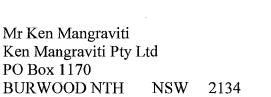

#### **OPERATING REPORT**

This Operating Report covers:

- the activities of the Australian Rail, Tram & Bus Industry Union, National Council, for the financial year ended 31<sup>st</sup> December 2008,
- the results of those activities and
- any significant changes in the nature of those activities as required under **s.254 Workplace Relations Act 1996.**

### 1. Principal Activities of the National Council

The principal activities of the National Council of the Union, as conducted through the National Office, during the past year fell into the following categories:

ACTIVITIES
Making agreements with employers
Implementation of the decisions of the National Executive and National Council
Implementation of the union's organising agenda, including direct assistance and strategic advice on particular industry or site organising projects, the training and development of officials and assistance to branches on planning and resourcing campaigns.
Industrial support including representation of individual member grievances, advice on legal and legislative matters, holding of union elections as provided for in the rules of the union, and responding to the needs of branches and members as provided for within the rules of the union, within the scope of any statuary or legal obligations.
The administration of federal awards, the certification of federal industrial agreements, the variation of awards following major test cases, and making application to vary federal awards on behalf of branches.
National media and communications to members, branches and the broader community via media releases in support of campaigns, web based technology, including the national magazine RTBU Worker.

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Coordination of and Negotiation of key national industries, and assistance to branches on bargaining by request.

The National Office has consulted with the ACTU on the development of claims to be pursued in the AIRC and union policy in The National office has consulted wit the ACTU on the development of claims to be pursued in the AIRC and union policy in general. Where appropriate, the National Office has assisted branches in the implementation of relevant decisions via the variation of awards.

The National Office has also been involved in lobbying and negotiations with different levels of Government and key industry organisations around issues of importance to ART&BIU members, eg training, skill shortage, fatigue management, vehicle design.

#### 2. Any Significant Changes in Activities

There were no amendments to the National rules during the reporting period.

3. Details of any Significant Changes in Financial Affairs

#### The financial affairs of the National Office have altered marginally due to the following:

- There being no major National Union Funded Campaigns for the period.
- There being no National Council required to be held during the 2008 Financial Year.
- The timing / receipt of Branch Capitation payments.
- The timing of payments for major National Union Affiliations.
- Lost Time expenses due the secondment of a National Organiser Infrastructure and the outsourcing of the National Union Accounts to the NSW Branch and the provision of Annual Leave Relief.

During the 2007-8 financial year, the National Office funded branches to implement mutually agreed growth projects and activities arising out of agreed branch projects and industrial campaigns.

4. Right of Members to Resign

All Members of the Union have the right to resign from the Union in accordance with Rule 14 of the Union Rules (and Section 174 of the Workplace Relations Act); namely by providing notice addressed and delivered to the Secretary of the relevant Branch, including via email.

# 14 - RESIGNATION FROM MEMBERSHIP

- (1) A member may resign from membership of the Union by written notice addressed and delivered to the Secretary of his/her Branch.
- (2) A notice of resignation from membership of the Union takes effect:-
  - (a) where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the Union:-
    - (i) on the day on which the notice is received by the Union; or
    - (ii) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member;

whichever is later; or

- (b) In any other case:-
  - (i) at the end of two weeks; or
  - (ii) on the day specified in the notice;

whichever is later.

- (3) Any subscriptions, fees, fines and levies owing but not paid by a former member of the Union in relation to a period before the member's resignation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the Union in a Court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the Union.
- (4) A notice delivered to the Branch Secretary shall be deemed to have been received by the Union when it was delivered.
- (5) A notice of resignation that has been received by the Union is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered to the Branch Secretary.
- (6) A resignation from membership of the Union is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this Rule, if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the Union that the resignation has been accepted.

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#### 174 Resignation from membership

(**1**) A member of an <u>organisation</u> may resign from membership by written notice addressed and delivered to a <u>person</u> designated for the purpose in the rules of the <u>organisation</u> or a branch of the <u>organisation</u>.

Note: The notice of resignation can be given electronically if the <u>organisation</u>'s rules allow for this (see <u>http://www.austlii.edu.au/au/legis/cth/consol\_act/eta1999256/s9.html</u> section 9 of the <u>Electronic</u> <u>Transactions Act 1999</u>).

