Australian Education Union New South Wales Teachers Federation Branch Financial Report for the year ended 31 December 2014 - [FR2014/437]

I acknowledge receipt of the financial report of the Australian Education Union New South Wales Teachers Union (the reporting unit). The documents were lodged with the Fair Work Commission (FWC) on 6 May 2015 and an amended financial report was lodged on 7 May 2015.

The financial report has now been filed.

The financial report was filed based on a primary review. This involved confirming that the financial reporting timelines required under s.253, s.265, s.266 and s.268 of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (RO Act) have been satisfied, all documents required under s.268 of the RO Act were lodged and that various disclosure requirements under the Australian Accounting Standards, RO Act and reporting guidelines have been complied with. A primary review does not examine all disclosure requirements.

Please note that the financial report for the year ending 31 December 2015 may be subject to an advanced compliance review.

I make the following comments to assist you when you next prepare a financial report. You are not required to take any further action in respect of the report lodged. The FWC will confirm these concerns have been addressed prior to filing next year's report.

Designed Officer's Certificate

As discussed, the Designated Officer's Certificate provided with the amended financial report stated that the Committee of Management meetings of the reporting unit to first pass the resolution in relation to the financial report and then secondly to accept the full financial report both occurred on the 28 April 2015. During our conversation on the 8 May 2015 you indicated that the meeting to pass the resolution occurred on the 31 March 2015 as per the Designated Officer's Certificate provided on the 6 May 2015.

Please ensure that in future years that the correct dates are provided in the signed Designated Officer's Certificate that is lodged with the FWC.

Committee of Management Statement

Presentation of Committee of Management Statement

Item 34 of the reporting guidelines requires the reporting unit to prepare a Committee of Management Statement containing declarations by the Committee of Management in relation to its General Purpose Financial Report. The Committee of Management Statement forms part of the scope of the Auditor's Statement.

Section 254 of the RO Act requires the reporting unit to prepare an Operating Report in relation to the financial year. The Operating Report does <u>not</u> form part of the scope of the Auditor's Statement.

The Committee of Management Statement and the Operating Report are separate reports. I note that the Committee of Management Statement is included in the Operating Report of the reporting unit. Please ensure that in future years that these reports are presented, signed and dated separately.

Wages recovery statement

Item (f) and (g) of the Committee of Management Statement have included the wording from the FWC 'Model Financial Statements'. Item (f) states that the reporting unit did not derive revenue from recovery of wages activity during the reporting period but then item (g) states that the reporting unit <u>did</u> in fact derive revenue from recovery of wages activities. Only one of these events could have occurred during the reporting period.

Please ensure that in future years that only one statement in relation to either deriving or not deriving revenue from recovery of wages activities is included in the Committee of Management Statement.

Committee of Management resolution to provide a concise report

Section 265(2) of the RO Act states that 'a concise report may only be provided if, under the rules of the reporting unit, the committee of management of the reporting unit resolves that a concise report is to be provided'. Although a statement is included in the Designated Officer's Certificate that indicates a resolution to this effect has been passed by the Committee of Management, the Committee of Management Statement does not include this statement.

Please ensure in future years that this resolution is provide in the Committee of Management Statement.

Concise report and the reporting guidelines

Item 2 of the reporting guidelines state that 'these reporting guidelines apply to all general purpose financial reports (GPFR), including a concise financial report...'. In future years, if the Committee of Management resolves to provide members with a concise report, please ensure that all requirements within the reporting guidelines are appropriately disclosed.

Reporting Requirements

On the FWC website a number of factsheets in relation to the financial reporting process and associated timelines are available. The most recent copy of the Reporting Guidelines and a model set of financial statements can also be found. The FWC recommends reporting units use this model as it will assist in ensuring compliance with the RO Act, the s.253 reporting guidelines and the Australian Accounting Standards. 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OPERATING REPORT FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

Review of Principal Activities and Results of Operations

The AEU (NSW Branch) Executive set the following strategic objectives for the year 2013-14:

- Increase Government funding to public schools and TAFE institutes.
- Enhance and support the professional status of AEU (NSW Branch) members in public education.
- Protect and promote quality teaching and learning
- Protect and enhance the industrial rights of AEU (NSW Branch) members.
- Promote human rights and social justice.

The principal activities of the AEU (NSW Branch) during the financial year have focussed on the achievement of these strategic objectives.

In relation to the tirst objective, the AEU (NSW Branch) "I give a Gonski" campaign at the national, state and school community level focussed on getting community and government support for the replacement of the existing inequitable federal schools funding model by a new funding model based on the findings of the Gonski Schools Funding review Panel, i.e. funding all schools to the resource standard necessary for every student to be given the opportunity to succeed regardless of their family background or circumstances. The AEU continues to campaign for the re-election of a federal government which would commit to and honour a better education for all Australian children.

In the face of the increasing privatisation of TAFE, the Stop TAFE Cuts campaign was prosecuted by the AEU (NSW Branch) Campaigning focussed on the NSW State elections. The AEU (NSW Branch) worked closely with the AEU Federal Office and Unions NSW to traximise broader union participation in the stop TAFE cuts campaign.

