I acknowledge receipt by the Registered Organisations Commission (the ROC) on 17 December 2018 of your organisation's ORP Statement, lodged under subsection 293J of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (the RO Act).

Remuneration of officers of the ASU ranked no lower than fifth

I refer to the recent correspondence between the ROC and your organisation. On 7 May 2019 the ROC raised matters concerning the content of the ORP Statement.

Your organisation responded by letter dated 20 May 2019, explaining the composition of the list of office holders detailed on the ORP Statement. Your letter also provided a brief outline of the relationship of those offices to the Branches.
