Financial Report for the Year Ended 30th June 2005 - FR2005/265
Schedule 1B of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 (RAO Schedule)**

Thank you for the financial report of the Western Australian Branch of the Australian Nursing Federation for the year ended 30th June 2005. The documents were lodged in the Industrial Registry on 24th March 2006.

The documents have been filed.

I make the following comments to assist you in preparing financial documents in the future. You do not need to take any further action in respect of the documents which have been lodged.

Secretary's Certificate

I note that you have forgotten to date the Designated Officer's Certificate which was signed by you as Branch Secretary. Would you please ensure in future years that the certificate is dated.

Timing – Late Presentation of Documents to a Meeting and Late Lodgement

The Secretary's certificate states that the financial documents were presented to a meeting of the Committee of Management on 27th February 2006. Section 266(3) of the RAO Schedule requires financial documents to be presented to a meeting of the Committee of Management within the period of 6 months starting at the end of the financial year (that is, by 31st December 2005).

Further, section 268 of the RAO Schedule requires the Branch to lodge its financial report with the Registry within 14 days of the meeting at which they were presented (that is, by 13th March 2006).

You are requested in future financial years to present and lodge documents within the timeframes that are set out in the RAO Schedule (copy attached).

Operating Report – Number of Employees

Paragraph 10 of the Operating Report states:

The Branch has no employees at the end of the financial year. All work performed on behalf of the Branch is undertaken by persons who are either employees of the Australian Nursing Federation Industrial Union of Workers Perth or elected Officers of the Branch.

I understand this as meaning that any elected Officers who carry out work are unpaid for that work.

On the other hand, Note 3 on page 4 itemises 'Employee Expenses' (including salaries and superannuation) totalling \$99,754.

These two points seem to be inconsistent. It may be, however, that there were some employees who were employed during the financial year but that there were no employees at 30th June 2005.

I would appreciate it if you could advise me regarding this apparent discrepancy. My contact details appear at the bottom of this letter.

Statement of Cash Flows

As in previous years, the accounts which have been audited and lodged do not include a Statement of Cash Flows. Note 8 on page 5 states that "It is not appropriate to prepare a cash flow statement as the Branch did not operate its own bank account."

As you have been previously advised, a Statement of Cash Flows is a mandatory requirement under section 253(2)(a)(iii) of the RAO Schedule and must be provided.

Relationship between ANF-WA Branch and State Registered Body

As in previous years, the accounts contain a number of statements regarding the relationship between the Western Australian Branch of the federally registered ANF and the state registered body (which is referred to as the Australian Nursing Federation Industrial Union of Workers Perth):

The main function of the Australian Nursing Federation (Western Australian Branch) is to receive from the Australian Nursing Federation Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, capitation fees and other amounts shown above and to pay such amounts to Federal Office. (note 1 on page 4)

Expenditure incurred by the Branch is paid for on its behalf by the Australian Nursing Federation Industrial Union of Workers, Perth. (note 4 on page 5)

It is not appropriate to prepare a cash flow statement as the Branch did not operate its own bank account. (note 8 on page 5)

The Branch is once again reminded of the benefits of making an application for a certificate under section 269 of the RAO Schedule. As previously advised, such a certificate would allow the Branch to fulfil its financial reporting obligations under the RAO Schedule by simply lodging in the Registry the financial report prepared by the associated state registered body. The only additional document that the Branch would need to prepare would be an Operating Report under section 254 of the RAO Schedule. Please refer to Attachment A, which sets out the relevant provisions regarding this issue (that is, section 269 of the RAO Schedule and Regulation 163 of the RAO Regulations).

RAO Section 269 - Reporting units with substantial common membership with State registered bodies

(1) This section applies to a reporting unit if there is an industrial association (the ***associated State body***) that:

- (a) is registered or recognised as such an association (however described) under a prescribed State Act; and
- (b) is, or purports to be, composed of substantially the same members as the reporting unit; and
- (c) has, or purports to have, officers who are substantially the same as designated officers in relation to the reporting unit.

(2) A reporting unit is taken to have satisfied this Part if this section applies to the reporting unit and:

- (a) a Registrar, on the application of the reporting unit, issues a certificate stating that the financial affairs of the reporting unit are encompassed by the financial affairs of the associated State body; and
- (b) the associated State body has, in accordance with prescribed State legislation, prepared accounts, had those accounts audited, provided a copy of the audited accounts to its members and lodged the audited accounts with the relevant State authority; and
- (c) the reporting unit has lodged a copy of the audited accounts with the Industrial Registry; and
- (d) any members of the reporting unit who are not also members of the associated State body have been provided with copies of the accounts at substantially the same time as the members of the reporting unit who are members of the associated State body; and
- (e) a report under section 254 has been prepared in respect of the activities of the reporting unit and has been provided to members of the reporting unit with the copies of the accounts.