The reporting unit has worked with members employing authorities to improve the status of the profession in all sectors through advocacy and support for the Professional Standards for Teachers, introduction of professional qualifications for TAFE Teachers as well as further recognition through improved remuneration for teachers and education workers, improved working conditions and representation on various professional bodies such as the Board of Studies and The NSW Institute of Teachers (now named BOSTES).

The AEU (NSW Branch) has, in conjunction with the AEU Federal office and the broader trade union movement made various submissions to Inquiries in relation to the industrial relations legislation.

Significant Changes in State of Affairs

The AEU NSW branch undertook significant work in amending its rules and structures to harmonise with the NSW Teachers Federation to achieve a single entity. On the 24 December 2014 the Fair Work Commission certified a new set of rules which created the New South Wales Teachers Federation Branch of the Australian Education Union

Principal Activity

The principal activity of the entity during the financial year was promotion of union activities within the education sector. No significant change in the nature of these activities occurred during the year.

OPERATING REPORT FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

After Balance Date Events

On the 24 December 2014 the New South Wales Branch of the Australian Education Union lodged with the Fair Work Commission a notice and declaration setting out particulars of alteration to the New South Wales Branch rules. Effective from 1 January 2015, the reporting entity will acquire all assets and liabilities of the New South Wales Teachers Federation Union and operate as the provider of services for members of the New South Wales Teachers Federation Union. The revised reporting entity will operate under the New South Wales Teachers Federation Branch of the Australian Education Union.

Employees/Members

The reporting unit did not have any employees during the year. The number of financial members at 31 December 2014 was 59,457 (2013: 60,225)

Superannuation Trustees

No officer or member of the organisation holds a position as a trustee or director of a superannuation entity or exempt public sector superannuation scheme where the criterion for holding such position is that they are an officer or member of an organisation.

Rights of members to resign

Members may resign from the reporting unit in accordance with rule 17, which reads as follows: "17 - Resignation from membership and termination of eligibility

- (1) Subject to sub-rule 17(1A) a member becomes ineligible for membership of the reporting unit when he/she no longer meets the conditions of eligibility for membership of the reporting unit.
- (1A) The following persons shall after the date referred to in sub-rule 5(12) be eligible to retain membership of the reporting unit notwithstanding the fact that they are no longer eligible for membership within the conditions of eligibility for membership set out in rule 5:
 - (a) members who are eligible for membership pursuant to paragraphs 5(3)(a), (b) or (c) and are:
 - (i) seconded by their employer to non-teaching duries, or
 - (ii) appointed by the Minister for Education to any Board, Committee or statutory authority
 - (b) members who were formerly eligible for membership pursuant to paragraph 5(4)(a), (b) or
 - (c) and have commenced to be employed elsewhere in the Victorian Education Department or in a technical and further education institution or by the Technical and Further Education Board or are seconded by their employer to perform professional duties requiring teacher qualifications;
 - (d) persons who become members of the prior to the date referred to in sub-rule 5(12) pursuant to paragraphs 5(3)(d)or5(4)(d);

Rights of members to resign (continued)

provided that persons who are entitled to retain membership pursuant to this sub-rule should not be entitled to retain membership after the expiration of the secondment or appointment.

- (2) A member who becomes ineligible for membership of the reporting unit shall within seven days thereof give written notice of the fact and the reason therefore to the Secretary of the Branch to which he/she is attached.
- (3) A member may resign from the reporting unit by written notice addressed to and delivered to the Secretary of the Branch to which the member is attached.
- (4) A notice of resignation from membership takes effect:-
 - (a) where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the reporting unit-
 - (i) on the day on which the notice is received at the office of the relevant Branch Secretary; or
 - (a) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member; which is later; or
 - (b) in any other case
 - (i) at the end of 2 weeks after the notice is received at the office of the relevant Branch Secretary; or
 - (ii) on the day specified in the notice; whichever is later.
- (5) Any subscriptions, levies or fines which are due and payable but have not been paid by a former member in relation to a period before the member's resignation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the, in a court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the reporting unit.
- (6) A notice delivered to the relevant Branch Secretary shall be taken to have been received by the reporting unit when it was delivered.
- (7) A notice of resignation that has been received at the office of the relevant Branch Secretary is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered in accordance with sub-rule (1).
- (8) A resignation from membership is valid even if it is not affected in accordance with this section if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the reporting unit that the resignation has been accepted.
- (9) A relevant Branch Secretary may accept a resignation from membership which is not effected in accordance with this Rule.

Rights of members to resign (continued)

- (10) Where the relevant Branch Secretary accepts a resignation in accordance with the previous sub-rule the relevant Branch Secretary shall inform the member in writing that his/her resignation has been accepted.
- (11) On receipt of a written notice from a member that he/she has become ineligible for membership of the reporting unit or a notice of resignation or on acceptance of a resignation which is not effected in accordance with this Rule, the Branch Scerctary shall, as soon as possible notify the Federal Secretary that the member has become ineligible for membership or that the member has resigned."

