NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER, 2001.

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES.

a. Basis of accounting

- (i) The accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical costs except where stated.
- (ii) The accounts are prepared on the cash basis. The reason for using this method in lieu of the accrual basis of accounting is that the volume transactions does not warrant the introduction of accrual accounting and the additional costs involved. GST due and underpayments have been brought to account.

b. <u>Depreciation & Amortisation of Fixed Assets.</u>

Fixed Assets are depreciated over their estimated useful lives using the diminishing value method.

Profits and Losses on disposal of Fixed Assets are taken into account in determining the profit for the year.

c. Income Tax

No liability for income tax arises as the Federation provides benefits only for the members and is consequently exempt under Section 23(f) of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1936.

2. <u>INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED.</u>

In accordance with the requirements of the Industrial Relations Act 1988, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of sub-sections (1) and (2) and (3) of Section 274, which reads as follows:-

- "(1) A member of an organization, or a Register, may apply to the organization for specified prescribed information in relation to the organization.
- (2) An organization shall, on aplication made under subsection (1) by a member of the organization or a Registrar, make the specified information available to the member or Registrar in such time, as is prescribed.
- (3) A Registrar may only make an application under subsection (1) at the request of a member of the organization concerned, and the Registrar shall provide to a member information received because of an application made at the request of the member."