(2) A notice of resignation from membership of an organisation takes effect:

(a) where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the <u>organisation</u>:

(i) on the day on which the notice is received by the organisation; or

(ii) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member;

whichever is later; or

(b) in any other case:

(i) at the end of 2 weeks, or such shorter period as is specified in the rules of the <u>organisation</u>, after the notice is received by the <u>organisation</u>; or

(ii) on the day specified in the notice;

whichever is later.

(3) Any dues payable but not paid by a former member of an <u>organisation</u>, in relation to a period before the member's resignation from the <u>organisation</u> took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the <u>organisation</u>, in a <u>court</u> of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the <u>organisation</u>.

(4) A notice delivered to the <u>person</u> mentioned in subsection (13) is taken to have been received by the <u>organisation</u> when it was delivered.

(5) A notice of resignation that has been received by the <u>organisation</u> is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered in accordance with subsection (12).

(6) A resignation from membership of an <u>organisation</u> is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this **esection** if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the <u>organisation</u> that the resignation has been accepted.

Note: Regulations may require <u>employers</u> who offer payroll deduction facilities to inform <u>employees</u> that cessation of payroll deduction by an <u>employee</u> does not constitute resignation (see **\*section\*** 359).

#### INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S STATEMENT

#### TO THE MEMBERS AUSTRALIAN RAIL, TRAM & BUS INDUSTRY UNION NATIONAL COUNCIL

#### Scope

We have audited the concise financial report of The Australian Rail, Tram & Bus Industry Union, National Council for the financial year ended 31 December, 2008 comprising the Committee of Management Statement, Income Statement, Balance Sheet, Statement of Cash Flows and notes to the financial statements. The Committee of Management is responsible for the financial report. We have conducted an independent audit of this financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the members.

Our audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance whether the concise financial report is free of material misstatement.

1. Principal Activities of the National Council

The principal activities of the National Council of the Union, as conducted through the National Office, during the past year fell into the following categories:

ACTIVITIES
Making agreements with employers
Implementation of the decisions of the National Executive and National Council
Implementation of the union's organising agenda, including direct assistance and strategic advice on particular industry or site organising projects, the training and development of officials and assistance to branches on planning and resourcing campaigns.
Industrial support including representation of individual member grievances, advice on legal and legislative matters, holding of union elections as provided for in the rules of the union, and responding to the needs of branches and members as provided for within the rules of the union, within the scope of any statuary or legal obligations.
The administration of federal awards, the certification of federal industrial agreements, the variation of awards following major test cases, and making application to vary federal awards on behalf of branches.
National media and communications to members, branches and the broader community via media releases in support of campaigns, web based technology, including the national magazine RTBU Worker.

Coordination of and Negotiation of key national industries, and assistance to branches on bargaining by request.

The National Office has consulted with the ACTU on the development of claims to be pursued in the AIRC and union policy in The National office has consulted wit the ACTU on the development of claims to be pursued in the AIRC and union policy in general. Where appropriate, the National Office has assisted branches in the implementation of relevant decisions via the variation of awards.

The National Office has also been involved in lobbying and negotiations with different levels of Government and key industry organisations around issues of importance to ART&BIU members, eg training, skill shortage, fatigue management, vehicle design.

# 2. Any Significant Changes in Activities

There were no amendments to the National rules during the reporting period.

# 3. "Details of any Significant Changes in Financial Affairs

# The financial affairs of the National Office have altered marginally due to the following:

- There being no major National Union Funded Campaigns for the period.
- There being no National Council required to be held during the 2008 Financial Year.
- The timing / receipt of Branch Capitation payments.
- The timing of payments for major National Union Affiliations.
- Lost Time expenses due the secondment of a National Organiser Infrastructure and the outsourcing of the National Union Accounts to the NSW Branch and the provision of Annual Leave Relief.

During the 2007-8 financial year, the National Office funded branches to implement mutually agreed growth projects and activities arising out of agreed branch projects and industrial campaigns.

