Australian Road Transport Industrial Organisation Queensland Branch Financial Report for the year ended 30 June 2012 - [FR2012/322]

I acknowledge receipt of the financial report of the Australian Road Transport Industrial Organisation, Queensland Branch (the reporting unit). The documents were lodged with Fair Work Australia on 19 December 2012. I acknowledge receipt of supplementary information from your auditor, Mr Norman Hoare, on 8 November 2013.

The financial report has now been filed. This financial report was filed based on a preliminary review.

Please note that the reporting unit financial report for the year ending 30 June 2013 may be subject to a full compliance audit.

I make the following comments to assist you when you next prepare a financial report. You are not required to take any further action in respect of the report lodged. The Fair Work Commission will confirm these concerns have been addressed prior to filing next year's report.

Revenue recognition

The accounting standard AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements paragraph 117 and ASSB 118: Revenue paragraph 35(a) requires that the entity must disclose the measurement basis or bases used in recognising revenue.

The accounting policy for grants received has not been disclosed.

Changes to the legislation and reporting guidelines

I note with the change of legislation, references to Fair Work Australia will need to be updated to the Fair Work Commission.

Additionally, a third edition to the General Manager's s.253 reporting guidelines was gazetted on 26 June 2013. These guidelines will apply to all financial reports that end on or after 30 June 2013. Fair Work Commission has also developed a model set of financial statement for the 2012-2013 financial year. There is no requirement to use this model but it may be a useful resource to ensure compliance with the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009, the s.253 reporting guidelines and the Australian Accounting Standards.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE 2012

NOTE 1 STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the requirements of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009.

The financial report covers the Australian Road Transport Industrial Organisation Queensland Branch as an individual entity. The Australian Road Transport Industrial Organisation Queensland Branch is a union operating in Queensland under the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting polices adopted by the entity in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(a) Income Tax

No liability exists for income tax as the Association is exempt from income tax under section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

NOTE 2: INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED TO MEMBERS OR THE GENERAL MANAGER OF FAIR WORK AUSTRALIA

In accordance with the requirements of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of Section 272 of Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 which read as follows:

- A member of a reporting unit, or the General Manager of Fair Work Australia, may apply to the reporting unit for specified prescribed information in relation to the reporting unit to be made available to the person making the application.
- 2) The application must be in writing and must specify the period within which, and the manner in which, the information is to be made available. The period must not be less than 14 days after the application is given to the reporting unit.

INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE 2012

To the members of the Australian Road Transport Industrial Organisation Queensland Branch.

We have audited the general purpose financial report of Australian Road Transport Industrial Organisation Queensland Branch, which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 June 2012, and the statement of income, statement of changes in equity and cash flow statement for the year then ended, a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes for the year then ended.
