I make the following comments to assist you when you next prepare a financial report. You are not required to take any further action in respect of the report lodged.

Operating Report

Membership of Committee of Management

The operating report contained a list of office holders as at the end of the financial year. Please note the operating report is required to contain the name of each person who has been a member of the committee of management of the reporting unit at any time during the reporting period, and the period for which he or she held such a position – refer to regulation 159(c) *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009.*

Trustee of superannuation entity

Subsection 254(2)(d) of the Act requires details of any officer or member of the reporting unit who is a trustee, or a director of a company that is a trustee, of a superannuation entity or an exempt public sector superannuation scheme to be provided in the operating report 'where a criterion for the officer or member being the trustee or director is that the officer or member is an officer or member of a registered organisation'.

If no officers or members of the reporting unit is a trustee of a superannuation entity, the preferred wording to satisfy s.254(2)(d) is:

'No officer or member of the reporting unit holds a position as a trustee or director of a superannuation entity or exempt public sector superannuation scheme where the criterion for holding such position is that they are an officer or member of an organisation.'

Right of members to resign

Subsection 254(2)(c) of the Act requires the operating report to 'give details' of the right of members to resign from the reporting unit under section 174 of the Act. This requirement may be met by the inclusion of a statement that a member has the right to resign and a reference to the relevant rule, which makes such provision. Alternatively, the complete text of the relevant resignation rule may be reproduced in the report. It would appear in this case that rule 17 of the Organisation's Rules is applicable.

Old legislative references

The following documents in the financial report contains old legislative and other references:

Reference to 'Industrial Registrar', the 'RAO Schedule' and 'RAO Regulations' where appearing in the Committee of Management statement should properly refer to the 'General Manager, Fair Work Australia', 'Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009' and 'Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009' respectively.

Reference to 'Schedule 1 (RAO Schedule) of the Workplace Relations Act 1996' and 'Workplace Relations Act 1996' where appearing in the Audit Report should properly refer to the 'Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009'.

Reference to 'Workplace Relations Act 1996 (RAO Schedule)' appearing in note 1 of the notes to the financial statements should properly refer to the 'Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009'.

Could the Branch ensure that future reports contain the correct references.

Documents not lodged with FWA within 14 days of meeting

The documents were presented to a General Meeting of Members on 30 April 2011 but were not lodged with Fair Work Australia until 7 November 2011.

In future financial years the documents should be lodged with FWA within 14 days of the meeting at which they were presented - see s.268 of the Act.

I know that you have previously indicated that we should hold two meetings to resolve this issue. I find this very difficult to explain and to organise. The Committee of management has a very full and urgent agenda.

Given that we are not trying to alter in a substantial way any of the financial records or the reporting to members that has occurred I would hope that my proposal is acceptable.

If this is acceptable I would like to make sure that the new Auditor Statement is acceptable. Could you advise me as to how the Auditor needs to change the 2010 Statement for instance?

Scope

The financial report and the Branch's responsibility

The financial report is a general purpose report comprising the Committee's Report, Statement by Members of the Management Committee, Statement of Financial Performance, Statement of Financial Position, Statement of Cash Flows and accompanying Notes to the Financial Statements for the Australian Education Union NT Branch ("the Branch") for the year ended 31 December 2010.

The Branch is responsible for preparing a financial report that presents fairly the financial position and performance of the Branch, and that complies with Accounting Standards and other mandatory financial reporting requirement in Australia and relevant provisions of Part 3 of Chapter 8 of Schedule 1 (RAO Schedule) of the Workplace Relations Act 1996. Notes to the Financial Statements For the year ended 31 December 2010

Note 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 (RAO Schedule).

The financial report covers Australian Education Union N.T. Branch as an individual entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the economic entity in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

income tax

The association believes it is exempt from Income Tax.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

a) Property

Freehold land and buildings are measured on the fair value basis, being the amount for which an asset could be exchanged between knowledgeable willing parties in an arm's length transaction.

b) Plant and equipment

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to present values in determining the recoverable amounts.

c) Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised leased assets, but excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight line basis over their useful lives to Australian Education Union N.T. Branch commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Properties held for investment purposes are not subject to a depreciation charge. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are:

Motor vehicles	15-20

Leases

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not legal ownership, are transferred to Australian Education Union N.T. Branch are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual value.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives where it is likely that ownership of the asset will be obtained or over the term of the lease. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

Lease incentives under operating leases are recognised as a liability. Lease payments received reduce the liability.

Employee entitlements

Provision is made for the liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee entitlements expected to be settled within one year together with entitlements arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and sick leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at their nominal amount. Other employee entitlements payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash out flows to be made for those entitlements.

Contributions are made by Australian Education Union N.T. Branch to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

Cash

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand and in all call deposits with banks or financial institutions, investments in money market instruments maturing within less than two months, net of bank overdrafts.

Information to be Provided to Members or Registrar

- 1. A member of a reporting unit, or a Registrar, may apply to the reporting unit for specified prescribed information in relation to the reporting unit to be made available to the person making the application.
- 2. The application must be in writing and must specify the period within which, and the manner in which, the information is to be made available. The period must not be less than 14 days after the application is given to the reporting unit.
- 3. A reporting unit must comply with an application made under sub-section 1.

I appreciate your patience on this matter.

As a newly elected official it has been difficult to follow up on this matter until now.

I have spoken to the Secretary of the SA branch and believe that the process you are requesting this branch to follow may not be consistent with that followed in other states.

I find it difficult to understand the necessity for the management committee to consider the financial reports the number of times you suggest. I do not believe the SA audited statements went through its management committee in this fashion.

However I am arranging to consult directly with our auditor to discuss what has been requested. I believe it is somewhat problematic that the current management committee is being asked to validate 2008 and

2009 statements that it had nothing to do with. I also believe requesting us to redistribute the 2008 and 2009 financial reports, over which there has been no suggestion of any impropriety, is going to cause confusion and unwarranted suspicion by the rank and file members.

Unfortunately for some reason I am unable to access the documents submitted by other AEU branches at the time of writing and can therefore not be specific about processes. I will have our system checked tomorrow so that i can follow up further.

I will phone you soon to go over our view after consulting with our auditor.

Summary of actions for 2008 and 2009 reports
