INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT To the members of Australian Education Union (Queensland Branch)

Scope

The Financial Report And The Committee of Management's Responsibility

The financial report comprises the balance sheet, income statement, statement of changes in accumulated funds and statement of cash flows and accompanying notes to the financial statements for Australian Education Union (Queensland Branch) ("the Branch") for the year ended 31 December 2005.

The members of the committee of management are responsible for preparing a financial report that gives a true and fair view of the financial position and performance of the Branch, and that complies with Accounting Standards in Australia, in accordance with Section 253 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996. This includes responsibility for the maintenance of adequate accounting records and internal controls that are designed to prevent and detect fraud and error, and for the accounting policies and accounting estimates inherent in the financial report.

Audit Approach

We conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the members of the Branch. Our audit was conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards in order to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. The nature of an audit is influenced by factors such as the use of professional judgement, selective testing, the inherent limitations of internal control, and the availability of persuasive rather than conclusive evidence. Therefore, an audit cannot guarantee that all material misstatements have been detected.

We performed procedures to assess whether in all material respects the financial report presents fairly, in accordance with Accounting Standards and other mandatory financial reporting requirements in Australia and the Workplace Relations Act 1996, a view which is consistent with our understanding of the Branch's financial position, and of its performance as represented by the results of its operations, changes in accumulated funds and cash flows.

We formed our audit opinion on the basis of these procedures, which included:

- examining, on a test basis, information to provide evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial report, and
- assessing the appropriateness of the accounting policies and disclosures used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by the committee of management.

While we considered the effectiveness of management's internal controls over financial reporting when determining the nature and extent of our procedures, our audit was not designed to provide assurance on internal controls.

We performed procedures to assess whether the substance of business transactions was accurately reflected in the financial report. These and our other procedures did not include consideration or judgment of the appropriateness or reasonableness of the business plans or strategies adopted by the committee of management and management of the Branch.

Independence

We are independent of the Australian Education Union (Queensland Branch), and have met the independence requirements of Australian professional ethical pronouncements.

Audit Opinion

In our opinion:

- (a) the financial report of the Australian Education Union (Queensland Branch) has been properly drawn up, in accordance with Accounting Standards and other mandatory financial reporting requirements in Australia and Section 253 and Schedule 1B of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, so as to provide a true and fair view of the Branch's financial position as at 31 December 2005 and of its performance as represented by the results of its operations, changes in accumulated funds and its cash flows for the year then ended;
- (b) the Australian Education Union (Queensland Branch) kept satisfactory accounting records for the financial year, including records of:
 - (i) the sources and nature of the income of the Branch (including income from members); and
 - (ii) the nature and purposes of expenditure of the Branch;
- (c) we have received all the information and explanations required from the Branch's officers and employees for the purposes of our audit.
