Council (Early Childhood Sector Council)

Ordinary Member of Branch Council (TAFE and Adult Provision Sector Council)

Branch Executive

(Number of officers to be determined in accordance with Branch rule 11)

Ordinary Member of Branch Executive (Primary Sector)

Ordinary Member of Branch Executive (Secondary Sector)

Ordinary Member of Branch Executive (Early Childhood Sector)

Ordinary Member of Branch Executive (TAFE and Adult Provision Sector)

[2] In addition to the Branch Council offices named above, the rules of the Branch, in particular rule 8(2)(a), provide that 'all members of the Primary Sector Council and the Secondary Sector Council' are also ordinary members of the Branch Council. The Primary Sector Council and the Secondary Sector Council were the subject of my decision dated 21 June 2021 in matter E2021/94, the Stage 1 (direct voting system) election for senior Branch officers and members of Sector Councils.

- [3] The Branch rules, in particular rules 8 and 11, require that the number of Ordinary members of Branch Council and Ordinary members of the Branch Executive, are to be determined in accordance with a formula in which regard must be had to the financial membership of each Sector as at 30 June immediately before the calling for nominations.
- [4] Nominations for the Stage 2 (collegiate voting system) election that is the subject of the decision in this matter (E2021/118) cannot open until after the completion of the Stage 1 election (E2021/94) as the collegiate election is by and from persons elected in Stage 1. Under the Branch rules, nomination for Stage 1 close in early September, so the opening of nominations for Stage 2 cannot be before that date (and in the event of a ballot will be later than that). It is noted that in preceding elections for these offices, that the election normally occurs around November, with elected officers to take office on 1 January of the year following their election.
- [5] Where the elections of an organisation or branch are conducted by the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC), section 189 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 (the RO Act) requires that organisations and branches lodge prescribed information to arrange for elections. Section 189(2) requires that such information be lodged by the prescribed day, which is defined in Regulation 138(3) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 (the Regulations) as being:

For the purpose of subsection 189(2) of the Act, the prescribed day is the day occurring 2 months before the first day when a person may, under the rules of the organisation or branch, become a candidate in an election

- As the first date on which a person can become a candidate in the Stage 2 election, does not occur until after the first Friday in September the date that the Branch rules require as the closing date for Stage 1 nominations the prescribed day for lodging prescribed information for the Stage 2 election can be no earlier than the beginning of July.²
- [7] The Branch's 6 May 2021 lodgement of prescribed information for the Stage 2 election is certainly earlier than '2 months before the first day when a person may ... become a candidate'. Therefore, the lodgement does not contravene section 189(2) of the RO Act. However, the difficulty with a lodgement prior to 30 June 2021 is that the number of offices to be elected cannot yet be ascertained.
- [8] It is understood that the Branch's 6 May 2021 lodgement for the Stage 2 election (E2021/118) was a matter of expediency, as the Branch lodged the prescribed information for the Stage 1 election (E2021/94) at the same time. Such an approach, of seeking to lodge prescribed information for each stage of an election process at the same time, is usually well regarded by the ROC and a commendable approach.

In this instance, however, because of the Branch's particular rules, it has had the consequence that it has been lodged before the 30 June cut-off date mandated in those rules for determining the numbers of officers. Therefore this election decision, like the decision issued on 21 June 2021 in the related matter E2021/94, has had to be issued without listing the specific number of persons to be elected to each office.

- [9] While the number of officers to be elected (once they are able to be determined) are ultimately included in the call for nominations issued by the AEC, the rules as they currently stand necessitate further work by the AEC and/or the Commission in order for this to be determined.
- [10] As indicated in my decision in the related matter E2021/94, I propose to separately engage with the organisation, as part of the Commission's function of providing advice and assistance to registered organisations, to discuss means by which the above issues may be able to be addressed before the next scheduled election is due.
- [11] I am satisfied that an election for the abovenamed offices is required to be held under the rules of the organisation and, under subsection 189(3) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act* 2009, I am making arrangements for the conduct of the election by the AEC.
