The Australian Workers' Union (AWU) membership records

I refer to the extensive previous communications and meetings about this matter between the Registered Organisations Commission (**ROC**), its predecessor the Fair Work Commission, and the AWU.

It is not proposed to again summarise the long history of this matter since concerns were first expressed to the AWU on 15 November 2016 about its reporting of membership figures. As you are aware, much of correspondence has been published on the ROC's website under AR2016/161 and is available via https://www.roc.gov.au/find-a-registered-organisation/awu.

It was clear by the time of our correspondence to you dated 7 October 2019, that after more than three years of seeking co-operatively to work with the AWU to ensure either an appropriate level of transparency or a satisfactory level of compliance with its statutory obligations, a number of matters had crystallised including the following:

- The AWU has admitted that it has contravened a range of statutory reporting obligations concerning its membership reporting in each consecutive year between 2009 and 2017, although the nature and extent of those contraventions remains entirely unclear;
- 2. It is a matter of serious concern that notwithstanding the inquiries conducted by the ROC over the past three years, members of the AWU, other registered organisation stakeholders, and the community more broadly, have not been provided with substantive information about the AWU's membership figures between 2009 and 2017 or any explanation either about the nature and extent of the AWU's statutory contraventions or the reasons for them;
- 3. Unless the AWU is aware of circumstances to the contrary, there is no reason to suppose that it should not be expected to comply with the same statutory obligations in the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 (the RO Act) which apply to every other federally registered organisation. This is particularly important given that more than 100 other federally registered organisations have been required to expend their resources in complying with membership reporting over the relevant period and would expect a level and consistent regulatory playing field for all registered organisations; and

4. The ROC has no reason to doubt that the AWU has now implemented an array of changes to improve the accuracy of its membership reporting from 2018 and that the AWU is very confident its current system is able to report membership figures accurately.

In our 7 October 2019 correspondence, it was foreshadowed that we would correspond in due course with you about the steps we propose to take relevant to the membership issue. Since that time, we have been considering an appropriate response in the context of other priorities being dealt with by the ROC, including by taking into account other regulatory issues we are dealing with relevant to the AWU.

Action proposed by the ROC

The purpose of this correspondence is to inform you that we intend to commence a formal investigation under s.331 of the RO Act in relation to the AWU's membership issues. That investigation will focus in particular on the admissions made by the AWU that it has contravened a range of statutory reporting obligations concerning its membership reporting in each consecutive year between 2009 and 2017. The Commissioner has delegated to me the power to commence such an investigation.

However, the pragmatic regulatory approach currently being taken by the ROC in the circumstances of the COVID-19 pandemic have caused us to re-prioritise the work we are currently undertaking. As a result, we will not formally commence our investigation until the resource and other implications for registered organisations and regulators become clearer.

At a convenient time when those matters are able to be clarified, we will commence the investigation and formally write to the AWU to set out its scope and other relevant details. In the meantime, the AWU is not being requested to take any action in response.

While an investigation has not yet been formally commenced, it is our intention to investigate the AWU's membership reporting in each consecutive year between 2009 and 2017. Accordingly, noting the offence provisions in s.337AC of the RO Act, as a matter of prudence the AWU should keep, and not destroy (including as a matter of usual administrative practice), any documents or records that may be relevant to the investigation.

We will publish this letter in AR2016/161 but then close that file. As is our usual practice, we would not propose to publish any further correspondence concerning the investigation.

AWU membership records

I acknowledge your letter dated 1 October 2019 received by email at 5.11 pm on the same day as my earlier letter addressed to Mr Walton regarding the ROC's intention to give consideration as to the appropriate steps to be taken with respect to the matter.

I note the additional material provided with your letter relating to the steps taken to rectify issues identified by RSM in a report provided to the AWU in April 2018. We will review your advice about those steps noting that it appears the AWU relies on them to be confident that its current membership system is compliant with its statutory obligations from 2018 and going forward.

As I indicated in my correspondence dated 1 October 2019, there is no reason to suppose that the AWU should not be expected to comply with the same statutory obligations in the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act* 2009 which apply to every other federally registered organisation and that it appears the AWU admits it has contravened a range of its statutory reporting obligations concerning its membership reporting in each consecutive year between 2009 and 2017.

Re: AWU membership records

We write further in response to your letter dated 12 July 2019.

As a consequence of the engagement between the AWU and ROC regarding previous membership reporting, the AWU commissioned auditors RSM Australia Pty Ltd ("RSM") to conduct a review of the AWU membership records and system and to make recommendations regarding the more effective conduct and administration of the system.

In April 2018, the RSM Report was provided to the AWU. The Report made a number of key recommendations which the AWU has sought to implement.

We consider it prudent in the circumstances to formally convey to the ROC the steps taken by the AWU to rectify issues identified by RSM in the conduct and administration of the AWU membership register and to promote future robust compliance within the AWU.

We set out below the steps taken by the AWU by reference to the numbered findings in the RSM Report.

RSM FINDING 2.1

In order to facilitate consistent national application of policies and procedures regarding membership management and reporting, the AWU has undertaken the following steps.

In mid-2018, the AWU developed a policy titled 'AWU Policy – Membership Register' ("Membership Policy") which is specifically directed at the maintenance of its membership register. A draft of the Membership Policy was provided to ROC for review and a range of helpful feedback was provided. ROC's feedback was incorporated into the final version of the policy which was approved by the AWU National Executive on 14 June 2018. A copy of the policy is attached to this correspondence and marked "AWU 1". A copy of relevant extracts from AWU National Executive Minutes which record the approval and implementation of the policy is attached and marked "AWU 2".