# 4. Right of Members to Resign

All Members of the Union have the right to resign from the Union in accordance with Rule 14 of the Union Rules (and Section 174 of the Workplace Relations Act); namely by providing notice addressed and delivered to the Secretary of the relevant Branch, including via email.

# 14 - RESIGNATION FROM MEMBERSHIP

- (1) A member may resign from membership of the Union by written notice addressed and delivered to the Secretary of his/her Branch.
- (2) A notice of resignation from membership of the Union takes effect:-
  - (a) where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the Union:-
    - (i) on the day on which the notice is received by the Union; or
    - (ii) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member;

whichever is later; or

- (b) In any other case:-
  - (i) at the end of two weeks; or
  - (ii) on the day specified in the notice;

whichever is later.

- (3) Any subscriptions, fees, fines and levies owing but not paid by a former member of the Union in relation to a period before the member's resignation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the Union in a Court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the Union.
- (4) A notice delivered to the Branch Secretary shall be deemed to have been received by the Union when it was delivered.
- (5) A notice of resignation that has been received by the Union is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered to the Branch Secretary.
- (6) A resignation from membership of the Union is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this Rule, if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the Union that the resignation has been accepted.

# 174 Resignation from membership

(**1**3) A member of an <u>organisation</u> may resign from membership by written notice addressed and delivered to a <u>person</u> designated for the purpose in the rules of the <u>organisation</u> or a branch of the <u>organisation</u>.

Note: The notice of resignation can be given electronically if the <u>organisation</u>'s rules allow for this (see <u>http://www.austlii.edu.au/au/legis/cth/consol\_act/eta1999256/s9.html</u>\*section\* 9 of the <u>Electronic</u> <u>Transactions Act 1999</u>).

(2) A notice of resignation from membership of an organisation takes effect:

(a) where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the organisation:

(i) on the day on which the notice is received by the organisation; or

(ii) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member;

whichever is later; or

(b) in any other case:

(i) at the end of 2 weeks, or such shorter period as is specified in the rules of the <u>organisation</u>, after the notice is received by the <u>organisation</u>; or

(ii) on the day specified in the notice;

whichever is later.

(3) Any dues payable but not paid by a former member of an <u>organisation</u>, in relation to a period before the member's resignation from the <u>organisation</u> took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the <u>organisation</u>, in a <u>court</u> of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the <u>organisation</u>.

(4) A notice delivered to the <u>person</u> mentioned in subsection (13) is taken to have been received by the <u>organisation</u> when it was delivered.

(5) A notice of resignation that has been received by the <u>organisation</u> is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered in accordance with subsection (13).

(6) A resignation from membership of an <u>organisation</u> is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this **test in the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the <u>organisation</u> that the resignation has been accepted.** 

Note: Regulations may require <u>employers</u> who offer payroll deduction facilities to inform <u>employees</u> that cessation of payroll deduction by an <u>employee</u> does not constitute resignation (see **\*section** 359).

NOTE 1, STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards, including Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards(AIFRS), other mandatory professional reporting requirements and the Workplace Place Relations Act 1996.

The financial report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report:

(a) Property, Plant & Equipment.

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or at fair value less, where applicable any accumulated depreciation.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are included at fair value. The carrying amount is reviewed annually by the Committee of Management to ensure it is not in excess of recoverable amount.

#### Property for own use

Freehold land and buildings are measured on the fair value basis. being the amount for which an asset could be exchanged between knowledgeable willing parties in an arms length transaction. It is the policy of the entity to have periodic independent valuations, with annual appraisals being made by directors. The last independent valuation was as at 31 December 2005 carried out by Phillip R Barlow FAPI, Registered Valuer No 1251. The valuation of land and building was determined to be \$666,666. No adjustment for this valuation has been made in these accounts.

(b) Income Tax

No provision for income tax is necessary, as "Trade Unions" are exempt from income tax under Section 50 -15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(c) Employee Entitlements

Provision for employee entitlements in the form of Long Service Leave and Accrued Annual Leave has been made for the estimated accrued entitlement of all employees on the basis of their terms of employment. In the case of Long Service Leave, the accrual has been measured by reference to periods of service and current salary rates as it is

## Lodgment of Financial Statements and Accounts - Australian Rail, Tram and Bus Industry Union, National Office - for year ended 31 December 2008 (FR2008/580)

I refer to the abovementioned financial accounts and statements which were lodged with Fair Work Australia on 8 October 2009.

