Re: Financial Report for the Australian Education Union, Queensland Branch for year ended 31 December 2010 – FR2010/2896

I acknowledge receipt of the financial report for the Australian Education Union, Queensland Branch (the Branch) for the year ended 31 December 2010. The report was lodged with Fair Work Australia (FWA) on 19 August 2011 and I note that the Branch has indicated that the report was previously submitted to FWA by mail in May 2011.

The financial report has now been filed.

I make the following comments to assist you when you next prepare a financial report. You are not required to take any further action in respect of the report lodged.

Review of Principal Activities

<u>Subsection 254(2)(a) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009</u> (the Act) requires an operating report to contain a review of the principal activities of the reporting unit, the results of those activities and any significant changes in the nature of the those activities. I note that the operating report provides a financial result. Please note that subsection 254(2)(a) of the Act does not require a *financial* result. It requires a description of the results from providing services to members.

Notes to the financial statements

Notice under section 272(5) of the Act

As you are aware the notes to the General Purpose Financial Report are required to include a notice drawing attention to the fact that information prescribed by the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009* is available to members on request. Note 2 to the financial statements reproduces the wording from outdated legislation. Instead the wording should read as follows:

- (1) A member of a reporting unit, or the General Manager, may apply to the reporting unit for specified prescribed information in relation to the reporting unit to be made available to the person making the application.
- (2) The application must be in writing and must specify the period within which, and the manner in which, the information is to be made available. The period must not be less than 14 days after the application is given to the reporting unit.
- (3) A reporting unit must comply with an application made under subsection (1).

Please ensure that future notes contain this extract of the Act word for word.

Independent auditor's report to the members of the Australian Education Union (Queensland Branch)

Report on the Financial Report

We have audited the accompanying financial report of Australian Education Union (Queensland Branch) ("the Branch"), which comprises the statement of financial position as at 31 December 2010, and the statement of comprehensive income, statement of changes in accumulated funds and statement of cash flows for the year ended on that date, a summary of significant accounting policies, other explanatory notes and the Committee of Management's declaration.

Committee of Management's Responsibility for the Financial Report

The members of the Committee of Management of the Branch are responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards (including the Australian Accounting Interpretations) and with Part 3 of Chapter 8 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2010. NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2010

NOTE 1 - ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of Preparation of Accounts

The financial report is a general purpose financial report which has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, and other mandatory professional reporting requirements (Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views).

The financial report has also been prepared in accordance with the historical cost basis.

(b) Income Tax

No provision for income tax is made in the accounts as the Union is exempt from income tax under Section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(c) Employees

All officers and staff are employed by the Queensland Teachers' Union of Employees.

(d) Statement of Compliance

The financial report complies with Australian Accounting Standards, which include Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standard ('AIFRS'). Compliance with AIFRS ensures that the financial report, comprising the financial statements and notes thereto, complies with International Financial Reporting Standards ('IFRS').

NOTE 2 - INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED TO MEMBERS OR GENERAL MANAGER

In accordance with the requirements of Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of sub-sections (1), (2) and (3) of section 272 which reads as follows:

- (1) A member of a reporting unit, or a Registrar, may apply to the reporting unit for specified prescribed information in relation to the reporting unit to be made available to the person making the application.
