The Branch Council, being the Committee of Management for the purposes of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, presents its operating report of the Australian Nursing Federation, New South Wales Branch for the financial year ended 30 June 2004.

- 1. The principal activities of the Branch during the financial year were the industrial and professional representation of nurses and nursing. No significant change in the nature of these activities occurred during the year.
- 2. The surplus of the Branch for the financial year amounted to \$649. There were no significant changes to the Branch's financial affairs during the year.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2004.

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Accounts have been prepared in accordance with Applicable Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and the Australian Workplace Relations Act, 1996. The accounts have also been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or except where stated current valuations of non current assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the Branch in the preparation of the accounts.

- (a) The concept of accruals accounting has been adopted in the preparation of the Accounts.
- (b) Inventory was obsolete and was therefore written off on 30 June 2003.
- (c) No provision for Income Tax is necessary as the Federation is exempt from Income Tax under Section 50 15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act.

2. INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED TO MEMBERS OR REGISTRAR

In accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act, 1996, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of Sub-Sections [1], [2] and [3] of Section 272 of Schedule 1B which read as follows:-

- [1] A member of a reporting unit, or a Registrar, may apply to the reporting unit for specified prescribed information in relation to the reporting unit to be made available to the person making the application.
- [2] The application must be in writing and must specify the period within which, and the manner in which, the information is to be made available. The period must not be less than 14 days after the application is given to the reporting unit.
- [3] A Reporting unit must comply with an application made under subsection (1).

6. AUSTRALIAN EQUIVALENTS TO INTERNATIONAL FINANCIAL REPORTING STANDARDS (IFRSs)

For the year ending 30 June 2006, all general purpose financial reports will be required to comply with Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs) instead of Australian Accounting Standards presently on issue. Comparative financial statements must also be presented in accordance with Australian equivalents to IFRSs for the year ending 30 June 2005.

The Council considers that no key accounting policy changes will arise out of this transition to IFRSs.

A more detailed review will be conducted during the year ending 30 June 2005.

INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT

To the members of the Australian Nursing Federation, New South Wales Branch.

SCOPE

The Financial Report and the Responsibility of the Branch Council and Secretary of the Branch

The financial report comprises the statement of financial position, statement of financial performance, statement of cash flows, accompanying notes to the financial statements and the Branch Council's statement for the Australian Nursing Federation, New South Wales Branch, for the year ended 30 June 2004.

The Branch Council and the Secretary of the Branch are responsible for the preparation and true and fair presentation of the financial report in accordance with the Workplace Relations Act 1996. This includes responsibility for the maintenance of adequate accounting records and internal controls that are designed to prevent and detect fraud and error, and for the accounting policies and accounting estimates inherent in the financial report.

Audit Approach

We have conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the members of the Branch. Our audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards in order to provide reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. The nature of an audit is influenced by factors such as the use of professional judgment, selective testing, the inherent limitations of internal controls, and the availability of persuasive rather than conclusive evidence. Therefore, an audit cannot guarantee that all material misstatements have been detected.

We performed procedures to assess whether in all material respects the financial report presents fairly, in accordance with the Workplace Relations Act 1996, including compliance with Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements in Australia a view which is consistent with our understanding of the Branch's financial position and its performance as represented by the results of its operations and cash flows.

We formed our audit opinion on the basis of these procedures, which included:

examining, on a test basis, information to provide evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial report, and

assessing the appropriateness of the accounting policies and disclosures used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by the Branch Council and the Secretary of the Branch.

While we considered the effectiveness of management's internal controls over financial reporting when determining the nature and extent of our procedures, our audit was not designed to provide assurance on internal controls.

INDEPENDENCE

In conducting our audit, we followed applicable independence requirements of Australian professional ethical pronouncements and the Workplace Relations Act 1996.