The Membership Policy has substantially assisted AWU Branches in implementing the requirements of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 ("FW (RO) Act") and the AWU Rules.

In addition to the Membership Policy, automated 'work-flows' have been built into the AWU's new membership database system which result in, for example, members who have not paid contributions for a period exceeding two years being automatically removed from the register within 28 days. A significant factor in the AWU deciding to change membership database systems was the potential to implement these types of improvements.

The AWU also made a number of changes to its registered rules to remove ambiguities relating to the maintenance of the membership register. A copy of the Fair Work Commission's decision approving these rule changes is attached and marked "AWU 3".

RSM FINDING 2.2

In order to facilitate consistent criteria for the reporting and collation of membership numbers, the AWU has undertaken the following steps.

The AWU has created and implemented the Membership Policy and also automated 'workflows' in the AWU's new membership database system. The Membership Policy imposes consistent and clear rules for all Branches to apply in relation to the treatment of resigning members, determining when a member is financial and un-financial and removing members from the register.

'Work-flows' in the AWU's membership system automatically remove resigned members and members who been un-financial for more than two years from the register. Copies of screenshots from the AWU's membership system which demonstrate the relevant 'work-flows' for resigned members are attached and marked "AWU 4" and "AWU 5". The 'work-flows' for un-financial members are discussed below.

The Membership Policy also introduces additional steps to verify the accuracy of membership figures reported to National Office by Branches including:

- the provision of a signed statement by Branch Secretaries confirming their register has been maintained in accordance with the Membership Policy during the preceding calendar year when they submit their 31 December membership figure for filing in the AWU's annual return; and
- written confirmation from the Branch Secretary that their auditor has confirmed in writing
 that the register has been maintained in accordance with the Membership Policy during
 the previous financial year when 30 June membership figures are determined as part of
 annual financial reporting.

RSM FINDING 2.3

In order to facilitate removal of un-financial members within the necessary 36 months, the AWU has taken the following steps.

As stated above, the Membership Policy provides clear rules about determining when a member is financial and un-financial and 'work-flows' have been built into the AWU's membership system to automatically remove members from the register within 28 days of

them being un-financial for two years. The AWU is satisfied these measures will facilitate robust compliance with obligations under s 172 of the FW (RO) Act.

Copies of screenshots from the AWU's membership system which demonstrate the relevant 'work-flows' are attached and marked "AWU 6" and "AWU 7".

RSM FINDING 2.4

In order to facilitate maintenance of postal address, the AWU has taken the following steps.

Clauses 2 and 7 of the Membership Policy are specifically directed at ensuring postal addresses are included on the register for all members. Further, the AWU's membership system automatically sends an error message to staff members where a postal address is not recorded. A copy of a screenshot from the AWU's membership system which demonstrates the relevant 'work-flow' is attached and marked "AWU 8".

The membership system will also soon incorporate an address verification function which uses Australia Post's address data to confirm the address being entered is valid.

In annual correspondence to AWU members, the importance of updating details is highlighted and members are asked to urgently inform the AWU if any details need to be updated. Furthermore, members can also utilise a log-in system accessed through the AWU's website to update their details.

RSM FINDING 2.5

In order to facilitate maintenance of membership records, the AWU has taken the following steps. Clause 14 of the Membership Policy specifically requires retention of the Membership Register as at 31 December each year. Further, Branch Secretaries are required to make a written declaration that they have retained a copy of their 31 December register when they submit membership figures as part of the annual return process each year.

RSM FINDING 2.6

In order to ensure appropriate controls to prevent duplication of membership date, the AWU's membership database system now automatically detects duplicate entries. A copy of a screenshot from the AWU's membership system which shows the relevant 'work-flow' is attached and marked "AWU 9".

RSM FINDING 2.7

In order to ensure that new applicants for membership are not registered as members before receipt of first payment, clause 7 of the Membership Policy specifically requires that a person should not added to the membership register before receipt of first payment. Furthermore, significant effort has been devoted to discussing this issue at internal meetings and staff training.

RSM FINDING 2.8

In order to facilitate effective controls to ensure primary place of employment to determine appropriate Branch eligibility, clause 3 of the Membership Policy and the pro forma membership application (which is ATTACHMENT 1 to the Membership Policy) are specifically directed at this issue and ensure that a member's primary place of employment

is a mandatory data field for the membership database system. This allows Branches to verify that a member is correctly included within their register. The membership system will also soon incorporate an address verification function which uses Australia Post's address data to confirm the address being entered is valid.

In annual correspondence to AWU members, the importance of updating details is highlighted and members are asked to urgently inform the AWU if any details need to be updated. Members can also utilise a log-in system accessed through the AWU's website to update their details.

RSM FINDING 2.9

In order to facilitate refresher training for AWU membership training, the AWU notes the following matters.

Each Tuesday, a weekly meeting of AWU staff who manage the Branch membership registers is conducted. The meetings are chaired by a National Office staff member whose primary responsibility is the AWU's membership system. The purpose of the meeting is to support AWU membership staff in the administration and management of the membership registers and facilitate a national approach consistent with the functionality of the database and the Membership Policy. In addition, the AWU National Office staff member has travelled around Australia training staff in the operation of the system and regularly works with external service providers to develop and implement improved automated 'work-flows' for the system.

RSM FINDING 2.10

In order to facilitate validation checks on changes to personal details, the AWU's membership database system tracks any changes made to members' personal details and automated 'work-flows' and other features assist in allowing anomalies or potentially incorrect information to be identified and rectified.

In annual correspondence to AWU members, the importance of updating details is highlighted and members are asked to urgently inform the AWU if any details need to be updated. As set out above, members can also utilise a log-in system accessed through the AWU's website to update their details.

