1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

7. IMPACT OF ADOPTION OF AUSTRALIAN EQUIVALENTS TO INTERNATIONAL FINANCIAL REPORTING STANDARDS

The Branch Council is preparing and managing transition to Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRS) effective for financial reporting periods commencing from 1 January 2005. The adoption of AIFRS will be reflected in the Branch's financial statements for the year ending 30 June 2006. On first time adoption of AIFRS, comparatives for the financial year ended 30 June 2005 are required to be restated. The majority of the AIFRS transitional adjustments will be made retrospective against retained earnings at 1 July 2004.

The Branch Council is of the opinion that there are no material differences in the Branch's accounting policies on conversion to AIRFS. Users of the financial statements should, however, note that the amounts disclosed could change if there are any amendments to current AIFRS by standard-setters, or interpretation of the AIFRS requirements changes due to the continuing transition work of the Branch Council

8. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

Interest Rate Risk

The Branch's exposure to interest rate risk and the effective weighted average interest rate for cash at bank is 2005 0.6% and 2004 0.5%.

Credit Risk Exposure

Credit risk is the risk that counter parties to a financial asset will fail to discharge their obligations, causing the Branch to incur a financial loss.

The credit risk exposure of the Branch to financial assets which have been recognised in the Statement of Financial Position is generally the carrying amounts, net of any provisions for doubtful debts.

The carrying amounts of cash and non-interest bearing monetary financial assets and liabilities (eg receivables and payables) approximate net fair values.
