## RE: Schedule 1B of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 (the RAO Schedule) Financial reports for year ended 30 June 2004 - FR2004/428

I acknowledge receipt of the financial reports of the Australian Municipal, Administrative, Clerical and Services Union - Western Australian Branch for the year ended 30 June 2004. The documents were lodged in the Industrial Registry on 1 February 2005.

The documents have been filed.

Although the documents have been filed, I would like to comment on some issues arising out of the report. I make these comments to assist you when you next prepare financial reports. You do not need to take any further action in respect of the financial reports already lodged.

## 1. <u>Audit Report</u>

## (a) Auditors Opinion

The opinion expressed by the auditor in their report has been drafted in terms of the previous requirements of the Act. Section 257(5) of the RAO Schedule now sets the matters on which an auditor is required to state an opinion. An acceptable wording would be as follows:

"In our opinion the general purpose financial report presents fairly in accordance with applicable Australian Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements in Australia and the requirements of the RAO Schedule."

# 2. Operating Report

# (a) Details of right of members to resign

It is our view that this requirement necessitates, as a minimum, the inclusion of a reference to the specific rule in the rules of the reporting unit which makes provision for the resignation of members. Of course, if you choose to reproduce the whole of the relevant rule that would clearly satisfy the requirements of that provision.

# 3. Committee of Management Statement

Please note that under reporting Guideline 18(d) for the purposes of s253 this Statement need only be signed by only one designated officer.

# 4. General Purpose Financial Report

# (a) Information to be provided to members or Registrar

Please note the references to ss274(1), (2) and (3) of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 to provide information to members have now been superseded by ss272(5). The new legislation now requires the report to include a notice drawing attention to ss272(1), (2) and (3) and the requirements under those subsections.

Would you ensure those subsections are copied into the GPFR in the next financial report.

Our records also show that you have not lodged in the Industrial Registry the financial documents of the abovementioned body for the year ended 30 June 2003. Therefore, I request lodgement of all outstanding financial documents as soon as practicable.

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#### INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT TO THE MEMBERS

Scope

#### The annual financial report

The annual financial report comprises the statement of financial position, statement of financial performance, accompanying notes to the financial report, and the certificate and statement by the Branch Secretary and Committee of Management respectively, for the year ended 30 June 2004.

The Committee of Management are responsible for the preparation and true and fair presentation of the financial report and have determined that the accounting policies used and described in Note 1 to the financial statements, which form part of the financial report are consistent with the financial reporting requirements of the Union and are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. This includes responsibility for the maintenance of adequate accounting records and internal controls that are designed to prevent and detect fraud and error, and for the accounting policies and accounting estimates inherent in the financial report.

The financial report has been prepared for distribution to members for the purpose of fulfilling the Union's financial reporting requirements. We disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report or on the financial report to which it relates to any person other than the members, or for any purpose other than that for which it was prepared.

#### Audit Approach

We conducted an independent audit in order to express an opinion to the members. Our audit was conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards, in order to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. The nature of an audit is influenced by factors such as the use of professional judgment, selective testing, the inherent limitations of internal control, and the availability of persuasive rather than conclusive evidence. Therefore, an audit cannot guarantee that all material misstatements have been detected.

We performed procedures to assess whether in all material respects the financial report presents fairly, in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1, so as to present a view, which is consistent with our understanding of the Union's financial position, and of its performance as represented by the results of its operations. These policies do not require the application of all Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements in Australia. No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used and described in Note 1, are appropriate for the needs of the members.

We formed our audit opinion on the basis of these procedures, which included:

- examining, on a test basis, information to provide evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial report, and
- assessing the appropriateness of the accounting policies and disclosures used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made.

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2004

## NOTE 1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996. The financial report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Union in the preparation of the financial report:

#### a) Fixed Assets

Freehold land and buildings are brought to account at cost or at independent valuation.

The depreciable amount of buildings and building improvements are calculated on a straight line basis over the useful lives of the assets to the Union. The depreciation rates vary between 2.5% and 11.25% pa.

Office Equipment and Furniture are depreciated on a diminishing value method at a rate of 20%pa. Motor vehicles are depreciated on a diminishing value method at a rate of 15%pa.

The gain or loss on disposal of all fixed assets, including revalued assets, is determined as the difference between the carrying amount of the asset at the time of disposal and the proceeds of disposal and is included in operating profit before income tax of the company in the year of disposal. Any realised revaluation increment relating to the disposed asset which is included in the asset revaluation reserve is transferred to the asset realisation reserve.

#### b) Employee Entitlements

#### Annual Leave

The liability for annual leave is recognised and is measured as the amount unpaid at the reporting date at current pay rates in respect of employees' services up to that date.

#### Long Service Leave

In the case of Long Service Leave, the accrual has been measured by reference to periods of service and current salary rates as it is considered that this results in an amount not materially different to that achieved by discounting estimated future cash flows.

#### b) Employee Entitlements cont...

#### Sick Leave

Sick leave entitlements are accumulated in a similar manner to annual leave entitlements but do not vest and are paid only upon a valid claim for sick leave by an employee. The liability for non-vesting accumulated sick leave is the component of the entitlements accumulated as at the reporting date that is expected to result in payments to the employees.

#### c) Income Tax

No provision for income tax is necessary as "Trade Unions" are exempt form income tax under Section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act (1997).

#### d) Cash

For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand, at banks and on deposit.

#### e) Revenue

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

## f) Receivables

All sundry debtors are recognised at the amounts receivables as they are due for settlement no more than 30 days. Collectibility of debtors is reviewed on an ongoing basis and a provision is made for debts where recoverability is doubtful.

## g) Creditors and Accruals

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the entity prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. These amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2004 (Continued)

### NOTE 2. INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED TO MEMBERS OR REGISTRAR

In accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of sub-sections (1), (2) and (3) of Section 274, which read as follows:

- "274 (1) {Application for information} A member of an organisation, or a Registrar may apply to the organisation for specified prescribed information in relation to the organisation.
- 274 (2) {Provision of information} An organisation shall, on application made under subsection (1) by a member of the organisation or a Registrar, make the specified information available to the member or Registrar in such manner, and within such time, as is prescribed.
- 274 (3) {Function of Registrar} A registrar may only make an application under subsection (1) at the request of a member of the organisation concerned, and the Registrar shall provide to a member, information received because of an application made at the request of the member."
