Schedule 1B - Workplace Relations Act 1996 (RAO Schedule)

I have received the financial report for the Western Australian Branch of the Australian Nursing Federation for the year ended 30 June 2004. The documents were lodged in the Registry on 23 June 2005 under s268 of Schedule 1B of the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

As you would be aware, this is the first lodgment by the branch of its audited financial report under Schedule 1B (Registration and Accountability of Organisations (RAO) Schedule) which commenced on 12 May 2003.

The documents have been filed.

The following comments may assist you when you next prepare financial reports. No further action is required regarding these issues with respect to the lodged documents.

1. Timing of financial documents

The RAO Schedule sets out a particular chronological order in which the financial documents must be prepared, made available to members and presented to a meeting - see the enclosed *Timeline*.

It is noted that the financial documents did not comply fully with these requirements as they were not provided to the members and presented to a meeting within 6 months of the end of the financial year — see s265(5) & 266 of the RAO Schedule. In future financial years the branch should ensure it complies with the time frames set out in the *Timeline*.

2. Statement of Cash Flows

The accounts did not include a Statement of Cash Flows. This is a mandatory requirement under 253(2)(a)(iii) of the RAO Schedule and in future financial years must be provided.

3. Periods of office for members of the Committee of Management

The Operating Report should provide not only the names of the members of the Committee of Management but also the period which each person held their position during the financial year – see Reg 159(c) of the RAO Regulations.

4. Reference to Legislation

The reference in the Auditor's Report to s273 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 should be amended to s253 of the RAO Schedule.

5. Due date for next financial return is 15 January 2006

Now that the financial year for 30 June 2005 has ended, the branch should consider commencing the financial reporting process set out in the enclosed *Timeline* to ensure that the financial documents are lodged in the Registry by 15 January 2006. The maximum extension that is available is one month — see s265(5).

Relationship between ANF- WA Branch and state registered body

The Notes to the Accounts refer to the relationship between the ANF-WA Branch and the related state registered body as follows:

The main function of the Australian Nursing Federation (Western Australian Branch) is to receive from the Australian Nursing Federation Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, capitation fees and other amounts ... and to pay such amounts to Federal Office....

Expenditure incurred by the Branch is paid for on its behalf by the Australian Nursing Federation Industrial Union of Workers, Perth...

It is not appropriate (for the ANF WA Branch) to prepare a cash flow statement as the branch did not operate on its own bank account.

In the light of these comments the ANF-WA Branch may consider making an application for a certificate under s269 of the RAO Schedule. Such a certificate would allow the branch to fulfil its financial reporting obligations under the RAO Schedule by simply lodging in the Registry the financial report prepared by the associated state body. The only additional document that the branch would need to prepare would be an Operating Report under s254 of the RAO Schedule. Please refer to s269 of the RAO Schedule and Reg 163 of the RAO Regulations for further information on this issue at *Attachment A*.

Please note - if the branch is issued a s269 certificate and fulfils its financial reporting obligations via s269 then points 1 to 5 of this letter will not be relevant.

RAO s269 - Reporting units with substantial common membership with State registered bodies

- (1) This section applies to a reporting unit if there is an industrial association (the associated State body) that:
 - (a) is registered or recognised as such an association (however described) under a prescribed State Act; and
 - (b) is, or purports to be, composed of substantially the same members as the reporting unit; and
 - (c) has, or purports to have, officers who are substantially the same as designated officers in relation to the reporting unit.
- (2) A reporting unit is taken to have satisfied this Part if this section applies to the reporting unit and:
 - (a) a Registrar, on the application of the reporting unit, issues a certificate stating that the financial affairs of the reporting unit are encompassed by the financial affairs of the associated State body; and
 - (b) the associated State body has, in accordance with prescribed State legislation, prepared accounts, had those accounts audited, provided a copy of the audited accounts to its members and lodged the audited accounts with the relevant State authority; and
 - (c) the reporting unit has lodged a copy of the audited accounts with the Industrial Registry; and
 - (d) any members of the reporting unit who are not also members of the associated State body have been provided with copies of the accounts at substantially the same time as the members of the reporting unit who are members of the associated State body; and
 - (e) a report under section 254 has been prepared in respect of the activities of the reporting unit and has been provided to members of the reporting unit with the copies of the accounts.

1. Statement of significant accounting policies

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The financial report has been prepared on the basis of historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or current valuations of non-current assets.

Australia is currently preparing for the introduction of International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) effective for financial years commencing 1 January 2005. This requires the production of accounting data for future comparative purposes at the beginning of the next financial year. The Branch's Secretary, in conjunction with external advisors, is reviewing the implications for Australian Nursing Federation Western Australian Branch arising from the adoption of Australian equivalents to IFRS. There are no major differences in the Branch's accounting policies which will arise from the adoption of Australian equivalents to IFRS.

The above should not be regarded as a complete list of changes in accounting polices that will result from the transition to Australian equivalents to IFRS, as not all standards have been analysed yet, and some decisions have not yet been made where choices of accounting policies are available. For these reasons it is not possible to quantify the impact of the transition to Australian equivalents to IFRS on the Branch's financial position and reported results.

Income of the Branch is exempt from income tax by virtue of Division 50 Section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1997.