REVIEW OF HISTORICAL FIGURES

Finally, as per previous correspondence and statements made during the meeting on 26 July 2019, the AWU does not consider it can retrospectively apply the Membership Policy to arrive at definitive historical membership figures since 2009.

However, the AWU is confident its current membership system is compliant with all statutory requirements and that the union is well placed to ensure this compliance will continue into the future.

DECISION

Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 s.159—Alteration of other rules of organisation

The Australian Workers' Union

(R2018/171)

Alteration of other rules of organisation.

- [1] On 29 June 2018 The Australian Workers' Union lodged with the Fair Work Commission a notice and declaration setting out particulars of alterations to its rules. Additional information regarding the Union's alterations was received 10 July 2018, 13 August 2018, 24 August 2018, and 30 August 2018. A supplementary declaration was also received 14 September 2018.
- [2] The particulars set out alterations to Rules:
 - 7 Admission to Membership
 - 9 Rate of contributions
 - 10 Contributions When and how payable
 - 11 Membership tickets
 - 13 Honorary life membership
 - 15 Ceasing to be a member and purging the Register of Members
 - 17 Duties of a member.
- [3] The alterations to Rule 7 create provisions for membership applications to be received in person, electronically or over the phone, with payment of fees made via authorised payroll deductions, direct debits or any other arrangement.
- [4] The alterations to Rule 9 make modifications in relation to Retired Members to comply with s171A of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (the Act).
- [5] The alterations to Rule 10 confirm that annual contributions become payable on 1 July each year and must be paid no later than 31 July. The alterations also make provisions for purging the membership register.
- [6] The alteration to Rule 11 provides that membership tickets may be issued electronically.
- [7] The alterations to Rule 13 make modifications in relation to Honorary Life Members to comply with s171A of the Act.

- [8] The alterations to Rule 15 include deletion of 15(1)(b). At present, a person could cease to be a member after being unemployed for a continuous period of six months. This would no longer be the case.
- [9] The alterations to Rule 15 also require the union to remove from the register, within 28 days, the name and postal address of a member who has been un-financial for a continuous period of 24 months.
- [10] The alterations to Rule 17 allow the membership register to be kept up to date by requiring members to inform the Union within 14 days of a change to their name, postal address or primary place of employment.
- [11] On 13 August 2018 Commission staff raised concerns about the wording of the alterations to 9(4), 10(6), 10(7) and 13(3).
- [12] Sub-rules 9(4) and 13(3) pertain to Retired Members and Honorary Life Members. The alteration to 9(4) transacted by the Union on 14 June 2018 specified that retirees could not be included on the membership register and would not be eligible to vote in any election unless they resided in New South Wales, or were Officers of the Union. The alteration to 13(3) transacted on the same day specified that honorary life members who were not retirees, Union Officials, nor residents of New South Wales would not be eligible to vote at elections nor be included on the membership register. This was based on an interpretation of s 171A of the Act.

[13] Section 171A of the Act reads:

- (1) If a person is a member of an organisation and the person is not, or is no longer:
- (b) if the organisation is an association of employers a person of a kind mentioned in paragraph 18B(3)(a), (b), (c) or (d) [...]

the person's membership of the organisation immediately ceases.

[14] Relevantly, s18B(3) states:

An association of employees is not *federally registrable* if it has a member who is not one of the following:

- (a) an employee
- (b) a person specified in subsection (4);
- (c) an independent contractor who, if he or she were an employee performing work of the kind which he or she usually performs as an independent contractor, would be an employee eligible for membership of the association;
- (d) an officer of the association.

Section 18B(4) provides:

The persons specified for the purpose of paragraph (3)(b) are persons (other than employees) who:

- (a) are, or are able to become, members of an industrial organisation of employees within the meaning of the *Industrial Relations Act 1996* of New South Wales [...]
- [15] Section 18B(4) makes similar provisions for Queensland, Western Australia and South Australia. However, the wording is different. In New South Wales, individuals who are or are able to become members of state registered organisations may be included on a federal membership register; Queensland, Western Australia and South Australia rely on the individuals being employees as defined under the relevant state industrial law.
- [16] There is no provision for residents of New South Wales who are not employed in the relevant industry to maintain full financial membership rights as either Retired Members or Honorary Life Members purely on the basis of their residence. However, members of the New South Wales State registered union may maintain full membership rights in the Federal Union regardless of their employment status.
- [17] Following discussions with staff of the Commission, the Union requested that the alterations to sub-rules 9(4) and 13(3) lodged on 29 June 2018 be treated as being superseded by subsequent alterations to those sub-rules which were transacted on 12 September 2018.
- [18] Separately, the alterations to sub-rules 10(6) and 10(7) set out provisions pertaining to individuals who had payment arrangements in place for the paying of membership fees. Following consultation and further discussion with Commission staff, fresh alterations to sub-rules 10(6) and 10(7) were transacted on 12 September 2018. Those alterations were intended to supersede the relevant alterations lodged 29 June 2018 at the Union's request.
- [19] On the information contained in the notices received 29 June 2018 and 13 September 2018, I am satisfied the alterations have been made under the rules of the organisation.
- [20] On 30 August 2018, Daniel Walton, National Secretary, gave consent, under subsection 159(2) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009*, for the Delegate to make various amendments to the alterations for the purpose of correcting typographical, clerical or formal errors. Accordingly the following correction has been made:
 - In proposed rule 15(1)(a) the content has been merged into the single rule 15(1) to cause the rule to read as a whole sentence.

