Operating Report

Right of members to resign

Subsection 254(2)(c) of the *RAO Schedule* of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* requires the operating report to "give details" of the right of members to resign from the reporting unit under section 174 of the RAO Schedule. This requirement may be met by the inclusion of a statement that a member has the right to resign and a reference to the relevant rule, which makes such provision. Alternatively, the complete text of the relevant resignation rule may be reproduced in the report. It would appear in this case that rules 17(3)-(8) of the organisation's Rules are applicable.

Committee of Management Statement

Recovery of wages activity

I remind you that the applicable Reporting Guidelines require the Committee of Management Statement to include information in relation to recovery of wages activity. If there has been no recovery of wages activity you may wish to consider words such as:

(xz) in relation to the recovery of wages activity:

(i) there has been no such activity undertaken by the reporting unit.

Audit Report - signature and qualifications

In future years please ensure that the audit report:

- provides the personal name and signature of the individual auditor (not just the name and signature of the audit firm)¹, and
- provides the professional qualifications of the individual auditor to confirm that the individual auditor is an approved auditor as defined in Regulation 4 of the RAO Regulations².

- (1) For the definition of **approved auditor** in section 6 of the RAO Schedule, an approved auditor means:
 - (a) a person who:

(i) is a member of CPA Australia, The Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia or the National Institute of Accountants; and

(ii) holds a current Public Practice Certificate; or

...

(2) However, a person whose registration as an auditor has been suspended under the Corporations Act 2001 is not an approved auditor while the suspension is in force.

¹ Section 257(8) of the RAO Schedule states that the form and content of the auditor's report must be in accordance with the Australian Auditing Standards. Paragraph 53 of Australian Auditing Standard ASA 700 provides that "The auditor's report shall be signed in one or more of the name of the audit firm, the name of the audit company or the personal name of the auditor, as appropriate." Section 257(5) of the RAO Schedule provides that "An auditor must, in his or her report, state whether in the auditor's opinion the general purpose financial report is presented fairly…" This wording would suggest that it is 'appropriate' under ASA 700.53 for the audit report to be signed in "the personal name of the auditor" not just the name of the audit firm. This approach is analogous to the signature protocol under paragraph 20 of Appendix 2 of ASA 700 that pertains to s324AB of the Corporations Act 2001 which requires an auditor to sign the report: 'in the firm name; and in his or her own name".

² Regulation 4 of the *Workplace Relations (Registration and Accountability of Organisations) Regulations 2003* defines 'approved auditor' as follows:

NOTE 1 - ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of Preparation of Accounts

All officers and staff are employed by the Queensland Teachers' Union of Employees.

(d) Statement of compliance

The financial report complies with Australian Accounting Standards, which include Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standard ('AIFRS'). Compliance with AIFRS ensures that the financial report, comprising the financial statements and notes thereto, complies with International Financial Reporting Standards ('IFRS').

NOTE 2 - INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED TO MEMBERS OR REGISTRAR

In accordance with the requirements of Schedule 1 (RAO Schedule) of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of sub-sections (1), (2) and (3) of section 272 which reads as follows:

- (1) A member of a reporting unit, or a Registrar, may apply to the reporting unit for specified prescribed information in relation to the reporting unit to be made available to the person making the application.
- (2) The application must be in writing and must specify the period within which, and the manner in which, the information is to be made available. The period must not be less than 14 days after the application is given to the reporting unit.
- (3) A reporting unit must comply with an application made under subsection (1).