I believe that there are a couple of omissions from the documents lodged and thought it would be appropriate to write to you directly in the first instance for your comments, before filing the documents.

Firstly, the return did not include a "Statement of Changes in Equity" (or its alternative, a "Statement of Recognized Income and Expenditure"). I have been advised this is required under AASB101, and thus is required pursuant to s253(2)(a)(iv) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (formerly s253(2)(a)(iv) of the RAO Schedule).

I note that this statement was also omitted from the previous year's return and it was the Registry's oversight in not bringing this to the organization's attention at that time. Under the circumstances, I would simply ask that such a statement be prepared in future returns.

Secondly, although the return included both the concise and the full versions of the financial report, only one "Auditor's report" was attached. The Auditor's statement, at page 14, is a little ambiguous because the opening paragraphs under the heading "Scope" refer to the conduct of an audit of the concise report, and later paragraphs under the heading "Audit Opinions" refer to the "full audited general purpose financial report" and to the opinion "*express* (sic) *in that report*".

It is not clear whether a separate Audit report for the full version was prepared. If it was, then it was not lodged and should be lodged at the earliest possible opportunity so that it can be added to the documents already received.

The fact that s257 provides for an auditor's report of the general purpose financial report and s265(3) provides for an auditor's report of a concise report, means, I think, that the correct

To the extent that the effect of the wording on the Auditor's report at page 14 is that the concise report complies because it is consistent with the full report, the deficiency may be more in form than substance, but I respectfully draw this to your attention for rectification in future years.

I would appreciate your advice whether you foresee any difficulties regarding the above, and I will defer filing the documents pending your advice.

## 1. Principal Activities of the National Council

The principal activities of the National Council of the Union, as conducted through the National Office, during the past year fell into the following categories:

Implementation of the union's organising agenda, including direct assistance and strategic advice on particular industry or site organising projects, the training and development of officials and assistance to branches on planning and resourcing campaigns.

National media and communications to members, branches and the broader community via media releases in support of campaigns, web based technology, including the national magazine RTBU Worker.

Coordination of and Negotiation of key national industries, and assistance to branches on bargaining by request.

The National Office has consulted with the ACTU on the development of claims to be pursued in the AIRC and union policy in The National office has consulted wit the ACTU on the development of claims to be pursued in the AIRC and union policy in general. Where appropriate, the National Office has assisted branches in the implementation of relevant decisions via the variation of awards.

The National Office has also been involved in lobbying and negotiations with different levels of Government and key industry organisations around issues of importance to ART&BIU members, eg training, skill shortage, fatigue management, vehicle design.

## 2. Any Significant Changes in Activities

There were no amendments to the National rules during the reporting period.

3. Details of any Significant Changes in Financial Affairs

## The financial affairs of the National Office have altered marginally due to the following:

- There being no major National Union Funded Campaigns for the period.
- There being no National Council required to be held during the 2008 Financial Year.
- The timing / receipt of Branch Capitation payments.
- The timing of payments for major National Union Affiliations.
- Lost Time expenses due the secondment of a National Organiser Infrastructure and the outsourcing of the National Union Accounts to the NSW Branch and the provision of Annual Leave Relief.

During the 2007- 8 financial year, the National Office funded branches to implement mutually agreed growth projects and activities arising out of agreed branch projects and industrial campaigns.

## 4. Right of Members to Resign

All Members of the Union have the right to resign from the Union in accordance with Rule 14 of the Union Rules (and Section 174 of the Workplace Relations Act); namely by providing notice addressed and delivered to the Secretary of the relevant Branch, including via email.

## 14 - RESIGNATION FROM MEMBERSHIP

- (1) A member may resign from membership of the Union by written notice addressed and delivered to the Secretary of his/her Branch.
- (2) A notice of resignation from membership of the Union takes effect:-
  - (a) where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the Union:-
    - (i) on the day on which the notice is received by the Union; or
    - (ii) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member;

whichever is later; or

- (b) In any other case:-
  - (i) at the end of two weeks; or
  - (ii) on the day specified in the notice;

whichever is later.

