#### **Operating Report**

#### Membership of Committee of Management

The Operating Report is required to contain the name of each person who has been a member of the committee of management of the reporting unit at any time during the reporting period, and the period for which he or she held such a position - refer regulation 159(c) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009. In future years please ensure that the period for which each member of the committee held office is stated.

#### Right of members to resign

Subsection 254(2)(c) of the RO Act requires the operating report to 'give details' of the right of members to resign from the reporting unit under section 174. I note that the current version of the resignation rule has not been provided. Please ensure in future that the current version of that rule is reproduced.

If the Cash Flow Statement includes cash flows to other reporting units in the Australian Road Transport Industrial Organization please ensure that the name(s) of the reporting unit(s) and the amount of any cash flows are disclosed in the notes to the Cash Flow Statement.

#### **Signatory**

I note that you have signed the designated officer's statement, operating report and committee of management statement as Executive Director. Such office is not provided in the rules of the organisation. Future documents should refer to the office as provided by the rules of the organisation, that is Branch Secretary/Treasurer.

#### **Extension**

- 4 A notice delivered to the person mentioned in subsection (1) is taken to have been received by the organisation delivered.
- 5 A notice of resignation that has been received by the organisation is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered in accordance with subsection (1)
- 6 A resignation from membership of the organisation is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this section if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the organisation that the resignation has been accepted.

#### 1 Accounting Policies

These financial statements are a general purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the accounts preparation requirements of s272 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009. The financial report has been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis. They are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation of the financial report. Unless otherwise stated, accounting policies are consistent with those of the previous year.

#### (a) Income Tax

No provision for income tax is necessary as "Trade Unions" are exempt from income tax under section 50-15 of the Australian Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended.

#### (b) Revenue

Revenue from the provision of services is recognised upon delivery of the service to the customer.

Revenue from member contributions is recognised proportional to the organisation's subscription year, while contributions from associated organisations is recognised on receipt of the funds.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

#### (c) Cash

For the purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand, at banks and on deposit.

#### 2 Information to be provided to Members or General Manager

- (1) A member of a reporting unit, or the General Manager, may apply to the reporting unit for specified prescribed information in relation to the reporting unit to be made available to the person making the application.
- (2) The application must be in writing and must specify the period within which, and the manner in which, the information is to be made available. The period must not be less than 14 days after the application is given to the reporting unit.
- (3) A reporting unit must comply with an application made under subsection (1).