Committee of Management Resolution

On 31 March 2015 the Committee of Management of New South Wales Teachers Federation Branch of the Australian Education Union passed the following resolution in relation to the general purpose financial report (GPFR) of the Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) for the financial year ended 31 December 2014:

The Committee of Management declares in relation to the GPFR that in its opinion:

- (a) the financial statements and notes comply with the Australian Accounting Standards;
- (b) the financial statements and notes comply with the reporting guidelines of the General Manager;
- (c) the financial statements and notes give a true and fair view of the financial performance, financial position and cash flows of the reporting unit for the financial year to which they relate;
- (d) there are reasonable grounds to believe that the reporting entity will be able to pay its debts as and when they become due and payable;
- (e) during the financial year to which the GPFR relates and since the end of that year:
 - (i) meetings of the committee of management were held in accordance with the rules of the organisation including the rules of a branch concerned; and
 - (ii) the financial affairs of the reporting unit have been managed in accordance with the rules of the organisation including the rules of a branch concerned; and
 - (iii) the financial records of the reporting unit have been kept and maintained in accordance with the RO Act; and
 - (iv) where the organisation consists of two or more reporting units, the financial records of the reporting unit have been kept, as far as practicable, in a manner consistent with each of the other reporting units of the organisation; and

- (v) where information has been sought in any request by a member of the reporting unit or General Manager or a Registrar duly made under section 272 of the RO Act, that information has been provided to the member or General Manager; and
- (vi) where any order for inspection of financial records has been made by the Fair Work Commission under section 273 of the RO Act, there has been compliance.
- (f) Where the reporting unit has not derived revenue from undertaking recovery of wages activity, include the statement 'no revenue has been derived from undertaking recovery of wages activity during the reporting period' or
- (g) where the reporting unit has derived revenue from undertaking recovery of wages activity:
 - (i) the financial report on recovery of wages activity has been fairly and accurately prepared in accordance with the requirements of the reporting guidelines of the General Manager, and
 - (ii) the committee of management instructed the auditor to include in the scope of the audit required under subsection 257(1) of the RO Act all recovery of wages activity by the reporting unit from which revenues had been derived for the financial year in respect of such activity; and
 - (iii) no fees or reimbursements of expenses in relation to recovery of wages activity or donations or other contributions were deducted from monies recovered from employers on behalf of workers other than reported in the financial report on recovery of wages activity and the notes to the financial statements; and
 - (iv) that prior to engaging in any recovery of wages activity, the organisation has disclosed to members by way of a written policy all fees to be charged or reimbursement of expenses required for recovery of wages activity, and any likely request for donations or other contributions in acting for a worker in recovery of wages activity; and
 - (v) no fees or reimbursements of expenses in relation to recovery of wages activity or donations or other contributions were deducted from monies recovered from employees on behalf of workers until distributions of recovered money were made to the workers.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Preparation

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, including Australian Accounting Interpretations and other authorative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board as well as the requirements of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009. A statement of compliance with International Financial Reporting Standards cannot be made due to the entity applying the not for profit section specific requirements contained in AIFRS.

The financial report is prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where stated, the current value of non-monetary assets.

The accounting policies adopted have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(a) Income Tax

No provision for income tax is necessary as the Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) is exempt from tax under Sec 23(f) for the Income Tax Assessment Act.

(b) Revenue

Grant revenue is recognised in the period in which it is received. Grant revenue is received from the New South Wales Teachers Federation (the associated body) and appears in that associated bodies audited financial statements.

Membership fees of the Australian Education Union (AEU) are recognised for the financial year to which they relate. Membership fees of the AEU received in advance are recognised as a liability at balance date.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to those assets.

(c) Financial Risk management objectives and policies

The entity's principal financial instrument comprises receivables, payables and bank loans, cash and short term deposits. The entity manages credit risk in relation to trade receivables by undertaking transactions with organisations with good credit ratings.

The entity does not have any material credit risk exposure to any single debtor or group of debtors under financial instruments entered into by it.

The consolidated entity manages its exposure to key financial risks including interest rate risk, credit risk and liquidity risk. The consolidated entity uses different methods of measure and manages different types of risk to which it is exposed. These include monitoring levels of exposure to interest rate and assessments of market forecasts for interest rate prices.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

(d) Risk Exposure and Responses

Interest rate risk

The entity's exposure to market interest rates is minimal. The level of debt is disclosed in Note 13.

(c) New accounting standards and interpretations

There have been new Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued/ or amended that are applicable to the Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) but not yet effective. They have been considered and it is believed that they have no material impact on the presentanon on the financial report.

(f) Relationship between Australian Education Union and New South Wales Teachers Federation

In 2014 the New South Wales Teachers Federation was an associated body of the Australian Education Union specified in the Australian Education Union rules. The New South Wales Teachers Federation membership fee included membership of the Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch).

Membership fees for members of the Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) were received from the New South Wales Teachers Federation as per the obligation of the New South Wales Teachers Federation as an associated body of the Australian Education Union and enabled by Rule 11 (7) of the Australian Education Union rules.

The Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) notes that New South Wales Teachers Federation made provision for those costs in its annual budget incurred by the Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) in respect of Auditors' fees and bank fees incurred for management of membership fees and audited accounts and did this as part of its obligation to collect and process membership fees for the Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch).

(g) Going concern basis of accounting

The financial report has been prepared on the basis of a going concern as NSW Teachers Federation has agreed to provide financial support as and when required in respect of Auditor's fees and bank fees incurred for management of membership fees and audited accounts.