- (3) Any subscriptions, fees, fines and levies owing but not paid by a former member of the Union in relation to a period before the member's resignation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the Union in a Court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the Union.
- (4) A notice delivered to the Branch Secretary shall be deemed to have been received by the Union when it was delivered.
- (5) A notice of resignation that has been received by the Union is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered to the Branch Secretary.
- (6) A resignation from membership of the Union is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this Rule, if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the Union that the resignation has been accepted.

## 174 Resignation from membership

(**1**3) A member of an <u>organisation</u> may resign from membership by written notice addressed and delivered to a <u>person</u> designated for the purpose in the rules of the <u>organisation</u> or a branch of the <u>organisation</u>.

Note: The notice of resignation can be given electronically if the <u>organisation</u>'s rules allow for this (see <u>http://www.austlii.edu.au/au/legis/cth/consol\_act/eta1999256/s9.html</u>\*section 9 of the <u>Electronic</u> <u>Transactions Act 1999</u>).

(2) A notice of resignation from membership of an organisation takes effect:

(a) where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the organisation:

(i) on the day on which the notice is received by the organisation; or

(ii) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member;

whichever is later; or

(b) in any other case:

(i) at the end of 2 weeks, or such shorter period as is specified in the rules of the <u>organisation</u>, after the notice is received by the <u>organisation</u>; or

(ii) on the day specified in the notice;

whichever is later.

(3) Any dues payable but not paid by a former member of an <u>organisation</u>, in relation to a period before the member's resignation from the <u>organisation</u> took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the <u>organisation</u>, in a <u>court</u> of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the <u>organisation</u>.

(4) A notice delivered to the <u>person</u> mentioned in subsection (1) is taken to have been received by the <u>organisation</u> when it was delivered.

(5) A notice of resignation that has been received by the <u>organisation</u> is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered in accordance with subsection (1).

## Operating Report

This Operating Report covers:

## 1 Principal Activities of the National Council

The principal activities of the National Council of the Union, as conducted through the National Office, during the past year fell into the following categories:

## ACTIVITIES

Making agreements with employers

Implementation of the decisions of the National Executive and National Council

Implementation of the union's organising agenda, including direct assistance and strategic advice on particular industry or site organising projects, the training and development of officials and assistance to branches on planning and resourcing campaigns.

Industrial support including representation of individual member grievances, advice on legal and legislative matters, holding of union elections as provided for in the rules of the union, and responding to the needs of branches and members as provided for within the rules of the union, within the scope of any statuary or legal obligations.

The administration of federal awards, the certification of federal industrial agreements, the variation of awards following major test cases, and making application to vary federal awards on behalf of branches.

National media and communications to members, branches and the broader community via media releases in support of campaigns, web based technology, including the national magazine RTBU Worker.

Coordination of and Negotiation of key national industries, and assistance to branches on bargaining by request.

The National Office has consulted with the ACTU on the development of claims to be pursued in the AIRC and union policy in The National office has consulted wit the ACTU on the development of claims to be pursued in the AIRC and union policy in general. Where appropriate, the National Office has assisted branches in the implementation of relevant decisions via the variation of awards.

The National Office has also been involved in lobbying and negotiations with different levels of Government and key industry organisations around issues of importance to ART&BIU members, eg training, skill shortage, fatigue management, vehicle design.

## 2. Any Significant Changes in Activities

There were no amendments to the National rules during the reporting period.

## 3 Details of any Significant Changes in Financial Affairs

# The financial affairs of the National Office have altered marginally due to the following:

- There being no major National Union Funded Campaigns for the period.
- There being no National Council required to be held during the 2008 Financial Year.
- The timing / receipt of Branch Capitation payments.
- The timing of payments for major National Union Affiliations.
- Lost Time expenses due the secondment of a National Organiser Infrastructure and the outsourcing of the National Union Accounts to the NSW Branch and the provision of Annual Leave Relief.

During the 2007- 8 financial year, the National Office funded branches to implement mutually agreed growth projects and activities arising out of agreed branch projects and industrial campaigns.