[21] In my opinion, the alterations comply with and are not contrary to the *Fair Work* (*Registered Organisations*) *Act 2009*, the *Fair Work Act 2009*, modern awards and enterprise agreements, and are not otherwise contrary to law. I certify accordingly under subsection 159(1) of the *Fair Work* (*Registered Organisations*) *Act 2009*.

AWU membership records

I refer to the extensive previous correspondence in relation to this matter and to the meeting held in Sydney on 26 July 2019 between the Registered Organisations Commission (**ROC**) and the Australian Workers' Union (**AWU**) informally to discuss this matter.

The 26 July 2019 meeting

For the purposes of the meeting, the AWU provided certain additional material, on a without prejudice basis, to clarify the circumstances which have culminated in the AWU's stated position that it could not now correct the inaccurate membership numbers declared to the regulator (initially the FWC and now the ROC) by various reporting units of the AWU between the years 2009 and 2017. This means (at the least) that the AWU appears to have contravened a range of its statutory reporting obligations in each consecutive year between 2009 and 2017. The position which emerged from the meeting is that the AWU is now advising that remediation, or in other words accurate membership reporting, is not now possible.

The meeting was concluded, as we understood it, on the basis that the AWU would write to the ROC to provide information (in the nature of primary source documents) in relation to the steps it has taken to implement the recommendations in the RSM Membership Review Report and sought to correct the membership numbers previously reported to the ROC (and previously the FWC).

Response since 26 July 2019 meeting

While I acknowledge that since 26 July 2019, a lawyer acting for the AWU has had informal discussions with a lawyer who is acting for the ROC in unrelated ROC/AWU civil proceedings, in the almost **10 weeks** since the meeting no further information has been received from the AWU in relation to this issue. The meeting in Sydney followed the long and dilatory history of the AWU's engagement with the regulator on these issues which has been set out, in detail, in our letters of 31 July 2018 and 14 March 2019 although it is not necessary to recount all of those matters here.

AWU has same reporting obligations as every other registered organisation

It ought to be a matter of serious concern to the AWU that nearly three years have now passed since express concerns were raised about the accuracy of the AWU's membership figures without any substantive information being provided to the regulator that could assist to resolve the matter for the benefit of the AWU's members, other registered organisations and the community more broadly. There is no reason to suppose that the AWU should not be expected to comply with the same statutory obligations in the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act* 2009 (the **RO Act**) which apply to every other federally registered organisation.

The AWU previously informed the ROC, in particular in correspondence dated 28 June 2018, 24 September 2018, 16 November 2018 and 27 February 2019, that:

- Branch Secretaries were directed to review membership figures provided to the ROC and its predecessors and to notify the National Secretary of the AWU by 30 September 2018 [i.e. more than a year ago] if corrections were required (albeit that this direction at the time only related to the period from 1 January 2011 onwards);
- Some Branches were unable to complete this process in the timeframe foreshadowed by the AWU and that these were now required to be completed by a later date (30 October 2018); and
- After the review process concluded, amended figures would be submitted to the ROC.

In those letters the AWU asserted that the updated figures would be able to be provided to the ROC soon after 30 September 2018, then by 30 October 2018, later by mid-December 2018 and finally "in the first half of 2019". Ultimately, the AWU now asserts that no updated figures to any level of certainty can or will be provided at all.

The ROC is concerned that the AWU has failed to demonstrate, in the nearly three years since these matters were first raised, its active and genuine intention to engage with the regulator transparently to remediate admitted inaccuracies and to communicate the steps that it has taken to remediate its register of members prior to 2018.

It is our assessment that we have exhausted the voluntary options available to the ROC and I now intend to give consideration as to the appropriate steps to be taken, having regard to our concerns about what appears to be serious, systemic and unremedied non compliance with reporting, record keeping and maintenance of the AWU's register of members.

AWU membership records

I acknowledge your letter of 3 July 2019 as part of ongoing correspondence between the Registered Organisations Commission (**ROC**) and the Australian Workers' Union (**AWU**) concerning the AWU's membership records. While it has been convenient for both the ROC and the AWU to refer in correspondence to membership reporting prior to 2018 as being 'historical', it is important to note that the relevant period under review has and continues to be between 2009 and as recent as 2017 inclusive.

We understand that the 'AWU is concerned about the ongoing expenditure of substantial amounts of its members' money and union resources on reviewing historical membership figures'. We note that it is primarily those same members of the AWU, among other stakeholders, who are entitled to be provided with accurate information about the membership of their registered organisation.

We also note your advice that the AWU's concerns are 'exacerbated by the fact that it is becoming increasingly apparent that the change in membership system providers means it will not be possible to ever arrive at definitive historical figures.' To put that statement into perspective;

- you will be aware that the Fair Work Commission (**FWC**) first expressed concerns about membership figures by letter sent on 15 November 2016; and
- while it was the AWU's decision to change its membership system provider, we
 understand that AWU officials continued to have access to and utilise the functions of its
 previous membership system up to the end of March 2018, being some 16 months after
 these matters were first raised.

For an abundance of clarity, we understand that in the context of extensive previous correspondence relating to membership reporting, your concession that '<u>it will not be possible to ever arrive at definitive historical figures'</u>, is an admission by the AWU to contraventions of its statutory reporting and record keeping obligations in each of the calendar years 2009 – 2017 inclusive.

Consistent regulatory approach to all registered organisations

As you know, there are 106 federally registered organisations, including the AWU, each having statutory reporting and record keeping obligations, including under ss.230, 231, 233 & 265 and of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act* 2009 (the **RO Act**). There are no provisions in the RO Act which exempt an organisation from meeting its reporting obligations, 'historic' or otherwise, or which provide the Commissioner power to relieve an organisation from compliance with those obligations.

