Reminder of actions required when persons elected to office

The Australian Electoral Commission has provided the Registered Organisations Commission (the ROC) a declaration of results for the election of uncontested offices in matter E2019/141. This letter is a reminder of certain obligations imposed on organisations and on persons elected to office.

A notice must be published on the organisation's website

The organisation or branch must, as soon as practicable after receiving the post-election report, publish on its website a notice that a copy of the report is available from the organisation, branch or the AEC on request. The notice must be kept on the website for a period of at least 3 months (see regulation 141 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009).

Holders of office required to undertake approved training

Section 293K of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (the RO Act) requires each officer with financial management duties to undertake approved training that covers those duties within 6 months after the person begins to hold office. Please ensure that relevant officers undertake approved training within the required timeframe. Please also ensure that all new holders of office are advised of their obligations to make disclosures regarding remuneration, non-cash benefits and material personal interests, the details of which are provided for in the RO Act.

Organisation must notify the Commission of changes

Also, section 233(2) of the RO Act requires that an organisation must notify the Commission within **35 days of any changes** to the holders of office in the organisation. If there are no changes a notification is not required. If the election has resulted in any changes to the holders of office, the Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation - Tasmanian Branch must notify the Commission of these changes. In particular, please advise:

- 1. Person(s) who have ceased to hold office:
 - the name of the office vacated;
 - the date of the change of office holder; and
 - the name of the person vacating the office.
- 2. Person(s) who have commenced to hold office:
 - the name of the office now held;
 - the date of the change of office holder;
 - the name of the person now holding the office;
 - the postal address of the person (generally the postal address of the organisation); and

• the occupation of the person now holding the office.

The notification must include a declaration by the Secretary (or other prescribed officer) that the information is a correct statement of the changes made. A template notification of changes, which may assist you, is attached. If any change does not apply until a date in the future, you do not need to notify until then (e.g. AGM, 1 January, 2nd Monday in March). If you have already lodged this information, please disregard this reminder.

Rule 49.2.1 Within a period of twenty-one days before the date of commencement of the period for lodging nominations of candidates for an election for office, cause to be published in a newspaper or <u>newspapers</u> a notice setting out:

- 49.2.1(a) the name of the Federation
- 49.2.1(b) the title of the office
- 49.2.1(c) the form in which nominations are to be made
- 49.2.1(d) the place for lodging nominations;
- 49.2.1(e) the times and dates of the commencement of the period for lodging nominations:

and inviting nominations from persons, eligible for election for the office under the Rules of the Federation, to stand as candidates for election to that office.

Recommendation: Include an option for the Returning Officer to notify members of an election by electronic means when appropriate. The Returning Officer could then determine the most efficient and cost effective means to notify members of an election. This could then include notifying members by email rather than by advertising in multiple newspapers of an election.

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
