# Re: Lodgment of Financial Accounts and Statements – Australian Rail, Tram and Bus Industry Union, NSW Branch – for year ending 31 December 2009 (FR2009/10322)

Thank you for lodging the above statements and accounts which were received by Fair Work Australia on 8 July 2010.

I draw your attention to the list of details of donations exceeding \$1,000 at the conclusion of the full report. Section 237 of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* sets out the particulars that must be lodged in a statement for all donations exceeding \$1,000. I set out below the relevant extracts from s237.

(1) An organisation must, within 90 days after the end of each financial year (or such longer period as the Registrar allows), lodge in the Industrial Registry a statement showing the relevant particulars in relation to each loan, grant or donation of an amount exceeding \$1,000 made by the organisation during the financial year.

(2) A statement lodged in the Industrial Registry under subsection (1) must be signed by an officer of the organisation.

(6) The relevant particulars, in relation to a grant or donation made by an organisation, are:

(a) the amount of the grant or donation; and

(b) the purpose for which the grant or donation was made; and

(c) except where the grant or donation was made to relieve a member of the organisation, or a dependant of a member of the organisation, from severe financial hardship—the name and address of the person to whom the grant or donation was made.

The list received was not signed and did not include the addresses of the donation recipients.

I will file the return as lodged, but would ask that in future years, a separate s237 statement be prepared and lodged, showing all the prescribed particulars. Section 237 Statements are filed separately and not on the public record.





# 44 DETAILS OF ANY MONTHCANT CHANCES IN FINANCIAL 2009

Significant changes in the Rail, Tram & Bus Union (RTBU) NSW Branch financial affairs (See ATTACHMENT A: FINANCIAL REPORT) included:

- an increase in accumulated funds of \$3,000,528 for the operating year to 31 December 2009;
- an increase in membership contributions of \$441,854 for the operating year to 31 December 2009; and
- an increase in the following union fees:
  - > \$7.75 per week to \$8.15 for all Rail Divisions;
  - ▶ \$10.00 per week to \$10.40 for Locomotive Division.
  - > There were no changes in membership fees for the Bus & Tram Division.

# **Other Relevant Information**

• The Rail, Tram & Bus Union (RTBU) NSW Branch also managed the New Generation Holiday Camp at Jervis Bay on behalf of the union and its members. (See ATTACHMENT A: FINANCIAL REPORT).

All members of the RTBU (NSW) have the right to resign from the union in accordance with *Rule 14, Resignation from Membership*, of the Rules of the Rail Tram and Bus Industry Union as set out below:

# 14 - RESIGNATION FROM MEMBERSHIP

- (1) A member may resign from membership of the Union by written notice addressed and delivered to the Secretary of his/her Branch.
- (2) A notice of resignation from membership of the Union takes effect:-
  - (a) where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the Union:-
    - (i) on the day on which the notice is received by the Union; or
    - (ii) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member;

whichever is later; or

- (b) In any other case:-
  - (i) at the end of two weeks; or
  - (ii) on the day specified in the notice;

whichever is later.

- (3) Any subscriptions, fees, fines and levies owing but not paid by a former member of the Union in relation to a period before the member's resignation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the Union in a Court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the Union.
- (4) A notice delivered to the Branch Secretary shall be deemed to have been received by the Union when it was delivered.
- (5) A notice of resignation that has been received by the Union is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered to the Branch Secretary.
- (6) A resignation from membership of the Union is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this Rule, if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the Union that the resignation has been accepted.

#### NOTE 1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards, including Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards(AIFRS), other mandatory professional reporting requirements, the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 and the Industrial Relations Act, 1996. The financial report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report:

(a) Property, Plant & Equipment.

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or at fair value less, where applicable any accumulated depreciation.

Plant and equipment

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Plant and equipment are included at cost. The carrying amount is reviewed annually by the Committee of Management to ensure it is not in excess of recoverable amount.

#### Property for own use

Freehold land and buildings are measured on the fair value basis. being the amount for which an asset could be exchanged between knowledgeable willing parties in an arms length transaction. It is the policy of the entity to have periodic independent valuations, with annual appraisals being made by directors. The last independent valuations were carried out between 13 October 2009 and 19 November 2009.

#### Investment property

Property held to earn rental income is separately disclosed from property held for own use. This is a change in accounting policy from the previous year and has been retrospectively applied. Investment properties are measured on the fair value basis. As with property held for own use, it is the policy of the entity to have periodic independent valuations, with annual appraisals being made by directors. The last independent valuation of Investment properties was as at 28 September 2009.

The change in fair value of investment properties are recorded in the income statement. No depreciation is provided where the fair value basis is used.

#### (b) Income Tax

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No provision for income tax is necessary, as "Trade Unions" are exempt from income tax under Section 50 -15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(c) Employee Entitlements

Provision for employee entitlements in the form of Long Service Leave and Accrued Annual Leave has been made for the estimated accrued entitlement of all employees on the basis of their terms of employment. In the case of Long Service Leave, the accrual has been measured by reference to periods of service and current salary rates as it is considered that this results in an amount not materially different to that achieved by discounting estimated future cash flows.

(d) Defined Superannuation Schemes

In respect to defined benefit plans, the cost of providing the benefits is determined using the projected unit cost method. Actuarial calculations are conducted by State Super. The amount recognised in the Statement of Financial Position represents the present value of the defined benefits obligations adjusted for any unrecognised actuarial gains and losses and unrecognised past service costs less the fair value of the plan's assets. The unions has defined benefit obligations for members participating in the State Authorities Superannuation Scheme and the State Authorities Non- Contributory Superannuation Scheme. All Schemes are closed to new members.

(e) Contributions

Only contributions received are brought to account. Contribution received subsequent to year end, but relating to prior to year end are brought to account as receivables.

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

ST DETAILS OF THE RIGHTS OF MEMBERSTIO RESIGN AFFAIRS

All members of the RTBU (NSW) have the right to resign from the union in accordance with *Rule 14, Resignation from Membership*, of the Rules of the Rail Tram and Bus Industry Union as set out below:

#### 14 - RESIGNATION FROM MEMBERSHIP

- (1) A member may resign from membership of the Union by written notice addressed and delivered to the Secretary of his/her Branch.
- (2) A notice of resignation from membership of the Union takes effect:-
  - (a) where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the Union:-
    - (i) on the day on which the notice is received by the Union; or
    - (ii) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member;

whichever is later; or

- (b) In any other case:-
  - (i) at the end of two weeks; or
  - (ii) on the day specified in the notice;

whichever is later.

- (3) Any subscriptions, fees, fines and levies owing but not paid by a former member of the Union in relation to a period before the member's resignation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the Union in a Court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the Union.
- (4) A notice delivered to the Branch Secretary shall be deemed to have been received by the Union when it was delivered.
- (5) A notice of resignation that has been received by the Union is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered to the Branch Secretary.
- (6) A resignation from membership of the Union is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this Rule, if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the Union that the resignation has been accepted.

(b) s265(5) which requires you to publish or otherwise *provide your members with completed/signed copies* of the audited accounts, report and statements before final presentation and lodgment; and

(c) s266 which requires you to <u>present the completed documents to an eligible meeting(s)</u> (either of the members or of the committee, whichever applies). Note that this meeting (or series of meetings) is distinct from any initial committee meeting convened to prepare, sign or otherwise approve pre-audited documents.
