NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2005

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The significant policies which have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are:

(a) Basis of Preparation

The financial report of the Federation is a general purpose financial report which has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views, the Workplace Relations Act of 1996 and the other requirements of law in Australia. It has been prepared on the basis of historical costs and, except where stated, do not take into account changing money values or fair values of non-current assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied.

(b) Capitation Fees

Capitation fees are calculated as a levied price per registered member.

(c) Taxation

No provision for income tax is necessary as the Federation is exempt from income tax under Section 23(f) of the Income Tax Assessment Act.

(d) Adoption of Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards

Australia is currently preparing for the introduction of International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) effective for financial years commencing 1 January 2005. This requires the production of accounting data for future comparative purposes at the end of the current financial year.

The committee are assessing the significance of these changes and preparing for their implementation and at this stage, are of the opinion no key differences in the Federation's accounting policies will arise from the adoption of IFRS.

2. INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED TO MEMBERS OR REGISTRAR

In accordance with the requirements of the RAO Schedule, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of Section 272 of that schedule, which reads as follows:

- (1) A member of a reporting unit, or a Registrar, may apply to the reporting unit for specified prescribed information in relation to the reporting unit to be made available to the person making the application.
- (2) The application must be in writing and must specify the period within which, and the manner in which, the information is to be made available. The period must not be less than 14 days after the application is given to the reporting unit.
- (3) A reporting unit must comply with an application made under subsection (1).

2. INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED TO MEMBERS OR REGISTRAR

(4) A Registrar may only make an application under subsection (1) at the request of a member of the reporting unit concerned, and the Registrar must provide to a member information received because of an application made at the request of the member.

The Federation's South Australian Branch Executive are responsible for the financial report. Australian Nursing Federation – South Australian Branch Financial Report for the Year Ended 30th June 2005 - FR2005/262 Schedule 1B of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 (RAO Schedule)

Thank you for the financial report of the South Australian Branch of the Australian Nursing Federation for the year ended 30th June 2005. The documents were lodged in the Industrial Registry on 29th December 2005. I apologise for the delay in our response to you.

The documents have been filed.

I make the following comments to assist you in preparing financial documents in the future. You do not need to take any further action in respect of the documents which have been lodged.

Operating Report – Number of Employees

Paragraph 6 of the Operating Report states:

The Branch has no employees. All work performed on behalf of the Branch is undertaken by persons who are either employees of the S.A. Branch or elected Officers of the Branch.

It is unclear what is meant by 'employees of the S.A. Branch'. It may be that this is intended to be a reference to the state registered body rather than to the South Australian Branch of the federally registered organisation. If that is the case then would you please state this more clearly so as to distinguish between the two bodies and avoid any apparent contradiction regarding whether or not the South Australian Branch of the federally registered organisation has any employees.

General Purpose Financial Report (GPFR) – Disclosure of Expenditure

When preparing a GPFR, section 253(2) of the RAO Schedule requires a reporting unit to provide information that is specified in the Industrial Registrar's Reporting Guidelines. In particular, Guideline 11 sets out in detail those items of expenditure that must be disclosed by a reporting unit either in the notes to, or on the face of, a financial statement. Included are such items as:

- capitation fees or membership subscriptions (11(b));
- affiliation fees or subscriptions to political parties or industrial bodies (11(d));
- levies that have been imposed upon the reporting unit (11(e)).
- grants or donations made by the reporting unit (11(f));
- employment benefits paid to office holders (11(g));
- employment benefits paid to employees (other than office holders) (11(h));
- legal costs (11(i));
- fees and/or allowances paid for attendance at conferences (11(i));
- conference and meeting expenses (11(k)); and
- penalties imposed on the reporting unit by the Workplace Relations Act (11(I));

Other than capitation fees, none of the items set out in Guideline 11 have been disclosed in the accounts. This may be because some, or most, of them were not applicable. Would you please ensure, however, that these items are separately itemised in the future where applicable.
