NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE 2002

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards and the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The following is a summary of significant accounting policies adopted by the Union in the preparation of the accounts which, unless otherwise stated, have been consistently applied:-

(a) Basis of Accounting

The accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where otherwise stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

Income and expenditure of the Union has been brought to account on an accruals basis of accounting so as to match income for the period with the expenditure incurred in earning that income.

(b) Provisions for Accrued Annual Leave and Long Service Leave

Provision for employee benefits in the form of Accrued Annual Leave and Accrued Long Service Leave has been made for the estimated accrued entitlements of all employees on the basis of their terms of employment.

In the case of Long Service Leave, the accrual has been measured by reference to periods of service and current salary rates as it is considered that this results in an amount not materially different to that achieved by discounting estimated future cash flows.

(c) Income Tax

No provision has been made in the accounts for income tax on the basis that the Union is exempt under Section 23(f) of the Income Tax Assessment Act.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE 2002 (CONTINUED)

(d) Non-Current Assets

Equity in Property and Furniture & Equipment are stated in the accounts at historical cost less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation.

With the exception of income-producing properties, which are held for investment purposes, the above assets (other than freehold land) are depreciated over their estimated useful lives at the following rates-

Buildings2.5% Prime CostOffice Furniture & EquipmentVarying Rates, using both prime cost and diminishing
value methods

(e) Unexpended Branch Funds

Funds raised by levies collected from members are held in trust by the National Office and allocated to the selected activities and projects as provided for by their respective resolutions by the National Executive.

As levies are collected by the National Office they are transferred to the respective provision account and held in trust for future allocation.

(f) Interest on Borrowings

Interest expense brought to account in the Statement of Income & Expenditure represents National Executive's share of the commercial bill borrowings. Interest expense pertaining to that part of bank bill borrowings on lent to ASU branches is not brought to account on the basis that each branch assumes liability for this.

Accordingly loans to branches brought to account as an asset of National Executive are interest free.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE 2002 (CONTINUED)

(g) Leased Assets

Leases of assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to National Office are classified as finance leases and are brought to account as an asset of the National Office with a corresponding liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values, with lease payments allocated between a reduction in lease liability and the lease interest for the period, and the leased asset amortised over its estimated useful life.

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are brought to account as an expense of National Office in the periods in which they are incurred.

(h) Comparatives

Where necessary, comparative information has been reclassified to achieve consistency in disclosure with current financial year information and other disclosures.

(i) Goods & Services Tax

Goods and Services Tax ("GST") collected by the Branch is brought to account as a liability with refundable input credits in respect of GST paid reducing that liability. Accordingly, with the exception of gross receipts and payments shown in the Statement of Cash Flows, all items of income and expenditure brought to account in the financial statements is after the deduction of any applicable GST.

(j) Investments

Non-Current investments are measured at historical cost less any required provision for dimunition in value. The carrying amount of investments is reviewed annually by the National Executive to ensure that it is not in excess of the recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is assessed from the quoted redemption value at balance date. The expected net cash flows from investments have not been discounted to their present value in determining the recoverable amounts.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE 2002 (CONTINUED)

2. WORKPLACE RELATIONS ACT 1996

In accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of sub-sections (1), (2) and (3) of Section 274, which reads as follows -

(1) A member of an organisation, or a registrar, may apply to the organisation for specified prescribed information in relation to the organisation.

(2) An organisation shall, on application made under sub-section (1) by a member of the organisation, or a registrar, make the specified information available to the member or registrar in such manner and within such time as is prescribed.

A registrar may only make an application under sub-section (1) at the request of a member of the organisation concerned and the registrar shall provide to a member information received because of an application made at the request of the member.

Withdrawal of the Western Australian MEU Branch from the Australian Municipal, Administrative, Clerical & Services Union

Subsequent to the date of this financial report, proceedings regarding the withdrawal of the Western Australian MEU Branch, being the "Applicant", from the amalgamated organisation have been settled by court order in the Federal Court of Australia. As part of the settlement, it was agreed by the "Respondent" that the "Applicant" would be released from its liability for capitation fees for the financial year ended June 30, 2002 and thereafter.

For the purposes of the financial statements, an amount of \$51,498 being the amount of Capitation outstanding to the National Executive as at 30th June 2002, has been included in the Provision for Doubtful Debts (see Note 5).

Other than that stated above, no event has arisen subsequent to balance date, the effect of which may be material in relation to the financial statement.
