Australian Salaried Medical Officers Federation South Australia Branch Financial Report for the year ended 31 December 2012 - [FR2012/569]

I acknowledge receipt of the financial report of the Australian Salaried Medical Officers Federation, South Australia Branch (the reporting unit). The documents were lodged with Fair Work Commission on 18 June 2013.

The financial report has now been filed.

I make the following comments to assist you when you next prepare a financial report. You are not required to take any further action in respect of the report lodged. The Fair Work Commission will confirm these concerns have been addressed prior to filing next year's report.

Operating Report - Membership of committee of management

Regulation 159(c) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 (RO Regulations) requires the reporting unit to disclose the period of which the listed officers served on the Committee of Management. The statement contained in the operating report states the persons listed served on the Committee of Management at the 'beginning of the financial year'. To satisfy the regulation the words preceding statement should state 'the persons who held office as members of the Committee of Management of the Branch during the financial year unless indicated otherwise were:'

Committee of Management Statement - Financial Records kept and maintained in accordance with Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 and Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009

This statement in the Committee of Management Statement only referred to the RO Regulations. Statement must be for both. Please ensure that the reference to the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* is included in future years.

Notes to the Financial Statements

Reporting Guideline 8(c) requires the reproduction of s.272 (1), (2) and (3) in the general purpose financial report. Although this has appeared in other financial returns it was not included in the reporting unit's general purpose financial report for this financial year.

Related Party Disclosures

The financial report disclosed related party relationships between the reporting unit and the federal office - Australian Salaried Medical Officers Federation. Accordingly, under AASB124(18) there should be a Related Party Disclosure in the Notes to specifically provide a description of the nature of the related party relationship, the amount of transaction, outstanding balances (if any) and doubtful debts (if any).

Changes to the legislation and reporting guidelines

I note with the change of legislation, references to Fair Work Australia will need to be updated to the Fair Work Commission.

Additionally, a third edition to the General Manager's s.253 reporting guidelines was gazetted on 26 June 2013. These guidelines will apply to all financial reports that end on or after 30 June 2013. Fair Work Commission has also developed a model set of financial statement for the 2012-2013 financial years. There is no requirement to use this model but it may be a useful resource to ensure compliance with the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009*, the s.253 reporting guidelines and the Australian Accounting Standards.

Your correspondence of the 28th August 2013 is acknowledged.

To assist with an appreciation of the answers (provided below) to the four questions put in your letter, I point out that the South Australian Salaried medical Officers Association [SASMOA] has a con-joint agreement with the South Australian Branch of ASMOF. A part of that agreement provides that (for an agreed fee) SASMOA maintains ASMOFSA records, including those relating to membership.

Question 1. ASMOF SA Branch keeps a record of members as far as it relates to the members of the Branch.

Question 2. No, the records are kept on a single registrar, unless (but there are no current examples of this) someone were to join SASMOA but decline to subscribe to membership of ASMOF.

Question 3. Applications for membership go before the first available guarterly meeting of the ASMOF SA Branch council for ratification. Any new (or resigning) members are notified to the ASMOF federal office once processed by the ASMOF SA Council meeting.

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INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF AUSTRALIAN SALARIED MEDICAL OFFICERS FEDERATION (SOUTH AUSTRALIAN BRANCH)

Scope

The financial report and committee of managements' responsibility.

The financial report comprises balance sheet, detailed statement of income and expenditure, statement of cash flows, statement of changes in equity and accompanying notes to the financial statements and the committee of management statement for the Australian Salaried Medical Officers Federation – South Australian Branch for the year ended 31 December 2012.

The committee of management of the union are responsible for the preparation and true and fair presentation of the financial report in accordance with the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009. This includes responsibility for the maintenance of adequate accounting records and internal controls that are designed to prevent and detect fraud and error, and for the accounting policies and accounting estimates inherent in the financial report.

Audit Approach

We have conducted an independent audit of the attached General Purpose Financial Report in order to express an opinion to the members of the union. Our audit was conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards in order to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. The nature of an audit is influenced by factors such as the use of professional judgement, selective testing, the inherent limitations of internal control, and the availability of persuasive rather than conclusive evidence. Therefore, an audit cannot guarantee that all material misstatements have been detected.

We performed procedures to assess whether in all material respects the financial report presents fairly, in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1, so as to present a view which is consistent with our understanding of the unions' financial position, and of their performance as represented by the results of their operations and their cash flows. These policies do not require the application of all Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements in Australia. No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used and described in Note 1, are appropriate for the needs of the members.

We formed our audit opinion in the basis of these procedures, which included:

- examining, on test basis, information to provide evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial report, and
- assessing the appropriateness of the accounting policies and disclosures used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by the committee of management.

While we considered the effectiveness of management's internal controls over financial reporting when determining the nature and extent of our procedures, our audit was not designed to provide assurance on internal controls.



Independence

In conducting our audit, we followed applicable independence requirements of Australian professional ethical pronouncements.

Audit Opinion

In our opinion, the general purpose financial report of the Australian Salaried Medical Officers Federation – South Australian Branch is presented fairly in accordance with applicable Australian Accounting Standards and the requirements imposed by the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009.

The Committee of Management statement dated February 14 2013 has been taken into consideration as part of the audit process.

	day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member;

whichever is later; or

- (ii) in any other case:
 - (a) at the end of 2 weeks after the notice is received by the Federation; or
 - (b) on the day specified in the notice:

whichever is later.

- (3) Any dues payable but not paid by a former member of the Federation, in relation to a period before the member's resignation from the Federation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the Federation, in a court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt to the Federation.
- (4) A notice delivered to the person mention in sub-rule (1) shall be taken to have received by the Federation when it was delivered.
- (5) A notice of resignation that has been received by the Federation is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered in accordance with sub-rule (1).
- (6) A resignation from membership of the Federation is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this Rule if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the Federation that the resignation has been accepted.
- (7) In special circumstances the Federal Council may by resolution accept the resignation of a member and release the member from any or all outstanding obligations to the Federation, notwithstanding that the provisions of these Rules have not been complied with.