The seriousness of these obligations is underpinned by the fact that the legislation provides at section 233(3) that, in a declaration about information lodged with the regulator, a person must not make a statement if the person knows or is reckless as to whether the statement is false or misleading. This requirement is a civil penalty provision.

It is implicit in your concession of 3 July 2019 that information was lodged with the regulator in circumstances where it cannot have been correct. The fact that this occurred historically in the period 2009 – 2017 inclusive, does not excuse the conduct.

As a fair and balanced regulator, a consideration for the ROC is why other registered organisations should be required to expend their resources on accurately meeting statutory reporting obligations if the same requirement does not equally apply, and is not seen to apply, to the AWU.

Offer of verification and other information

The AWU has, and continues more recently, to state that it is 'very confident its current system is fully compliant.' You have indicated that this can be verified by the ROC if required. I can advise that the ROC proposes to accept that invitation and is also interested to fully understand why the AWU now states that 'it will not be possible to ever arrive at definitive historical figures'. The ROC is interested in this latter assertion in part because the AWU continues to decline requests for access to the RSM Report or other probative information which would provide at least some level of transparency about, and explanation for, these ongoing membership reporting issues.

Proposed meeting

Your letter seeks an opportunity to meet with the ROC to discuss an appropriate resolution to this matter. The ROC continues to be entirely open to dialogue and transparent communication about this matter.

I will arrange for the ROC to engage with Debra Bushell as you have requested to make convenient arrangements for the parties to meet and continue engagement on this important issue.

Re: AWU membership records

We write in response to the letter from Patrick Coyle (then Acting Executive Director) of the Registered Organisations Commission ("ROC") dated 14 March 2019. The letter was the latest in a range of correspondence between ROC and The Australian Workers' Union ("AWU") concerning the AWU's historic membership records.

Previous correspondence from the AWU has confirmed that an external provider was engaged some time ago to review the AWU's historical membership figures. The external provider is the same business that was contracted by the AWU to provide membership database services at the times relevant to ROC's queries.

The external provider has provided the AWU with some figures which purport to reflect the membership figures that should have been reported by the AWU back to 2009. Unfortunately, the AWU does not consider that the figures are reliable. For example, the external provider has provided membership figures for some Branches that are significantly inconsistent with the AWU's audited membership income for the relevant period. Many of the figures equate to each AWU member paying well above the full-time annual AWU contribution rate. That cannot be correct given the impact of unfinancial members (that haven't yet met the purging requirement) and casual/part-time members.

Further, despite already paying a considerable amount of money to the external provider, the AWU has had ongoing problems in its attempts to clarify aspects of the figures and to have them corrected. The AWU has also been repeatedly requested to pay additional charges for work associated with the review. These problems largely arise because there is no ongoing contractual relationship between the parties – the AWU has ceased using the membership provider's database system and the exit terms and arrangements were contentious.

As stated in previous correspondence, the AWU has implemented an array of changes in recent years to improve the accuracy of its membership reporting. As a result of these changes, the AWU is very confident its current system is fully compliant, and this can be verified by ROC if required.

Moreover, the AWU is very conscious of the ROC's focus on membership register compliance, including arising from the litigation presently before the Federal Court in *Registered Organisations Commissioner v The Australian Workers' Union and another* (VID583/2018). The AWU is intent on ensuring that its membership system and practices are wholly compliant with the legislative requirements.

In these circumstances, the AWU is concerned about the ongoing expenditure of substantial amounts of its members' money and union resources on reviewing historical membership figures. These concerns are exacerbated by the fact that it is becoming increasingly apparent that the change in membership system providers means it will not be possible to ever arrive at definitive historical figures.

On this basis, the AWU seeks an opportunity to meet with the ROC to discuss an appropriate resolution to this matter. The AWU is prepared to discuss ongoing compliance and monitoring steps and any other reasonable measures to deal with ROC's concerns regarding future AWU membership reporting.

The Australian Workers' Union - membership records

I refer to the extensive previous communications between the Registered Organisations Commission (ROC), its predecessor the Fair Work Commission (FWC), and the Australian Workers' Union (AWU) about this matter including, most recently, your letter dated 27 February 2019.

In that correspondence, you foreshadowed that the 2019 Annual Return would be submitted based on apparent improvements to the AWU's membership systems arising from the implementation of the 'AWU Policy – Membership Register'.

However, your letter then further advises that:

The Annual Return process has inevitably shifted some resources away from the historical review process.

It is expected that the historical review process will conclude in the first half of 2019 and that any amended figures will then be submitted to ROC.

This information is disappointing, given the AWU's previous undertakings in relation to this process.

The ROC's letter dated 31 July 2018 (a copy of which is **attached** for ease of reference) set out the long history of this matter, up to that date. It is unnecessary to repeat that history here. However, it is relevant to note that:

- 1. The FWC first expressed to the AWU its concerns about membership figures by letter sent on 15 November 2016. The AWU subsequently acknowledged inaccuracies in its reporting of membership figures in writing in letters dated 25 November 2016 and again on 21 March 2017. This has implications for the transparency of information provided to members concerning the organisation. As members of each reporting unit are entitled to a copy of the financial report prepared in respect of each financial year (including the operating report declaring the number of members), the provision of inaccurate information in those reports clearly has the potential to mislead members as to the true state of affairs.
- On 19 May 2017, the ROC recommended that the AWU commission an external audit of membership reporting in Annual Returns and Financial Reports between 2009 and 2015.



