Re: Schedule 1B of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 (the RAO Schedule)

Financial Reports for year ended 30 June 2005

Reference is made to the financial reports of the Tasmanian Branch of the abovenamed organisation for the years ended 30 June 2004 and 30 June 2005. The documents were lodged in the Industrial Registry on 16 November 2005.

Examination of the financial documents for the year ended 30 June 2004 has shown that matters requiring advice have been repeated in relation to the branch's financial documents for the year ended 30 June 2005. In these circumstances, it is considered unnecessary to provide advice for the year ended 30 June 2004.

I note that the financial report was provided to members on 9 November 2005. I also note that the financial report was presented to a meeting of the committee of management of the reporting unit on the same day.

As you know section 266 of the RAO Schedule makes provision for the methods by which a reporting entity may satisfy its obligation to present the full report to members. The purpose of the financial reporting provisions generally is to ensure disclosure to members, and, to offer those members an opportunity to raise any matter that concerns them regarding material disclosed in that information. The vehicle for members to achieve this are either at a general meeting of members or at a meeting of the committee of management. The latter option is only available if the precondition in subsection 266(3), that is the 5% rule, is satisfied. The rules of the organization do not make such provision.

Our records show that the rules of your organization do not make provision for 5% or less of members to call a special meeting of members for the purpose of considering financial reports. Your financial reports were presented to a meeting of your Committee of Management and not a meeting of members.

Your financial reports for years ended 30 June 2004 and 30 June 2005 and for future years <u>must</u> be presented to a meeting of members. If you want to continue with presenting financial reports to a committee of management meeting, the rules must be amended to make provision for 5% or less of members to call a special meeting of members for the purpose of considering financial reports.

In these circumstances, the alternatives require the presentation of the relevant documents to a general meeting of members, or at a series of meetings at different locations (this alternative is only available if the rules make provision for such meetings).

In the interim the organization is required to make its best endeavours to fully meet its obligations as set out in the RAO Schedule with respect to its obligation to present the financial report to its members.

#### General advice in relation to the lodged financial report

The following comments are made to assist you when you next prepare financial reports and you do not need to take any further action in respect of the financial reports already lodged other than the matters raised earlier.

#### 1. Operating report

#### Right of members to resign:

Subsection 254(2)(c) requires the operating report to "give details" of the right of members to resign from the reporting unit under section 174 of the RAO Schedule. The requirement may be met by the inclusion of a statement that a member has the right to resign and a reference to the relevant rule, which makes such provision. Alternatively, the complete text of the relevant resignation rule may be reproduced in the report. It would appear in this case that rule 9 of the organisation's Rules is applicable.

#### **Membership of Committee of Management:**

The information provided on offices and office holders for the year ended 30 June 2005 wasn't part of the operating report or an attachment and should be provided as part of the Operating report.

#### 2. General Purpose Financial Report (GPFR)

#### Notes to Accounts

I note that the notes to the accounts provide the provisions of section 274 of the Industrial Relations Act 1988. The accounts should set out the provisions of subsections 272(1), (2) and (3) of the RAO Schedule. Would you please ensure those subsections are copied into the GPFR in the next financial report of the Branch.

#### Auditor's report

The opinion of the auditor made under the auditor's report is expressed in terms previously required under the Act. Subsection 257(5) of the RAO Schedule now sets out the matters upon which an auditor is required to make an opinion. The following wording would satisfy the requirements of the Schedule:

"In our opinion the general purpose financial report is presented fairly in accordance with applicable Australian Accounting Standards and the requirements imposed by Part 3 of Chapter 8 of Schedule 1B of the Workplace Relations Act 1996."

A copy of this letter will be forwarded to your auditor.

#### **Committee of Management Statement**

#### Consistency with other reporting units

This area of the Committee of Management Statement related to Item 17(e)(iv) of the Registrar's Reporting Guidelines. Your organisation's Committee's statement at paragraph (e) (iv) provides that: "the organisation does not consist of 2 or more reporting units". Subsection 242(3) of the RAO Schedule provides, in part, that where an organisation is divided into branches, each branch will be a reporting unit.

### NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2005

The significant policies which have been adopted in the preparation of these Accounts are:

#### Note 1 - Statement of Accounting Policies

In the opinion of the Directors, the branch is not a reporting entity. These special purpose financial statements have been drawn up for distribution to members.

Except as noted below, the Accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting standards and disclosure requirements of the Australian accounting bodies, applicable Accounting Standards, and the requirements of law. They have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied.

The accounting standard AAS22 Related Party Disclosures has not been complied with in preparing these Accounts.

The carrying amounts of all non-current assets are reviewed at least annually to determine whether they are in excess of their recoverable amount. If the carrying amount of a non-current asset exceeds the recoverable amount, the asset is written down to the lower value. In assessing recoverable amounts the relevant cash flows have not been discounted to their present value.

#### Note 2 - Information to be Provided to Members or the Registrar

In accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, the attention of members is drawn to provisions of sub-sections (1). (2) and (3) of Section 274, which reads as follows:

- 1. (i) A member of an organisation, or a Registrar, may apply to the organisation for specified prescribed information in relation to the organisation.
  - (ii) An organisation shall, on application made under sub-section (1) by a member of the organisation or a Registrar, make the specified information available to the member or Registrar in such a manner, and within such time, as is prescribed.
  - (iii) A Registrar may only make an application under sub-section (1) at the request of the member of the organisation concerned, and the Registrar shall provide to a member information received because of an application made at the request of the member.
  - (iv) Sub-sections 2(c) of Section 279, which requires the summary to contain a statement to the effect that the organisation will provide a copy of the report, accounts and statements free of charge to any member who requests a copy.

#### Note 3 - Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on a diminishing value basis over the estimated useful life of the assets involved.

#### Note 4 - Share Capital

The organisation is limited by guarantee and accordingly does not possess share capital.

#### Note 5 - Taxation

No liability exists for income tax as "Employer Associations" are exempt from income tax under section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997. Therefore, tax effect accounting has not been adopted.

#### INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT

To the members of Australian Road Transport Industrial Organisation (Tasmanian Branch)

#### Scope

We have audited the attached accounts of Australian Road Transport Industrial Organisation (Tasmanian Branch) for the year ended 30 June 2005. The Committee of Management is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the accounts and the information they contain. We have conducted an independent audit of these accounts in order to express an opinion on them to the members of the Committee of Management.

Our audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the accounts are free of material misstatement. Our procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the accounts, and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates.