(h) Critical Accounting estimates and judgments

The committee of management evaluates estimates and judgments incorporated into the financial statements based on historical knowledge and best available current information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, ubtained both externally and within the consolidated entity. The committee has not made any provision for any critical accounting estimates and judgments.

Review of Operations

A review of the operations of the union during the financial year and the results of those operations found that during the year, the entity continued to engage in its principal activity, the results of which are disclosed in the attached financial statements.

Significant Changes in State of Affairs

The AEU NSW branch undertook significant work in amending its rules and structures to harmonise with the NSW Teachers Federation to achieve a single entity. On the 24 December 2014 the Fair Work Commission certified a new set of rules which created the New South Wales Teachers Federation Branch of the Australian Education Union.

Principal Activity

The principal activity of the entity during the financial year was promotion of union activities within the education sector. No significant change in the nature of these activities occurred during the year.

After Balance Date Events

On the 24 December 2014 the New South Wales Branch of the Australian Education Union lodged with the Fair Work Commission a notice and declaration setting out particulars of alteration to the New South Wales Branch rules. Effective from 1 January 2015, the reporting entity will acquire all assets and liabilities of the New South Wales Teachers Federation Union and operate as the provider of services for members of the New South Wales Teachers Federation Union. The revised reporting entity will operate under the New South Wales Teachers Federation Branch of the Australian Education Union.

Employees/Members

The reporting unit did not have any employees during the year. The number of financial members at 31 December 2014 was 59,457 (2013: 60,225)

Superannuation Trustees

No officer or member of the organisation holds a position as a trustee or director of a superannuation entity or exempt public sector superannuation scheme where the criterion for holding such position is that they are an officer or member of an organisation.

Rights of members to resign

Members may resign from the reporting unit in accordance with rule 17, which reads as follows: "17 - Resignation from membership and termination of eligibility

- (1) Subject to sub-rule 17(1A) a member becomes ineligible for membership of the reporting unit when he/she no longer meets the conditions of eligibility for membership of the reporting unit.
- (1A) The following persons shall after the date referred to in sub-rule 5(12) be eligible to retain membership of the reporting unit norwithstanding the fact that they are no longer eligible for membership within the conditions of eligibility for membership set out in rule 5:
 - (a) members who are eligible for membership pursuant to paragraphs 5(3)(a), (b) or (c) and are:
 - (i) seconded by their employer to non-teaching duties, or
 - (ii) appointed by the Minister for Education to any Board, Committee or statutory authority

Rights of members to resign (continued)

- (b) members who were formerly eligible for membership pursuant to paragraph 5(4)(a), (b) or
- (c) and have commenced to be employed elsewhere in the Victorian Education Department or in a technical and further education institution or by the Technical and Further Education Board or are seconded by their employer to perform professional duties requiring teacher qualifications;
- (d) persons who become members of the prior to the date referred to in sub-rule 5(12) pursuant to paragraphs 5(3)(d)or5(4)(d);

provided that persons who are entitled to retain membership pursuant to this sub-rule should not be entitled to retain membership after the expiration of the secondment or appointment.

- (2) A member who becomes incligible for membership of the reporting unit shall within seven days thereof give written notice of the fact and the reason therefore to the Secretary of the Branch to which he/she is attached.
- (3) A member may resign from the reporting unit by written notice addressed to and delivered to the Secretary of the Branch to which the member is attached.
- (4) A notice of resignation from membership takes effect:-
 - (a) where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the reporting unit-
 - (i) on the day on which the notice is received at the office of the televant Branch Secretary; or
 - (ii) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ccases to be eligible to become a member; which is later; or
 - (b) in any other case
 - (i) at the end of 2 weeks after the notice is received at the office of the relevant Branch Secretary; or
 - (ii) on the day specified in the notice; whichever is later.
- (5) Any subscriptions, levies or fines which are due and payable but have not been paid by a former member in relation to a period before the member's resignation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the, in a court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the reporting unit.
- (6) A notice delivered to the relevant Branch Secretary shall be taken to have been received by the reporting unit when it was delivered.
- (7) A notice of resignation that has been received at the office of the relevant Branch Secretary is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered in accordance with sub-rule (1).

- (8) A resignation from membership is valid even if it is not affected in accordance with this section if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the reporting unit that the resignation has been accepted.

- (10) Where the relevant Branch Secretary accepts a resignation in accordance with the previous Where the relevant Branch Secretary accepts a resignation in accordance with the previous sub-rule the relevant Branch Secretary shall inform the member in writing that his/her resignation has been accepted.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Information on Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) Financial Report

The financial statements and disclosures in the concise financial report have been derived from the 31 December 2014 financial report of Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) and cannot be expected to provide as full understanding of the financial performance, financial position and financial and investing activities of the reporting unit as the full report.

The discussion and analysis is provided to assist members in understanding the concise financial report. The discussion and analysis is based on Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) financial statements and the information contained in the concise financial report has been derived from the full 2014 Financial Report of Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch).

Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income

Loss for the year was \$7,593, this compared to a gaio in 2013 year of \$6,045. The loss for the year is due primarily to the Branch receiving a grant from NSW Teachers Federation in advance (2013) for travel costs associated with the 2014 AEU Annual Conference. Membership fee income of the Branch was \$2,720,020 representing a decrease of 22.9% from the prior year (2013: \$3,528,394). The decrease is primarily due to nil collection of fees for the national public education campaign compared to (2013: \$996,552).