4. Right of Members to Resign

All Members of the Union have the right to resign from the Union in accordance with Rule 14 of the Union Rules (and Section 174 of the Workplace Relations Act); namely by providing notice addressed and delivered to the Secretary of the relevant Branch, including via email.

## 14 - RESIGNATION FROM MEMBERSHIP

- (1) A member may resign from membership of the Union by written notice addressed and delivered to the Secretary of his/her Branch.
- (2) A notice of resignation from membership of the Union takes effect:-
  - (a) where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the Union:-
    - (i) on the day on which the notice is received by the Union; or
    - (ii) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member;

whichever is later; or

- (b) In any other case:-
  - (i) at the end of two weeks; or
  - (ii) on the day specified in the notice;

whichever is later.

- (3) Any subscriptions, fees, fines and levies owing but not paid by a former member of the Union in relation to a period before the member's resignation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the Union in a Court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the Union.
- (4) A notice delivered to the Branch Secretary shall be deemed to have been received by the Union when it was delivered.
- (5) A notice of resignation that has been received by the Union is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered to the Branch Secretary.
- (6) A resignation from membership of the Union is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this Rule, if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the Union that the resignation has been accepted.

## 174 Resignation from membership

(\*1\*) A member of an <u>organisation</u> may resign from membership by written notice addressed and delivered to a <u>person</u> designated for the purpose in the rules of the <u>organisation</u> or a branch of the <u>organisation</u>.

Note: The notice of resignation can be given electronically if the <u>organisation</u>'s rules allow for this (see **\*section**\* 9 of the <u>Electronic Transactions Act 1999</u>).

- (2) A notice of resignation from membership of an organisation takes effect:
  - (a) where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the <u>organisation</u>:
    - (i) on the day on which the notice is received by the organisation: or

(ii) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member;

whichever is later; or

(b) in any other case:

(i) at the end of 2 weeks, or such shorter period as is specified in the rules of the <u>organisation</u>, after the notice is received by the <u>organisation</u>; or

(ii) on the day specified in the notice;

whichever is later.

(3) Any dues payable but not paid by a former member of an <u>organisation</u>, in relation to a period before the member's resignation from the <u>organisation</u> took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the <u>organisation</u>, in a <u>court</u> of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the <u>organisation</u>.

(4) A notice delivered to the <u>person</u> mentioned in subsection (\*1\*) is taken to have been received by the <u>organisation</u> when it was delivered.

(5) A notice of resignation that has been received by the <u>organisation</u> is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered in accordance with subsection (13).

(6) A resignation from membership of an <u>organisation</u> is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this **\$section\$** if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the <u>organisation</u> that the resignation has been accepted.

Note: Regulations may require <u>employers</u> who offer payroll deduction facilities to inform <u>employees</u> that cessation of payroll deduction by an <u>employee</u> does not constitute resignation (see **\*** section **\*** 359).

#### NOTE 1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards, including Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards(AIFRS), other mandatory professional reporting requirements and the Workplace Place Relations Act 1996.

The financial report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report:

(a) Property, Plant & Equipment.

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or at fair value less, where applicable any accumulated depreciation.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are included at fair value. The carrying amount is reviewed annually by the Committee of Management to ensure it is not in excess of recoverable amount.

#### Property for own use

Freehold land and buildings are measured on the fair value basis. being the amount for which an asset could be exchanged between knowledgeable willing parties in an arms length transaction. It is the policy of the entity to have periodic independent valuations, with annual appraisals being made by directors. The last independent valuation was as at 31 December 2005 carried out by Phillip R Barlow FAPI, Registered Valuer No 1251. The valuation of land and building was determined to be \$666,666. No adjustment for this valuation has been made in these accounts.

(b) Income Tax

No provision for income tax is necessary, as "Trade Unions" are exempt from income tax under Section 50 -15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(c) Employee Entitlements

Provision for employee entitlements in the form of Long Service Leave and Accrued Annual Leave has been made for the estimated accrued entitlement of all employees on the basis of their terms of employment. In the case of Long Service Leave, the accrual has been measured by reference to periods of service and current salary rates as it is
