## Irregularities

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Details of written allegations of irregularities, and action taken by AEC:

1. Incorrect ballot paper for the Office of Public Service Industry – Other Executive Member, issued by Returning Officer (RO) with a duplicated name and a candidates' name missing.

The RO remedied this by:-

- replacement ballot paper issued by RO to affected voters, together with an explanatory note to voters.

- Ballot period extended by one week to allow voters for the affected Office sufficient time to return replacement ballot paper.
  - Reissued ballot was open for twenty-one (21) days, the same as the original ballot period.
  - ASU QT Branch and candidates advised.
2. An incorrect determination had been made by the RO that there were four vacancies available for National Conference Delegate General Industry Division. However, in accordance with the original Decision, five vacancies were available. There were five nominations received from eligible members. This error resulted in the unnecessary issuing of ballot papers to eligible voters for the election of only four, rather than five delegates, and a subsequent Declaration was issued.

The replacement RO remedied this by:-

- advice to ASU QT Branch and candidates, that the above action would be taken. They were also given time to respond before proceeding.
  - original Declaration for these positions was revoked.
  - election reverted to the point at which the acceptance of nominations was completed.
  - revised Declaration issued for an uncontested office as there were five (5) nominations received for five positions.
3. An incorrect determination had been made by the RO that there were fourteen vacancies available for National Conference Delegate Public Service Industry Division. In accordance with the Decision fifteen vacancies were available. This resulted in an incorrect ballot paper and subsequent Declaration being issued. The Ballot Paper and original Declaration showed fourteen to be elected, however the Election Notice correctly showed fifteen to be elected.

The replacement RO remedied this by:-

- advice to ASU QT Branch and candidates, that the following action would be taken. They were also given time to respond before proceeding
- original Declaration for these positions was revoked
- election reverted to the point at which the acceptance of nominations was completed
- fresh ballot was conducted for these positions only, using the original order of candidates on the ballot paper, but showing fifteen to be elected. An explanatory note to voters was also included.
- revised Declaration issued for contested office showing fifteen candidates elected.



I refer to my correspondence dated 29 October 2019 advising that following the declaration of results for this election errors were discovered in two of the elections. This correspondence also advised of my proposed course of action to progress the elections.

In relation to the Declaration of Results – E2018/255 – Stage 2 Contested Offices, issued on 23 September 2019, the declarations concerning the positions of National Conference Delegates General Industry Division, and National Conference Delegates Public Service Industry Division are hereby revoked. All other positions that were a part of that declaration are not affected by this advice and remain as per the original declaration.

### **Reminder of actions required when persons elected to office**

The Australian Electoral Commission has provided the Registered Organisations Commission (the ROC) a declaration of results for the election of contested and uncontested offices in matter E2018/255. This letter is a reminder of certain obligations imposed on organisations and on persons elected to office.

#### A notice must be published on the organisation's website

The organisation or branch must, as soon as practicable after receiving the post-election report, publish on its website a notice that a copy of the report is available from the organisation, branch or the AEC on request. The notice must be kept on the website for a period of at least 3 months (see regulation 141 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009).

#### Holders of office required to undertake approved training

Section 293K of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (the RO Act) requires each officer with financial management duties to undertake approved training that covers those duties within 6 months after the person begins to hold office. 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
