NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2005

1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Consensus Views, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Australian Industrial Registry.

The financial report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Branch in the preparation of the financial statements:

(a) Income Tax

No provision for income tax is necessary as the Branch is exempt from income tax under section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1997.

(b) Fixed Assets

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated using both the straight line basis and the diminishing value basis over the useful lives of the assets to the Branch commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for Property, Plant & Equipment range between 13-40% Diminishing Value and 7.5%-27% Straight Line.

The carrying amount of fixed assets is reviewed annually to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount of those assets.

The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to their present values in determining the recoverable amounts.

(c) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the Branch's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year together with benefits arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and sick leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at their nominal amount. Other employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

Contributions are made by the Branch to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2005

1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies (cont.)

(d) Cash

For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand, at banks and on deposit.

(e) Revenue

Subscription income is recognised in the period to which the subscriptions relate.

Revenue from the provision of services is recognised when the right to be compensated for the services has been attained.

Interest is recognised over the period for which the funds are invested.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(f) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.

2. Information to be Provided to Members or Registrar

- (a) A member of a reporting unit, or a Registrar, may apply to the reporting unit for specified prescribed information in relation to the reporting unit to be made available to the person making the application.
- (b) The application must be in writing and must specify the period within which, and the manner in which, the information is to be made available. The period must not be less that 14 days after the application is given to the reporting unit.
- (c) A reporting unit must comply with an application made under s 272(1) (2) and (3) of the RAO Schedule.

17. Adoption of Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards

The Organisation is preparing and managing the transition to Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AEIFRS) effective for the financial years commencing from 1 January 2005. The adoption of AEIFRS will be reflected in the Organisation's financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2006. The impact of the alternative treatments and elections under AASB 1: First Time Adoption of Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards has been considered where applicable.

The Committee are of the opinion that there are no material differences in the Organisation's accounting policies on conversion to AEIFRS. Users of the financial statements should note, however, that the impact of AEIFRS on the Organisation, could change if there are any amendments by standard-setters to the current AEIFRS.

The concise financial report of the Branch has been audited in accordance with the provisions of the Workplace Relations Act, 1996, as amended, and the following summary is provided for members in accordance with section 279(2) of the Act. OPERATING REPORT

Principal Activities

The principal activities of the Australian Nursing Federation Tasmanian Branch during the financial year were to provide advice and services to members and to act on their behalf in industrial matters. No significant change in the nature of these activities occurred during the year.

Operating Results

The result of trading operations for the year was a surplus of \$54,310.

Significant Changes in State of Affairs

There were no significant changes in the state of affairs of the Branch during the year.

Discussions and Analysis of the Financial Statements

The Branch recorded a surplus of \$54,310 in 2005, compared to a deficit of \$20,631 in 2004. This is a strong improvement, and consistent with medium term plans to put the Branch on a strong financial footing leading up to the next round of enterprise bargaining. Subscription income increased by a further \$170,000, reflecting the continuing strong growth in membership. All other areas of income remained strong during the year, and this is likely to continue, although as our membership is now reaching a high percentage of active nurses in Tasmania we are expecting some plateauing in the rates of membership growth.

Expenditure on membership services increased marginally, and we continued to exercise good control over operational expenditure levels, with professional fees and general operational expenditure both falling relative to the previous year. We need to continue to exercise good controls over general expenditure to allow us to maintain staffing at levels which provide effective services to members. Full time equivalent staffing levels have been maintained at 11.5 throughout the year, and increases in staffing costs are as a result of general salary increases.

Total assets increased substantially compared to 2004, with this being substantially due to higher holdings of cash resulting from our strong operational result.

Liabilities have increased, although this is mainly due to a continuing increase in annual leave and long service leave provisions for employees. We can expect these increases in provisions to continue as staff get closer to being able to access long service leave.

Members and Employees

As at 30 June 2005 there were 3,780 members in the register of members and taken to be members of the Branch. All members have the right to resign from the Branch in accordance with s 174 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

As at 30 June there were 11.5 employees of the Branch, measured on a full time equivalent basis.
