Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 s.189—Arrangement for conduct of an election

Arrangement for conduct of election.

[1] On 28 August 2013 the Australian Entertainment Industry Association lodged with the Fair Work Commission the prescribed information in relation to an election for the following offices:

President
Vice-Presidents (2)
Members of the Executive Council (15)

- [2] The prescribed information was not lodged before the day prescribed by Regulation 138(3) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009*. That day is the day occurring 2 months before the first day when a person may, under the rules of the organisation or branch, become a candidate in the election. The organisation has requested that I allow a later day for the lodgement of the prescribed information under subsection 189(2) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (the Act). Having considered the reason for late lodgement, I allow lodgement on 28 August 2013 in this instance.
- [3] I am satisfied that an election for the abovenamed offices is required to be held under the rules of the organisation and, under subsection 189(3) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009*, I am making arrangements for the conduct of the election by the Australian Electoral Commission.

Live Performance Australia (LPA) Executive Council (EC) Elections:

Late Lodgment of Prescribed Information in Respect of Election Regulation 138(1) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009

It has been brought to our attention that the lodgment of our Prescribed Information occurred after the regulatory deadline in order for nominations for the LPA EC election to open on the proposed date of October 14.

Section 189(2) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* requires that Prescribed Information lodged under section 189(1) of the Act be lodged before the prescribed day. Regulation 138(3) defines the prescribed day as the day occurring 2 months before the first day when a person may, under the rules of the organisation, become a candidate in an election.

Our Prescribed Information was received by Fair Work Australia on 28 August, yet for our nominations to open on October 14, the Prescribed Information should have been lodged before 14 August 2013.

We apologise for this administrative over-sight and respectfully request that the Delegate allow an extension of time for lodgement of the Prescribed Information of two weeks until 28 August, the date on which it was lodged.