Statement of Financial Position

Cash and cash equivalents has decreased by \$13,565 for the year due to timing differences in payments in the course of operations.

Trade and other receivables balance is \$5,065 compared to (2013: \$NIL), represents timing differences for payments received from NSWTF.

Trade and other payables balance is \$3,665 (2013:\$14,287) representing a movement of \$10,622, the movement is attributable to payment of 2014 AEU Annual Conference travel invoice to AEU federal office.

Equity has decreased to \$7,256 (2013: \$14,849) the decrease is attributable to the operating deficit for the period of \$7,593.

Cash Flow Statement

Cash at bank balance of \$5,856 (2013:\$19,421), the movement of \$13,565 is represented by additional payments in the course of operations during the year.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

Note 1: Basis of Preparation of the Concise Financial Report

The financial report of Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) complies with all Accounting Standards, including Australian Accounting Interpretations and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board as well as the requirements of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009. A statement of compliance with International Financial Reporting Standards cannot be made due to the entity applying the not-for profit section specific requirements contained in AIFRS. The presentation currency used in this concise financial report is Australian dollars.

Note 2: Relationship between Australian Education Union and New South Wales Teachers Federation

In 2014 the New South Wales Teachers Federation was an associated body of the Australian Education Union specified in the Australian Education Union rules. The New South Wales Teachers Federation membership fee included membership of the Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch).

Membership fees for members of the Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) were received from the New South Wales Teachers Federation as per the obligation of the New South Wales Teachers Federation as an associated body of the Australian Education Union and enabled by Rule 11 (7) of the Australian Education Union rules.

The Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) notes that New South Wales Teachers Federation made provision for those costs in its annual budget incurred by the Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) in respect of Auditors' fees and bank fees incurred for management of membership fees and audited accounts and did this as part of its obligation to collect and process membership fees for the Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch).

Review of Principal Activities and Results of Operations

The AEU (NSW Branch) Executive set the following strategic objectives for the year 2013-14:

- Increase Government funding to public schools and TAFE institutes.
- Enhance and support the professional status of AEU (NSW Branch) members in public education.
- Protect and promote quality teaching and learning.
- Protect and enhance the industrial rights of AEU (NSW Branch) members.
- Promote human rights and social justice.

The principal activities of the AEU (NSW Branch) during the financial year have focussed on the achievement of these strategic objectives.

In relation to the first objective, the AEU (NSW Branch) "I give a Gonski" campaign at the national, state and school community level focussed on getting community and government support for the replacement of the existing inequitable federal schools funding model by a new funding model based on the findings of the Gonski Schools Funding review Panel, i.e. funding all schools to the resource standard necessary for every student to be given the opportunity to succeed regardless of their family background or circumstances. The AEU continues to campaign for the re-election of a federal government which would commit to and honour a better education for all Australian children.

In the face of the increasing privatisation of TAFE, the Stop TAFE Cuts campaign was prosecuted by the AEU (NSW Branch) Campaigning focussed on the NSW State elections. The AEU (NSW Branch) worked closely with the AEU Federal Office and Unions NSW to maximise broader union participation in the stop TAFE cuts campaign.

The reporting unit has worked with members employing authorities to improve the status of the profession in all sectors through advocacy and support for the Professional Standards for Teachers, introduction of professional qualifications for TAFE Teachers as well as further recognition through improved remuneration for teachers and education workers, improved working conditions and representation on various professional bodies such as the Board of Studies and The NSW Insutute of Teachers (now named BOSTES).

The AEU (NSW Branch) has, in conjunction with the AEU Federal office and the broader trade union movement made various submissions to Inquiries in relation to the industrial relations legislation.

Significant Changes in State of Affairs

The AEU NSW branch undertook significant work in amending its rules and structures to harmonise with the NSW Teachers Federation to achieve a single entity. On the 24 December 2014 the Fair Work Commission certified a new set of rules which created the New South Wales Teachers Federation Branch of the Australian Education Union.

Principal Activity

The principal activity of the entity during the financial year was promotion of union activities within the education sector. No significant change in the nature of these activities occurred during the year.

OPERATING REPORT FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

After Balance Date Events

On the 24 December 2014 the New South Wales Branch of the Australian Education Union lodged with the Fair Work Commission a notice and declaration setting out particulars of alteration to the New South Wales Branch rules. Effective from 1 January 2015, the reporting entity will acquire all assets and liabilities of the New South Wales Teachers Federation Union and operate as the provider of services for members of the New South Wales Teachers Federation Union. The revised reporting entity will operate under the New South Wales Teachers Federation Branch of the Australian Education Union.

Employees/Members

The reporting unit did not have any employees during the year. The number of financial members at 31 December 2014 was 59,457 (2013: 60,225)

Superannuation Trustees

No officer or member of the organisation holds a position as a trustee or director of a superannuation entity or exempt public sector superannuation scheme where the criterion for holding such position is that they are an officer or member of an organisation.

