OPERATING REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE 2004

(a) Review of principal activities:

The principal activities of ASU Tax during the 2003-04 year were to provide industrial, professional and managerial services to members consistent with the objects of the union and particularly the object of protecting and improving the interests of members.

The results of our activities over the year were:

- We negotiated the ATO (General Employees) Agreement 2004 with the ATO. This involved consulting with members in person, by phone and e-mail around Australia, in the course of developing our claims, reporting on the progress of negotiations and the outcome of negotiations.
- We consulted with ATO management about its intended operations.
- We represented members on ATO OH&S Committees.
- We conducted employee support training in Melbourne and Sydney for interested ASU Tax staff representatives and members.
- We represented and resolved the employment concerns of individual members in conferences with ATO management
- We met with members and sought new staff representatives
- We appeared before the Australian Industrial Relations Commission on behalf of ASU Tax members to resolve their disputes with ATO management.
- We advised members on their rights and options to further their career interests, particularly with regard to health and workers compensation issues, disciplinary issues, their working environment and other employment concerns.
- We prepared and maintained guides on working in the ATO for ASU Tax members on subjects such as: Misconduct, Health, workers Compensation, Decision Making, Leave, Resolving Disputes and the Public Service Act.

There were no significant changes in the nature of our activities.

(b) Significant changes in financial affairs:

The 2004 year had a satisfactory outcome, given the significant increase in membership contributions, up from \$104,800 to \$131,454 (excluding GST), and despite the deficit for the year of \$29,756. ASU's Tax's ability to pay its debts as they fell due remained strong with increasing levels of membership, subscriptions rates and accumulated funds carried forward of \$66,687.

(c) Right of members to resign:

ASU Tax members have a right to resign under Rule 32 of the ASU National Rules by giving 14 days notice in writing to the ASU Tax Secretary, 116 Queensberry Street, Carlton South, Victoria, 3053.

(d) Trustees of superannuation entities:

No officer or member of the committee of management of ASU Tax is:

- (i) a trustee of a superannuation entity or an exempt public sector superannuation scheme; or
- (ii) a director of a company that is a trustee of a superannuation entity or an exempt public sector superannuation scheme;

where a criterion for the officer or member being the trustee or director is that the officer or member is an officer or member of a registered organisation.

(e) Number of members and number of employees:

ASU Tax had 772 members at 30 June 2004 and 1.8 Full time equivalent employees.

SCOPE

We have audited the accompanying financial statements comprising the Balance Sheet, Profit and Loss Statement, a statement of Cash Flows and notes to the financial statements by the Australian Municipal, Administrative, Clerical and Services Union – Taxation Officers' Branch for the financial year ended 30th June 2004, which have been prepared on the basis as set out in Note 1 to the Accounts. The Union's Committee of Management and Accounting Officer are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial statements and the information they contain. Notes to and forming part of these accounts for the year ended 30th June 2004.

1. Statement of Accounting Policies

In accordance with generally accepted accounting principles for organisations, the accounts are prepared under the Historical Cost Convention and in accordance with the Accounting Standards issued by the joint professional accounting bodies.

In particular:

- a. The accounts have not been adjusted to record either change in the general purchasing power of the dollar or in the price of specific assets.
- b. Depreciation of non-current assets is calculated using the diminishing value basis in order to write the assets off over their useful lives.
- c. No provision for income tax is necessary as "Trade Unions" are exempt for income tax under Section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment.
- d. The amounts have been adjusted for membership contributions paid in advance and Trade Creditors at Balance Date.

2. Information to be provided to Members or Registrar

In accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act, 1996 as amended, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of sub-sections (1), (2) and (3) of Section 274, which read as follows:

- 1. A member of an organisation, or Registrar may apply to the organisation for specified prescribed information in relation to the organisation.
- 2. An organisation shall, on application made under sub-section (1) by a member of the organisation or a Registrar, make the specified information available to the member or registrar in such manner, and with such time, as is prescribed.
- 3. A registrar may only make an application under sub-section (1) at the request of a member of the organisation concerned, and the Registrar shall provide to a member information received because of an application made at the request of the member.
