Australian Rail, Tram and Bus Industry Union – New South Wales Branch Financial Report for the year ended 31 December 2013 - FR2013/506

I acknowledge receipt of the financial report for the year ended 31 December 2013 for the Australian Rail, Tram and Bus Industry Union – New South Wales Branch (the reporting unit). The financial report was lodged with Fair Work Commission (FWC) on 2 July 2014.

On the 1 August 2014, Ms Rebecca Lee from the FWC raised a concern with your Auditor, Mr Ken Mangraviti, in relation to whether the lodged financial report is that of the reporting unit or that of a separate legal entity registered in the state jurisdiction, i.e. The Australian Rail, Tram and Bus Industry Union, New South Wales. It was confirmed that the financial report lodged as being relevant for the Federally registered branch was identical to the financial report lodged as being relevant to the State registered Association.

My letter dated 9 December 2014 provided information in relation to s.269 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 (RO Act) and a request for information on the progress in determining which entity the financial statement lodged on 2 July 2014 belonged to. You provided an update on progress on 16 December 2014. This was further supported by your correspondence dated 28 January 2015, where you identified all the steps the reporting unit had taken, including engaging the auditing firm, Grant Thornton, to assist in this process.

On 20 April 2014 you provided the report and finding from Grant Thornton based on their review and investigation into the structure of the federal and state registered bodies.

The financial report for the year ended 31 December 2014 for the reporting unit was lodged with the FWC on the 1 July 2014. I note that the findings from the Grant Thornton report have been addressed and remedied in this financial report, including the required prior period adjustments.

After assessing the financial report lodged for the reporting period ended 31 December 2014, I am satisfied that the reporting unit has separated the assets and liabilities of the federally registered New South Wales Branch of the Australian Rail, Tram and Bus Industry Union and the state registered entity and this process has been appropriately disclosed in the financial report. Due to this I am allowing this report to be closed.

Reporting Requirements

On the FWC website a number of factsheets in relation to the financial reporting process and associated timelines are available. The most recent copy of the Reporting Guidelines and a model set of financial statements can also be found. The FWC recommends reporting units use this model as it will assist in ensuring compliance with the RO Act, the s.253 Reporting

RE: ARTBU, NSW Branch Financial Report for year ended 31 December 2013

I write to confirm progress as promised in my email Tuesday, 16th December 2014 and to confirm our telephone conversations held since and in particular the one we had on Friday, 23rd January 2015, the steps we have taken are as follows;

- 1. Notified key staff and advised them that we needed to address issues raised in your letter of 9 December 2014 and to prioritise the work.
- 2. Sought legal advice through the national office
- 3. Received the legal advice on the 19th December where the conclusion was reached that the report submitted did not meet the requirements of the RO act and steps should be taken to ensure compliance.
- 4. It was decided that we should get assistance by way of having an independent review of Rail, Tram & Bus Union Financial Processes.
- 5. On the 2nd of January, I wrote formally to Grant Thornton requesting assistance and provided them with full authority to conduct the investigation under the supervision of the Assistant National Secretary Allan Barden as I would be on Annual Leave during January.
- 6. On the 13th January, I received a letter of engagement from Grant Thornton.
- 7. On the 16th January, I emailed acknowledgement to the letter of engagement and asked them to commence work as soon as possible.
- 8. In the week commencing 19th January, work has commenced with the gathering of relevant materials, and interviews with key staff took place on the 23rd January.

Whilst I cannot confirm a date as to when everything will be in order, I have requested that a brief summary report be provided by Grant Thornton for our Audit & Compliance Committee which is scheduled for Monday, 9th February 2015.

I trust that the above meets your expectations and I would again like to reiterate that we are taking this matter seriously and we will do whatever is necessary to ensure that our processes are complaint, so please don't not hesitate to contact me if you have any concerns.

Australian Rail, Tram and Bus Industry Union, New South Wales Branch Financial Report for the year ended 31 December 2013 [FR2013/506]

I acknowledge receipt of the financial report of the Australian Rail, Tram and Bus Industry Union, New South Wales Branch (the Branch). The documents were lodged with the Fair Work Commission (the Commission) on 2 July 2014.

Following an initial examination of the financial report by staff of the Commission, your auditor, Mr Ken Mangraviti, confirmed that it purports to be the report of both the New South Wales Branch of the Australian Rail, Tram and Bus Industry Union and the Australian Rail, Tram and Bus Industry Union, New South Wales.

It appears that this arrangement is not consistent with the organisation's obligations under the relevant legislation.