Rights of members to resign

Members may resign from the reporting unit in accordance with rule 17, which reads as follows: "17 – Resignation from membership and termination of eligibility

- (1) Subject to sub-rule 17(1A) a member becomes ineligible for membership of the reporting unit when he/she no longer meets the conditions of eligibility for membership of the reporting unit.
- (1A) The following persons shall after the date referred to in sub-rule 5(12) be eligible to retain membership of the reporting unit notwithstanding the fact that they are no longer eligible for membership within the conditions of eligibility for membership set out in rule 5:
 - (a) members who are eligible for membership pursuant to paragraphs 5(3)(a), (b) or (c) and are:
 - (i) seconded by their employer to non-teaching duties, or
 - (ii) appointed by the Minister for Education to any Board, Committee or statutory authority
 - (b) members who were formerly eligible for membership pursuant to paragraph 5(4)(a), (b) or
 - (c) and have commenced to be employed elsewhere in the Victorian Education Department or in a technical and further education institution or by the Technical and Further Education Board or are seconded by their employer to perform professional duties requiring teacher qualifications;
 - (d) persons who become members of the prior to the date referred to in sub-rule 5(12) pursuant to paragraphs 5(3)(d)or5(4)(d);

Rights of members to resign (continued)

provided that persons who are entitled to retain membership pursuant to this sub-rule should not be entitled to retain membership after the expiration of the secondment or appointment.

- (2) A member who becomes ineligible for membership of the reporting unit shall within seven days thereof give written notice of the fact and the reason therefore to the Secretary of the Branch to which he/she is attached.
- (3) A member may resign from the reporting unit by written notice addressed to and delivered to the Secretary of the Branch to which the member is attached.
- (4) A notice of resignation from membership takes effect:-
 - (a) where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the reporting unit-
 - (i) on the day on which the notice is received at the office of the relevant Branch Secretary; or
 - (ii) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member; which is later; or
 - (b) in any other case -
 - (i) at the end of 2 weeks after the notice is received at the office of the relevant Branch Secretary; or
 - (ii) on the day specified in the notice; whichever is later.
- (5) Any subscriptions, levies or fines which are due and payable but have not been paid by a former member in relation to a period before the member's resignation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the, in a court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the reporting unit.
- (6) A notice delivered to the relevant Branch Secretary shall be taken to have been received by the reporting unit when it was delivered.
- (7) A notice of resignation that has been received at the office of the relevant Branch Secretary is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered in accordance with sub-rule (1).
- (8) A resignation from membership is valid even if it is not affected in accordance with this section if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the reporting unit that the resignation has been accepted.
- (9) A relevant Branch Secretary may accept a resignation from membership which is not effected in accordance with this Rule.

- (10) Where the relevant Branch Secretary accepts a resignation in accordance with the previous sub-rule the relevant Branch Secretary shall inform the member in writing that his/her resignation has been accepted.
- (11) On receipt of a written notice from a member that he/she has become ineligible for membership of the reporting unit or a notice of resignation or on acceptance of a resignation which is not effected in accordance with this Rule, the Branch Secretary shall, as soon as possible notify the Federal Secretary that the member has become ineligible for membership or that the member has resigned."

Committee of Management Resolution

On 31 March 2015 the Committee of Management of New South Wales Teachers Federation Branch of the Australian Education Union passed the following resolution in relation to the general purpose financial report (GPFR) of the Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) for the financial year ended 31 December 2014:

- (vi) where any order for inspection of financial records has been made by the Fair Work Commission under section 273 of the RO Act, there has been compliance.
- (f) Where the reporting unit has not derived revenue from undertaking recovery of wages activity, include the statement 'no revenue has been derived from undertaking recovery of wages activity during the reporting period' or
- (g) where the reporting unit has derived revenue from undertaking recovery of wages activity:
 - (i) the financial report on recovery of wages activity has been fairly and accurately prepared in accordance with the requirements of the reporting guidelines of the General Manager; and
 - (ii) the committee of management instructed the auditor to include in the scope of the audit required under subsection 257(1) of the RO Act all recovery of wages activity by the reporting unit from which revenues had been derived for the financial year in respect of such activity; and

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Preparation

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, including Australian Accounting Interpretations and other authorative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board as well as the requirements of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009. A statement of compliance with International Financial Reporting Standards cannot be made due to the entity applying the not-for profit section specific requirements contained in AIFRS.

The financial report is prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where stated, the current value of non-monetary assets.

The accounting policies adopted have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(a) Income Tax

No provision for income tax is necessary as the Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) is exempt from tax under Sec 23(f) for the Income Tax Assessment Act.

(b) Revenue

Grant revenue is recognised in the period in which it is received. Grant revenue is received from the New South Wales Teachers Federation (the associated body) and appears in that associated bodies audited financial statements.

Membership fees of the Australian Education Union (AEU) are recognised for the financial year to which they relate. Membership fees of the AEU received in advance are recognised as a liability at balance date.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to those assets.

(c) Financial Risk management objectives and policies

The entity's principal financial instrument comprises receivables, payables and bank loans, cash and short term deposits. The entity manages credit risk in relation to trade receivables by undertaking transactions with organisations with good credit ratings.

The entity does not have any material credit risk exposure to any single debtor or group of debtors under financial instruments entered into by it.

The consolidated entity manages its exposure to key financial risks including interest rate risk, credit risk and liquidity risk. The consolidated entity uses different methods of measure and manages different types of risk to which it is exposed. These include monitoring levels of exposure to interest rate and assessments of market forecasts for interest rate prices.