- On 2 June 2017, the AWU lodged amended sections of the relevant Operating Reports for each of the financial years 2009 to 2015 purporting to correct the membership numbers in each year. This was done in the absence of the recommended external audit.
- 4. After further encouragement by the ROC, on 23 October 2017 the AWU advised the ROC that it had engaged an external consultant, RSM, to conduct a membership audit. The AWU indicated that the findings of the review would be presented to the AWU's National Executive on 6 December 2017 and that the outcome of the review and any motions passed by the National Executive in response to it would be provided to the ROC by 12 December 2017.
- 5. Provision of that information by those dates did not occur. Successive dates notified by the AWU for completion of the RSM Report came and went before the AWU confirmed to the ROC on 18 May 2018 that the RSM Report had been received. The AWU then declined to provide a copy of the RSM Report or its specific outcomes to the ROC, after earlier stating that it would do so. However the AWU conceded that concerns raised by the RSM Report had the potential to undermine the accuracy of membership numbers relied upon by the AWU and its branches. By this concession it has been taken that the amended figures provided by the AWU in respect of various Operating Reports on 2 June 2017 are not reliable and are likely incorrect.
- 6. Since that time, we understand that the AWU has been working with its branches to review and correct their historical reporting of membership numbers. The AWU's letter of 28 June 2018 stated that AWU Branch Secretaries had been directed to review membership figures as provided to the ROC and its predecessors, and notify the National Secretary if corrections were required by 30 September 2018 (albeit this request only related to the period from 1 January 2011, and not for the whole period back to 2009).
- 7. Again, this date was apparently optimistic and could not be achieved. On 24 September 2018, the AWU advised the ROC that *some* Branches [emphasis added] would be unable to complete membership reviews and provide advice to National Office by 30 September 2018. The AWU further advised that these reviews were now required to be completed by Branches by 30 October 2018.
- On 16 November 2018 (following a 7 November 2018 request from the ROC for the membership figures identified by each Branch), the AWU advised that it was not yet satisfied as to the accuracy of membership figures and anticipated providing a further response in 'mid-December' 2018.
- 9. On 20 December 2018 (in response to a query from the ROC regarding the absence of the foreshadowed mid-December update), the AWU advised that the membership review process would not be completed by the end of 2018 but that the AWU would provide an update to the ROC by Friday 1 February 2019.
- 10. Finally, on 27 February 2019 (following further correspondence from the ROC on 8 February 2019), the AWU advised that the review process would conclude in the first half of 2019, after which amended figures would be submitted to the ROC. That is the letter to which this letter replies.

In the circumstances, it can be seen that successive dates notified by the AWU to the ROC for the completion of the review of the historical membership figures have passed. After in each case the ROC having to seek updates on this work after the time nominated by the AWU to provide further information, the AWU have provided estimates of increasing length and imprecision as to how much longer this work would take.

It remains a concern to the ROC that the AWU has apparently consistently reported inaccurate membership figures to its members since 2009, including in updated Operating Reports lodged on 2 June 2017. This of course has the continuing potential to mislead members of the AWU as to the true state of affairs. That is not intended to ignore welcome improvements in the AWU's policies and systems, which we understand cause the AWU to have increased confidence in the accuracy of figures provided (belatedly) in respect of its 2018 Annual Return and in its forthcoming 2019 Annual Return.

Nevertheless, the AWU has been aware of the potential for its historical membership figures to have been misreported for well over two years. These are not simply 'historical' matters. They are relevant to possible contraventions of sections 230 and 254 of the RO Act, both of which are civil penalty provisions.

Insufficient remedial action in relation to apparent breaches of the RO Act

Despite awareness of these matters for over two years, the AWU has not to date been able to provide corrected figures, with the latest estimate being that the AWU expects to provide amended figures in the first half of this year. The imprecise nature of this estimate, and the past history of this matter, does not instil confidence that this latest timeframe will be met.

As indicated in the ROC's letter dated 8 February 2019:

The ROC receives and relies in good faith upon undertakings from elected officials of registered organisations to perform its statutory functions.

Clearly, the assurances by AWU officials in relation to this matter, even if well meaning, have repeatedly not been met.

While you have identified that this is a big task, the failure to complete remedial action in relation to apparent contraventions of the RO Act for such an extended period is unsatisfactory. It raises obvious concerns about whether the AWU is progressing the matter with the appropriate level of urgency. This is particularly so in circumstances where the AWU has not been entirely transparent with the regulator as to the process that it is currently undertaking.

We continue to encourage and welcome voluntary compliance by the AWU. However, in the circumstances of this matter, we now request that the AWU provide the amended figures and requested information as soon as possible, and in any event no later than 30 June 2019. This is the most recent time frame notified by you for provision of this information. As you will appreciate, this will be more than two and a half years since these issues were first raised with the AWU.

As with previous correspondence in this matter, the ROC intends to publish this letter on the relevant AWU webpage of the ROC website.

Further to our letter dated 8 February 2019, we write to provide an update regarding The Australian Workers' Union's ("AWU") review of historical membership figures.

The AWU National Executive met in Sydney on 12 and 13 February 2019. The ongoing challenges with the finalisation of the external provider's review process amongst affected Branches were discussed along with the most recent correspondence exchanged between the AWU and the Registered Organisations Commission ("ROC") on this matter and the AWU's preparation of its 2019 Annual Return.

The AWU's 2019 Annual Return will be the first prepared following the implementation of the 'AWU Policy – Membership Register'. There have been extensive internal communications recently amongst AWU officials and staff regarding this process. The Australian Workers' Union (AWU) membership records

I refer to the extensive previous communications about this matter between the Registered Organisations Commission (**ROC**), its predecessor and the AWU, including your letter dated 20 December 2018.

