There were 0 employees for the year (2008 - 0 employees).



Independent auditor's report to the members of the Australian Education Union (Queensland Branch)

Report on the Financial Report

We have audited the accompanying financial report of Australian Education Union (Queensland Branch) ("the Branch"), which comprises the statement of financial position as at 31 December 2009, and the statement of comprehensive income, statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year ended on that date, a summary of significant accounting policies, other explanatory notes and the Committee of Management's declaration.

Committee of Management's Responsibility for the Financial Report

The members of the Committee of Management of the Branch are responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards (including the Australian Accounting Interpretations) and with Part 3 of Chapter 8 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009. This responsibility includes establishing and maintaining internal controls relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error; selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies; and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances. In Note 1 (d), the Committee of Management also state that the financial report, comprising the financial statements and notes, complies with International Financial Reporting Standards as issued by the International Accounting Standards Board.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. These Auditing Standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on our judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, we consider internal controls relevant to the Branch's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Branch's internal controls. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the members of the Committee of Management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Independence

**NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2009****NOTE 1 – ACCOUNTING POLICIES****(a) Basis of Preparation of Accounts**

The financial report is a general purpose financial report which has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, and other mandatory professional reporting requirements (Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views).

The financial report has also been prepared in accordance with the historical cost basis.

(b) Income Tax

No provision for income tax is made in the accounts as the Union is exempt from income tax under Section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(c) Employees

All officers and staff are employed by the Queensland Teachers' Union of Employees.

(d) Statement of compliance

The financial report complies with Australian Accounting Standards, which include Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standard ('AIFRS'). Compliance with AIFRS ensures that the financial report, comprising the financial statements and notes thereto, complies with International Financial Reporting Standards ('IFRS').

NOTE 2 – INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED TO MEMBERS OR GENERAL MANAGER

In accordance with the requirements of Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of sub-sections (1), (2) and (3) of section 272 which reads as follows:

- (1) A member of a reporting unit, or a Registrar, may apply to the reporting unit for specified prescribed information in relation to the reporting unit to be made available to the person making the application.
- (2) The application must be in writing and must specify the period within which, and the manner in which, the information is to be made available. The period must not be less than 14 days after the application is given to the reporting unit.
- (3) A reporting unit must comply with an application made under subsection (1).

NOTE 3 – SEGMENT INFORMATION

The Queensland Branch of the Australian Education Union operates solely as the Queensland branch of a trade union in Australia, and is domiciled in Australia.