OPERATING REPORT FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

Review of Operations

A review of the operations of the union during the financial year and the results of those operations found that during the year, the entity continued to engage in its principal activity, the results of which are disclosed in the attached Bnancial statements.

Significant Changes in State of Affairs

The AEU NSW branch undertook significant work in amending its rules and structures to harmonise with the NSW Teachers Federation to achieve a single entity. On the 24 December 2014 the Fair Work Commission certified a new set of rules which created the New South Wales Teachers Federation Branch of the Australian Education Union.

Principal Activity

The principal activity of the entity during the financial year was promotion of union activities within the education sector. No significant change in the nature of these activities occutred during the year.

After Balance Date Events

On the 24 December 2014 the New South Wales Branch of the Australian Education Union lodged with the Fair Work Commission a notice and declaration setting out particulars of alteration to the New South Wales Branch rules. Effective from 1 January 2015, the reporting entity will acquire all assets and liabilities of the New South Wales Teachers Federation Union and operate as the provider of services for members of the New South Wales Teachers Federation Union. The revised reporting entity will operate under the New South Wales Teachers Federation Branch of the Australian Education Union.

Employees/Members

The reporting unit did not have any employees during the year. The number of financial members at 31 December 2014 was 59,457 (2013: 60,225)

Superannuation Trustees

No officer or member of the organisation holds a position as a trustee or director of a superannuation entity or exempt public sector superannuation scheme where the criterion for holding such position is that they are an officer or member of an organisation.

Rights of members to resign

Members may resign from the reporting unit in accordance with rule 17, which teads as follows: "17 – Resignation from membership and termination of eligibility

- (1) Subject to sub-rule 17(1A) a member becomes ineligible for membership of the reporting unit when he/she no longer meets the conditions of eligibility for membership of the reporting unit.
- (1A) The following persons shall after the date referred to in sub-rule 5(12) be eligible to retain membership of the reporting unit notwithstanding the fact that they are no longer eligible for membership within the conditions of eligibility for membership set out in rule 5:
 - (a) members who are eligible for membership pursuant to paragraphs 5(3)(a), (b) or (c) and are:
 - (i) seconded by their employer to non-teaching duties, or
 - (ii) appointed by the Minister for Education to any Board, Committee or statutory authority

Rights of members to resign (continued)

- (b) members who were formerly eligible for membership pursuant to paragraph 5(4)(a), (b) or
- (c) and have commenced to be employed elsewhere in the Victorian Education Department or in a technical and further education institution or by the Technical and Further Education Board or are seconded by their employer to perform professional duties requiring teacher qualifications;
- (d) persons who become members of the prior to the date referred to in sub-rule 5(12) pursuant to paragraphs 5(3)(d)or5(4)(d);

provided that persons who are entitled to retain membership pursuant to this sub-rule should not be entitled to retain membership after the expiration of the secondment or appointment.

- (2) A member who becomes ineligible for membership of the reporting unit shall within seven days thereof give written notice of the fact and the reason therefore to the Secretary of the Branch to which he/she is attached.
- (3) A member may resign from the reporting unit by written nonce addressed to and delivered to the Secretary of the Branch to which the member is attached.
- (4) A notice of resignation from membership takes effect:-
 - (a) where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the reporting unit-
 - (i) on the day on which the notice is received at the office of the relevant Branch Secretary; or
 - (ii) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member; which is later; or
 - (b) in any other case
 - (i) at the end of 2 weeks after the notice is received at the office of the relevant Branch Secretary; or
 - (ii) on the day specified in the notice; whichever is later.
- (5) Any subscriptions, levies or fines which are due and payable but have not been paid by a former member in relation to a period before the member's resignation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the, in a court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the reporting unit.
- (6) A notice delivered to the relevant Branch Secretary shall be taken to have been received by the reporting unit when it was delivered.
- (7) A notice of resignation that has been received at the office of the relevant Branch Secretary is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered in accordance with sub-rule (1).

Rights of members to resign (continued)

- (8) A resignation from membership is valid even if it is not affected in accordance with this section if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the reporting unit that the resignation has been accepted.
- (9) A relevant Branch Secretary may accept a resignation from membership which is not effected in accordance with this Rule.
- (10) Where the relevant Branch Secretary accepts a resignation in accordance with the previous Where the relevant Branch Secretary accepts a resignation in accordance with the previous sub-rule the relevant Branch Secretary shall inform the member in writing that his/her resignation has been accepted.
- (11) On receipt of a written notice from a member that he/she has become ineligible for membership of the reporting unit or a notice of resignation or on acceptance of a resignation which is not effected in accordance with this Rule, the Branch Secretary shall, as soon as possible notify the Federal Secretary that the member has become ineligible for membership or that the member has resigned."