RAO Regulation 163 - Prescribed State Act (RAO Schedule, s 269 (1) (a))

(1) For paragraph 269 (1) (a) of the RAO Schedule, the following are prescribed State Acts:

- (a) *Industrial and Employee Relations Act 1994* (SA);
- (b) *Industrial Relations Act 1979* (WA);
- (c) *Industrial Relations Act 1984* (Tas);
- (d) *Industrial Relations Act 1996* (NSW);
- (e) *Industrial Relations Act 1999* (Qld).

(2) For paragraph 269 (2) (b) of the RAO Schedule, the following legislation is prescribed State legislation:

- (a) any Act mentioned in subregulation (1);
- (b) any subordinate legislation made under any Act mentioned in subregulation (1).



SCOPE

We have audited the financial report on pages 2 to 6, being the Statement of Income and Expenditure, Balance Sheet, and Notes forming part of the accounts of the Australian Nursing Federation (WA Branch), ("the Branch") for the year ended 30 June, 2005. The Branch's Council is responsible for the financial report. We have conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the members of the Branch.

Our audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. Our procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report, and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects, the financial report is presented fairly in accordance with Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements in Australia so as to present a view which is consistent with our understanding of the Branch's financial position and the results of its operations.

1. Statement of significant accounting policies

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The financial report has been prepared on the basis of historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or current valuations of non-current assets.

Australia is currently preparing for the introduction of International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) effective for financial years commencing 1 January 2005. This requires the production of accounting data for future comparative purposes at the beginning of the next financial year. The Branch's Secretary, in conjunction with external advisors, is reviewing the implications for Australian Nursing Federation Western Australian Branch arising from the adoption of Australian equivalents to IFRS. There are no major differences in the Branch's accounting policies which will arise from the adoption of Australian equivalents to IFRS.

The above should not be regarded as a complete list of changes in accounting policies that will result from the transition to Australian equivalents to IFRS, as not all standards have been analysed yet, and some decisions have not yet been made where choices of accounting policies are available. For these reasons it is not possible to quantify the impact of the transition to Australian equivalents to IFRS on the Branch's financial position and reported results.

Income of the Branch is exempt from income tax by virtue of Division 50 Section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1997.

Operating Report

The Branch Council, being the Committee of Management for the purposes of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, presents its operating report of the Australian Nursing Federation (Western Australian Branch) for the financial year ended 30 June 2005.

1. The principal activities of the Branch during the financial year were the industrial and professional representation of nurses and nursing. No significant change in the nature of these activities occurred during the year.
2. The surplus of the Branch for the financial year amounted to \$40,690. There were no significant changes to the Branch's financial affairs during year.
3. Members retain the right to resign from the Australian Nursing Federation in accordance with section 10 of the Federal Rules and Section 174 of Schedule 1B to the Workplace Relations Act 1996.
4. No officeholder of the Branch Council acts as a trustee of a superannuation fund as a result of their position on the Branch Council.
5. A record has been kept of all monies paid by, or collected from, members and all monies so paid or collected have been credited to the bank account to which those monies are to be credited, in accordance with the rules of the Branch.
6. Before any expenditure was incurred by the Branch, approval for the incurring of the expenditure was obtained in accordance with the rules of the Branch.
7. With regard to funds of the Branch raised by compulsory levies or voluntary contributions from members, or funds other than the General Fund operated in accordance with the rules, no payments were made out of any such funds for purposes other than those for which the funds were operated.
8. No loans or other financial benefits, other than remuneration in respect of their full-time employment with the organisation, made to persons holding office in the Branch other than benefits received as a member and available to all members.
9. The number of members of the Branch at the end of the financial year amounted to 11,173. The register of members of the Branch was maintained in accordance with the RAO.
10. The Branch has no employees at the end of the financial year. All work performed on behalf of the Branch is undertaken by persons who are either employees of the Australian Nursing Federation Industrial Union of Workers Perth or elected Officers of the Branch.



 - f. there has been compliance with any order for inspection of financial records made by the Commission under section 273 of the Schedule 1B to the Workplace Relations Act 1996.


