### Report on the financial report

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2011

### Note 1: Statement of Accounting Policies

Australian Road Transport Industrial Organisation (NSW Branch) is a reporting unit of the federally registered Australian Road Transport Industrial Organisation.

#### Reporting Basis and Conventions

The committee members have prepared the financial statements on the basis that the Branch is a reporting entity and this is therefore a general purpose financial report. This financial report has been prepared in order to meet the requirements of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009. ("the RO Act").

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the mandatory Australian Accounting Standards applicable to entities reporting under the RO Act and the significant accounting policies disclosed below which the committee members have determined are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs unless otherwise stated in the notes. The material accounting policies that have been adopted in preparation of this report are detailed below.

#### (a) Receivables

All trade debtors are recognised at the amounts receivable as they are due for settlement no more than 30 days from the date of recognition. Collectability of trade debtors is reviewed on an ongoing basis. Debts which are known to be uncollectible are written off. A provision for doubtful debts is raised where some doubt as to collection exists.

#### (b) Income Tax

The Branch is exempt from the payment of income tax under Subdivision 50 of the income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as it is an income tax exempt entity.

# (c) Cash and Gash Equivalents

For purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes deposits at call that are readily convertible to cash on hand and which are used in the cash management function on a day-to-day basis.

#### (d) Revenue Recognition

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is recorded in the period to which it relates, except for sponsorships which are recognised on a cash basis.

Income from other sources is recognised when the fee in respect of other products or services provided is receivable.

Note 1: Statement of Accounting Policies (Continued)

(e) Goods & Services Tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office or is GST-free. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of an item of the revenue or expense. Receivables and payables in the Balance Sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2011

#### Note 1: Statement of Accounting Policies

Australian Road Transport Industrial Organisation (NSW Branch) is a reporting unit of the federally registered Australian Road Transport Industrial Organisation.

#### Reporting Basis and Conventions

The committee members have prepared the financial statements on the basis that the Branch is a reporting entity and this is therefore a general purpose financial report. This financial report has been prepared in order to meet the requirements of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009. ("the RO Act").

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the mandatory Australian Accounting Standards applicable to entitles reporting under the RO Act and the eignificant accounting policies disclosed below which the committee members have determined are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs unless otherwise stated in the notes. The material accounting policies that have been adopted in preparation of this report are detailed below.

#### (a) Receivables

All trade debtors are recognised at the amounts receivable as they are due for settlement no more than 30 days from the date of recognition. Collectability of trade debtors is reviewed on an ongoing basis. Debts which are known to be uncollectible are written off. A provision for doubtful debts is raised where some doubt as to collection exists.

#### (b) income Tax

The Branch is exempt from the payment of income tax under Subdivision 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as it is an income tax exempt entity.

### (c) Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes deposits at call that are readily convertible to cash on hand and which are used in the cash management function on a day-to-day basis.

### (d) Revenue Recognition

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is recorded in the period to which it relates, except for sponsorships which are recognised on a cash basis.

Income from other sources is recognised when the fee in respect of other products or services provided is receivable.

(a) Goods & Services Tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office or is GST-free. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of an item of the revenue or expense. Receivables and payables in the Balance Sheet are shown inclusive of GST.