In that letter, you advised (adopting your paragraph numbering) that:

- 1. The AWU is reluctant to provide a definitive timeframe to ROC given the extensive involvement of an external party and the increasingly complex problems that have continually arisen with the process.
- 2. The process will not be finalised prior to the end of 2018. However, the AWU undertakes to provide a further update to ROC by Friday, 1 February 2019. [emphasis added]

To date, no such update appears to have been provided.

The ROC receives and relies in good faith upon undertakings from elected officials of registered organisations to perform its statutory functions. I note the following recent examples:

- (i) On 24 September 2018, your letter advised the ROC that some Branches would be unable to complete review (s) by 30 September (the date previously advised by the AWU in a letter dated 28 June 2018). The AWU advised that its Executive required reviews to be completed by 31 October 2018.
 - Consistent with that, it was anticipated by the ROC that further advice would be provided about the matter but by 7 November 2018 no further advice had been received, which required a formal request from ROC for an update.
- (ii) On 16 November 2018, your letter advised the ROC that the AWU was not yet satisfied as to the accuracy of membership figures and anticipated providing a further response in mid-December 2018.
 - When no response had been received by 20 December 2018, the ROC was required to again request advice about when a response would be received.

As I indicate above, your letter dated 20 December 2018 includes your undertaking to provide a further update to ROC by Friday, 1 February 2019. A week has passed since that date and the ROC has no record of receiving any response consistent with your undertaking.

We have made it clear that in the circumstance that this matter has been unresolved for more than two (2) years, we do not consider it can any longer be open ended.

It would assist the ROC's consideration of this matter for a response to be provided.

Re: AWU membership records

BACKGROUND

- 1. We write in response to your latest letter dated 7 December 2018 regarding the Registered Organisations Commission's ("ROC") ongoing enquiries into the membership reporting of The Australian Workers' Union ("AWU").
- 2. We also write to provide ROC with an update regarding the AWU's review of historic membership figures.

RESPONSE TO 7 DECEMBER 2018 LETTER

- 3. The AWU disagrees with various statements in your letter dated 7 December 2018 and the content below is not exhaustive.
- 4. The AWU strongly disputes your suggestion that there has been "no substantive transparency to the problems" the AWU has encountered with its membership reporting.
- 5. The AWU has repeatedly confirmed to ROC that the external assessment provided by RSM Australia Pty Ltd ("RSM") indicated that AWU Branches were taking differing approaches to the maintenance of their respective parts of the AWU's membership register.
- 6. With the benefit of hindsight, that is unsurprising given significant ambiguities that existed within the registered rules of the AWU. For example:
 - AWU Rule 10(2) did not clearly prescribe a due date for the (i) payment of annual contributions. The due date was left to a determination of the relevant Branch Secretary. The due date for contributions is significant for assessing financial membership

and for determining when a member needs to be removed from the membership register pursuant to AWU Rule 15(3) and/or s 172 of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* ("**FW** (**RO**) **Act**");

- (ii) AWU Rule 10(6) and (7) did not clearly prescribe when a member ceases being treated as a financial member if they had a valid direct debit or payroll deduction authority in place but the AWU has ceased receiving payments. This ambiguity creates problems in terms of assessing financial membership and for determining when a member needs to be removed from the membership register pursuant to AWU Rule 15(3) and/or s 172 of the FW (RO) Act; and
- (iii) the application of the AWU Rules and the FW (RO) Act to retired members and honorary life members was not clear.
- 7. The ambiguities identified above make the process of retrospectively assessing the AWU's membership records and determining what members should have been included at various points in time extremely difficult. The process is far more complex and difficult than the AWU initially understood and it will be far more challenging to arrive at certain figures than ROC appears to comprehend.
- 8. This is particularly the case given the AWU recently changed membership systems. That means the historical review includes a review of membership records generated in a system that the AWU is no longer using. That inevitably complicates the process.
- 9. Upon assessing RSM's report, the AWU determined that it needed to urgently take steps to rectify inconsistent approaches amongst its Branches and to clarify the operation of the AWU's rules.
- 10. The AWU devoted significant resources to this process and it resulted in:
 - (i) the development of the "AWU Policy Membership Register";
 - (ii) various amendments to the AWU Rules; and
 - (iii) extensive internal work to standardise and automate the operation of the AWU's membership database system.
- 11. It is this extensive work that has allowed the AWU to now be confident its membership register is being maintained consistently and accurately. The AWU completely rejects the unsubstantiated assertions to the contrary in your letter.
- 12. On a general level, the AWU considers ROC's approach to this matter involves a retrospective "fine-tooth comb" approach that is not appropriate given the historical regulatory environment and the degree of ambiguity in the AWU's registered rules.
- 13. ROC's approach to this matter demonstrates no apparent consideration of this historical reality.

UPDATE ON REVIEW OF HISTORICAL MEMBERSHIP FIGURES

14. The membership system historically used by AWU Branches (and still currently being used by the South Australian Branch) was delivered and maintained by an external provider.

15. In response to the AWU National Executive's direction for Branches to review historical membership figures, four AWU Branches engaged this external provider to assess their historical membership records to determine whether any members should have been excluded or included as at 30 June and 31 December each year back to 2009.

16. The external provider's work on this project took longer than it initially predicted. Further, the external provider has still not been able to confidently provide reviewed figures to the AWU.

17. AWU Branches have identified inaccuracies with the external provider's data and are currently working with them to try and resolve these issues.

18. This process is proving time consuming and expensive for the AWU. Nevertheless, the AWU remains committed to the process and is attempting to complete it in the shortest possible timeframe.

19. The AWU is reluctant to provide a definitive timeframe to ROC given the extensive involvement of an external party and the increasingly complex problems that have continually arisen with the process.