The Australian Rail, Tram and Bus Industry Union (ARTBIU) is registered under the *Fair Work* (*Registered Organisations*) *Act 2009* (RO Act). Upon registration under the RO Act, the ARTBIU obtained legal status as a body corporate (see section 27 of the RO Act). The New South Wales Branch exists as an integral and inseverable part of the ARTBIU (see *Williams v Hursey* (1959) 103 CLR 30 per Fullagar J). Section 242(3) of the RO Act deems the Branch to be a "reporting unit" of the organisation. As a reporting unit, the Branch has various financial reporting obligations imposed on it by Part 3 of Chapter 8 of the RO Act. Nonetheless, the Branch remains a constituent part of the body corporate.

The Australian Rail, Tram and Bus Industry Union, New South Wales appears to be registered under the *Industrial Relations Act 1996 (NSW)*. Upon registration, it obtained legal status within the New South Wales state system as a body corporate (see section 222 of the *Industrial Relations Act 1996 (NSW)*).

As such, we conclude that the Australian Rail, Tram and Bus Industry Union and the Australian Rail, Tram and Bus Industry Union, New South Wales are separate legal entities with independent financial obligations (see *Re McJannet; Ex Parte Minister for Employment, Training and Industrial Relations* (1995) 184 CLR 620).

If, in fact, the financial affairs of the Branch are encompassed by the Australian Rail, Tram and Bus Industry Union, New South Wales, the Branch may be entitled to a certificate under s.269 of the RO Act, which would enable it to lodge a copy of the state association's accounts with the Commission. Section 269 is set out below:

269 Reporting units with substantial common membership with State registered bodies

- (1) This section applies to a reporting unit if there is an industrial association (the **associated State body**) that:
 - (a) is registered or recognised as such an association (however described) under a prescribed State Act; and
 - (b) is, or purports to be, composed of substantially the same members as the reporting unit; and
 - (c) has, or purports to have, officers who are substantially the same as designated officers in relation to the reporting unit.
- (2) A reporting unit is taken to have satisfied this Part if this section applies to the reporting unit and:
 - (a) the General Manager, on the application of the reporting unit, issues a certificate stating that the financial affairs of the reporting unit are encompassed by the financial affairs of the associated State body; and
 - (b) the associated State body has, in accordance with prescribed State legislation, prepared accounts, had those accounts audited, provided a copy of the audited accounts to its members and lodged the audited accounts with the relevant State authority; and
 - (c) the reporting unit has lodged a copy of the audited accounts with the FWC; and
 - (d) any members of the reporting unit who are not also members of the associated State body have been provided with copies of the accounts at substantially the same time as the members of the reporting unit who are members of the associated State body; and
 - (e) a report under section 254 has been prepared in respect of the activities of the reporting unit and has been provided to members of the reporting unit with the copies of the accounts.

Please note that if the Branch does not meet the criteria set out above, in future it must lodge a full financial report that sets out the income, expenditure, assets, liabilities, etc of the Branch, rather than the entity registered under the New South Wales legislation.

Please advise the Commission by Tuesday 16 December 2014 whether you have determined which entity the financial statements lodged on 2 July 2014 belong to. If it is determined that the financial statements belong to the Australian Rail, Tram and Bus Industry Union, New South Wales, please advice whether you intend to lodge future financial statements under s.269 of the RO Act.

ANY SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN ACTIVITIES

The principle activities of the Branch during the year were that of a registered trade union and no significant change occurred in the nature of those activities.

DETAILS OF ANY SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN FINANCIAL AFFAIRS

The RTBU NSW financial affairs are summarised below; (for more information see attachment A: Financial Report)

The significant decrease in accumulated funds was a result of the legal transfer of the Redfern Property, transferred to National Office. Before the loss from the transfer, the RTBU NSW had operating surplus of \$1,201,781. This surplus resulted in :

- a increase in current assets of \$1,010,727 for the operating year to 31 December 2013;
- an increase in total income of \$26,025 for the operating year to 31 December 2013;
- an decrease in total expenses of \$574,119 for the operating year to 31 December 2013, which was a result of several factors including a significant reduction in the amount required to fund defined benefits superannuation entitlements: and
- Member contribution remained stable

OTHER RELEVANT INFORMATION

 The RTBU NSW also managed the RTBU Holiday Park at Jervis Bay on behalf of the union and its members.

Report on the Financial Report

We have audited the general purpose financial report of the Australian Rail, Tram and Bus Industry Union, New South Wales Branch and of The Australian Rail, Tram and Bus Industry Union, New South Wales which comprises the statement of financial position as at 31 December 2013, statements of financial performance, statement of changes in accumulated funds and statement of cash flows for the year ended on that date, a statement of significant accounting policies, the Committee of Management's Statement and Certificate by Accounting Office (State organisation only).

