

Re: Prescribed Information for elections (E2004/155)

I refer to the prescribed information, lodged in the Australian Industrial Registry on 11 March 2004 (see Attachment A), relating to elections for positions that received insufficient nominations in the original election (E2003/238) and for a casual vacancy arising from the resignation of Patricia MacLeod.

1. Resignation letter

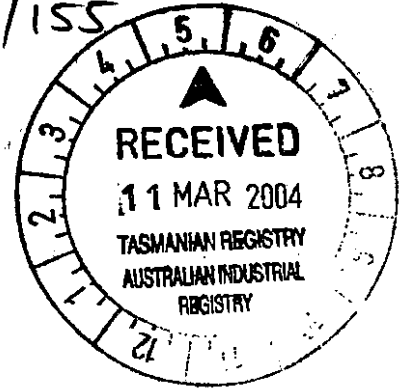