Committee of Management Resolution

On 31 March 2015 the Committee of Management of Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) passed the following resolution in relation to the general purpose financial report (GPFR) of the Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) for the financial year ended 31 December 2014:

The Committee of Management declares in relation to the GPFR that in its opinion:

- (a) the financial statements and notes comply with the Australian Accounting Standards;
- (b) the financial statements and notes comply with the reporting guidelines of the General Manager;
- (c) the financial statements and notes give a true and fair view of the financial performance, financial position and cash flows of the reporting unit for the financial year to which they relate;
- (d) there are reasonable grounds to believe that the reporting entity will be able to pay its debts as and when they become due and payable;
- (e) during the financial year to which the GPFR relates and since the end of that year:
 - (i) meetings of the committee of management were held in accordance with the rules of the organisation including the rules of a branch concerned; and
 - (ii) the financial affairs of the reporting unit have been managed in accordance with the rules of the organisation including the rules of a branch concerned; and
 - (iii) the financial records of the reporting unit have been kept and maintained in accordance with the RO Act; and
 - (iv) where the organisation consists of two or more reporting units, the financial records of the reporting unit have been kept, as far as practicable, in a manner consistent with each of the other reporting units of the organisation; and

- (v) where information has been sought in any request by a member of the reporting unit or General Manager or a Registrar duly made under section 272 of the RO Act, that information has been provided to the member or General Manager; and
- (vi) where any order for inspection of financial records has been made by the Fair Work Commission under section 273 of the RO Act, there has been compliance.
- (f) Where the reporting unit has not derived revenue from undertaking recovery of wages activity, include the statement 'no revenue has been derived from undertaking recovery of wages activity during the reporting period' or
- (g) where the reporting unit has derived revenue from undertaking recovery of wages activity:
 - (i) the financial report on recovery of wages activity has been fairly and accurately prepared in accordance with the requirements of the reporting guidelines of the General Manager; and
 - (ii) the committee of management instructed the auditor to include in the scope of the audit required under subsection 257(1) of the RO Act all recovery of wages activity by the reporting unit from which revenues had been derived for the financial year in respect of such activity; and
 - (iii) no fees or reimbursements of expenses in relation to recovery of wages activity or donations or other contributions were deducted from monies recovered from employers on behalf of workers other than reported in the financial report on recovery of wages activity and the notes to the financial statements; and
 - (iv) that prior to engaging in any recovery of wages activity, the organisation has disclosed to members by way of a written policy all fees to be charged or reimbursement of expenses required for recovery of wages activity, and any likely request for donations or other contributions in acting for a worker in recovery of wages activity; and
 - (v) no fees or reimbursements of expenses in relation to recovery of wages activity or donations or other contributions were deducted from monics recovered from employers on behalf of workers until distributions of recovered money were made to the workers.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Information on Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) Financial Report

The financial statements and disclosures in the concise financial report have been derived from the 31 December 2014 financial report of Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) and cannot be expected to provide as full understanding of the financial performance, financial position and financial and investing activities of the reporting unit as the full report.

The discussion and analysis is provided to assist members in understanding the concise financial report. The discussion and analysis is based on Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) financial statements and the information contained in the concise financial report has been derived from the full 2014 Financial Report of Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch).

Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income

Loss for the year was \$7,593, this compared to a gain in 2013 year of \$6,045. The loss for the year is due primarily to the Branch receiving a grant from NSW Teachers Federation in advance (2013) for travel costs associated with the 2014 AEU Annual Conference. Membership fee income of the Branch was \$2,720,020 teptesenting a decrease of 22.9% from the prior year (2013: \$3,528,394). The decrease is primarily due to nil collection of fees for the national public education campaign compared to (2013: \$996,552).

Statement of Financial Position

Cash and cash equivalents has decreased by \$13,565 for the year due to timing differences in payments in the course of operations.

Trade and other receivables balance is \$5,065 compared to (2013: \$NIL), represents timing differences for payments received from NSWTF.

Trade and other payables balance is \$3,665 (2013:\$14,287) representing a movement of \$10,622, the movement is attributable to payment of 2014 AEU Annual Conference travel invoice to AEU federal office.

Equity has decreased to \$7,256 (2013: \$14,849) the decrease is attributable to the operating deficit for the period of \$7,593.

Cash Flow Statement

Cash at bank balance of \$5,856 (2013:\$19,421), the movement of \$13,565 is represented by additional payments in the course of operations during the year.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

Note 1: Basis of Preparation of the Concise Financial Report

The concise financial report is an extract for the full financial report for the year ended 31 December 2014. The concise financial report has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standard AASB 1039: Coocise Financial Reports.

The financial report of Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) complies with all Accounting Standards, including Australian Accounting Interpretations and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board as well as the requirements of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009. A statement of compliance with International Financial Reporting Standards cannot be made due to the entity applying the not-for profit section specific requirements contained in AIFRS. The presentation currency used in this concise financial report is Australian dollars.

Note 2: Relationship between Australian Education Union and New South Wales Teachers Federation

In 2014 the New South Wales Teachers Federation was an associated body of the Australian Education Union specified in the Australian Education Union rules. The New South Wales Teachers Federation incombership fee included membership of the Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch).

Membership fees for members of the Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) were received from the New South Wales Teachers Federation as per the obligation of the New South Wales Teachers Federation as an associated body of the Australian Education Union and enabled by Rule 11 (7) of the Australian Education Union rules.

The Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) notes that New South Wales Teachers Federation made provision for those costs in its annual budget incurred by the Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch) in respect of Auditors' fees and bank fees incurred for management of membership fees and audited accounts and did this as part of its obligation to collect and process membership fees for the Australian Education Union (New South Wales Branch).