Committee of Management Responsibility

The Committee of Management are responsible for the preparation and true and fair presentation of the financial report in accordance with the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 and the Industrial Relations Act 1996, and for such internal control as the committee determines is necessary to enable the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and selecting appropriate accounting policies as stated in Note 1 to the financial report.

Audit Approach

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. We conduct our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. These auditing Standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free from misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the directors, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion

NOTE 1 - STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statement is a general purpose financial statement that has been prepared in accordance with Australia Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB), other mandatory professional reporting requirements, the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 and the Industrial Relations Act 1996.

The financial report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report:

(a) Property, Plant & Equipment.

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or at fair value less, where applicable any accumulated depreciation.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are included at cost. The carrying amount is reviewed annually by the Committee of Management to ensure it is not in excess of recoverable amount.

Property for own use

Freehold land and buildings are measured on the fair value basis, being the amount for which an asset could be exchanged between knowledgeable willing parties in an arm's length transaction. It is the policy of the entity to have periodic independent valuations, with annual appraisals being made by the committee. The last independent valuations were carried out on 18 March 2014 and the committee have approved these revaluations at 31 Dec 2013, except for Sussex Inlet which was revaluated on 19 November 2009.

Investment property

Property held to earn rental income is separately disclosed from property held for own use. Investment properties are measured on the fair value basis. As with property held for own use, it is the policy of the entity to have periodic independent valuations, with annual appraisals being made by directors. The change in fair value of investment properties are recorded in the income statement. No depreciation is provided where the fair value basis is used.

(b) Income Tax

No provision for income tax is necessary, as "Trade Unions" are exempt from income tax under Section 50.1 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(c) Employee Entitlements

Provision for employee entitlements in the form of Long Service Leave and Accrued Annual Leave has been made for the estimated accrued entitlement of all employees on the basis of their terms of employment. In the case of Long Service Leave, the accrual has been measured by reference to periods of service and current salary rates as it is considered that this results in an amount not materially different to that achieved by discounting estimated future cash flows.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS For the Year Ended 31st December 2013

(d) Defined Superannuation Schemes

In respect to defined benefit plans, the cost of providing the benefits is determined using the projected unit cost method. Actuarial calculations are conducted by State Super. The amount recognised in the Statement of Financial Position represents the present value of the defined benefits obligations adjusted for any unrecognised actuarial gains and losses and unrecognised past service costs less the fair value of the plan's assets. The unions has defined benefit obligations for members participating in the State Authorities Superannuation Scheme and the State Authorities Non- Contributory Superannuation Scheme. All Schemes are closed to new members.

(e) Member Contributions and Levies

Member contributions and levies are recognized on an accrued basis and recorded as revenue in the year in which it relates.

(f) Comparative

When required by Accounting Standards and the Fair Work (Registered Organisation) Act 2009, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.

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DETAILS OF ANY SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN FINANCIAL AFFAIRS

The RTBU NSW financial affairs are summarised below; (for more information see attachment A: Financial Report)

The significant decrease in accumulated funds was a result of the legal transfer of the Redfern Property, transferred to National Office. Before the loss from the transfer, the RTBU NSW had operating surplus of \$1,201,781. This surplus resulted in:

- a increase in current assets of \$1,010,727 for the operating year to 31 December 2013;
- an increase in total income of \$26,025 for the operating year to 31 December 2013;
- an decrease in total expenses of \$574,119 for the operating year to 31 December 2013, which
 was a result of several factors including a significant reduction in the amount required to fund
 defined benefits superannuation entitlements: and
- Member contribution remained stable

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DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS OF THE FINANCIAL FACTORS

This discussion and analysis is provided to members in understanding the concise financial report.

Statements of Comprehensive Income

The loss for the year as reported was \$1,654,017, which includes a loss of \$2,602,742 from the legal transfer of the Redfern Property to National Office to reflect legal advice during the year, and a loss of \$253,056 from the revaluation of real properties. The result from the other activities for the year was a surplus of \$1,201,781 which is due to

- An overall reduction in employee expenses
- A surplus in the amount required to fund defined benefits superannuation exposure, and
- · An increase in the legal levy

Statement of Financial Position

Total assets reduced by \$1,872,616, however after adjustment for the legal transfer of the Redfern property and the revaluation of other real property referred to above, other assets increased by \$983,182 being mainly an increase in cash on hand and bank of \$1,030,242

Liabilities reduced by \$218,599 due mainly to amount required to fund defined benefits superannuation exposure which decreased by \$472,754 which was a reflection of an improvement in the financial markets impact on the defined benefit funds.

Members Accumulated Funds decreased by \$1,640,017.

Statement of Cash Flows

As noted above the cash flow increased by \$1,030,242 and if a reflection of the net cash received from operations of \$1,299,680 less expenditure on property improvements, in particular the Newcastle Office.
