Rules 33B - Election timeframe not clearly indicated

33B (iii) rule silent on the period nominations open. Suggest the rules could be amended to state nominations open for minimum of 6 weeks to facilitate nature of the industry "away" conditions of members.

Withdrawal of Nominations – rules appear to be silent on the withdrawal of a candidate's nomination. The rules should be clarified to confirm a withdrawal of nomination by the candidate must be in writing and submitted to the Returning Officer by a specified time, e.g. the close of the nomination period.

Rule 33B (xv): Candidate Resume – rule is unclear on the timeframe to be applied to submit a resume, and should be amended to clarify. (7 days after nominations close recommended).

Period between nominations closing and the ballot opening. To allow for verification of members and their nominator's eligibility, allow for a 7 day defect period to be applied where required, for the preparation of candidate resumes and for ballot material to be prepared. A minimum of 3 to 4 weeks in the timetable is recommended.

Ballot period: Rule 33B (v) ....at least 14 days before the election cause to be sent by prepaid mail..... It is not usual to send ballot material to voters 2 weeks before the ballot period has opened. As has happened in previous events if voters return their ballot paper before the ballot opens they cannot be admitted to the count. To prevent this issue in the future the rule should be amended to provide a longer ballot period (minimum 6 weeks) for members to return ballot material which would allow for the nature of the members industry and for longer postal delivery periods currently being experienced.

Multiple nominations – the rules appear to be silent on members lodging nominations and / or being elected to more than one office. Introducing a rule to address hierarchy of office could be considered.