20. The process will not be finalised prior to the end of 2018. However, the AWU undertakes to provide a further update to ROC by Friday, 1 February 2019.


21. The AWU remains willing to meet with ROC representatives to further discuss this matter if that is considered helpful.

The Australian Workers' Union (AWU) membership records

Thank you for your letter of 23 November 2018.

I also refer to the extensive previous communications about this matter between the Registered Organisations Commission (ROC), its predecessor and the AWU.

To keep you informed about progress, I propose to address some of the matters contained in your most recent response letter dated 23 November 2018.

AWU approach

The ROC acknowledges the work (as generally described in paragraph 5. of your letter) that the AWU has undertaken to date to remedy the inaccuracies in its membership registers and processes. Similarly, we were pleased to provide comprehensive feedback to assist the AWU with the development of its new 'AWU Policy-Membership Register'.

We also note your confirmation that the AWU understands the importance of complying with its statutory obligations and its desire to carefully rectify inaccuracies in historical returns.

From an objective perspective, it appears that the ROC and the AWU are seeking to achieve the same outcome, which is for the membership records of the AWU (both current and historical) to be accurate. This outcome is clearly in the interests of members.

Commitment to an end date for rectifying historical membership figures

You will be aware that a number of recent Court decisions at first instance and on appeal have emphasised the importance of the record keeping of members and the seriousness of incorrect records, particularly over lengthy periods of time.

In this context, the ROC has shown considerable forbearance in not commencing an investigation while these membership issues have remained extant for over two years.

The inability or unpreparedness to date of the AWU to provide a commitment to a date for rectifying inaccuracies in historical membership figures since 2009 is concerning. These concerns are exacerbated by the AWU's refusal to table evidence that might otherwise have explained the problems that have arisen or ameliorated those concerns. That is, there has been no substantive transparency to the problems you have encountered, their scope, nor the processes you have undertaken or continue to undertake.

The AWU indicated that Branches were instructed to provide revised figures by 30 September 2018 (which the AWU later unilaterally extended). It appears likely that neither of those timeframes, nominated by the AWU, have been met as I understand the AWU anticipates providing, but has not committed to providing, some type of update by mid December 2018 'about consultation with an external provider and future steps'.

Given the duration of the process to date we do not consider that it can any longer be 'open ended'.

Your letter of 23 November 2018

Your letter makes a number of assertions, to which we wish to respond:

- i. The assertions contained in numbered paragraphs 3. and 11. of your letter regarding the ROC's approach are incorrect. The duration and history of this matter has been summarised to you in my correspondence of 31 July 2018.
- ii. Were it not for the ROC's focus on the interests of AWU members, it is, in my view, likely that the extensive erroneous membership reporting of the AWU identified more than two years ago would continue to the present time. The steps subsequently taken by the AWU towards remedial compliance, acknowledged and welcomed by the ROC, have been taken in large part as a result of the regulator's intervention and approach.
- iii. It is a matter of record that while the matter has been ongoing for more than two years, the ROC has not commenced a formal investigation. Instead, for over two years the regulatory approach concerning membership reporting by the AWU has been to inform, educate, advise, recommend, request, collaborate with and encourage the AWU to remedy its non-compliance.
- iv. The intended outcome of all of these alternatives to enforcement has been that the AWU would, within a reasonable period and in a timely way, voluntarily comply with its statutory obligations and remediate past inaccuracies, while providing transparency to its members and the regulator about the reasons behind the undermining of the accuracy of the AWU's membership reporting.
- v. Given the time that has elapsed, in more recent times the ROC has sought evidence of the AWU's progress in complying with its statutory obligations. In response, the AWU has repeatedly declined to produce existing expert reports into the issue that would provide clarity and transparency to the ROC and AWU members about the scope of the problem, the time needed to rectify it, and the AWU's efforts and progress in responding to it.
- vi. It is usual that evidence of the progress being achieved in voluntarily addressing issues should be provided to support requests for further forbearance by the regulator in formally investigating issues such as these. To date, the AWU has refused requests to provide to the ROC its independent reports into this matter.
- vii. If, contrary to the approach which has been taken, an investigation had been commenced in 2016 it is perhaps likely that members of the AWU would now have at least some understanding of the issues leading to inaccurate membership reporting.

2017 Annual Return Membership Figure

In your letter, you referred to a meeting that I attended in Sydney at which the ROC '...accepted the timeframe nominated by the AWU for the filing of [the 2017 Annual Return Membership Figure]'.

You will be aware, the ROC does not have authority to accept or condone contraventions of the law and it has never purported to do so. The fact that during a meeting on 31 May 2018 the ROC accepted the AWU's intention to remedially lodge membership records in June 2018, has no bearing on whether or not the AWU contravened its statutory obligations on 31 March 2018. The ROC did, however, take into account the AWU's proposed remedial steps in deciding not to take compliance action at that time.

Whether to commence an investigation

Your submissions as to whether an investigation should be commenced have been noted and will be carefully considered. We will also await the mid-December update, so that it too can be considered, in relation to the issue of whether an investigation should be commenced.

While the AWU submits it is confident that its membership register is maintained in a consistent way across its Branches, the ROC does not share that confidence because of a) the AWU's own concessions about inaccuracies, and b) the ROC has not been provided with sufficient information, or evidence for a proper understanding or assessment of the issues which have led to the undermining and/or inconsistency of membership reporting.

We again invite you to consider providing this evidence to the ROC and continuing with a more cooperative and more timely approach in this matter. This remains the first preference of the ROC.

Conclusion

As I have indicated above, careful consideration will, after mid-December, be given to the next required steps and I will advise the AWU in due course. If an investigation is commenced, the AWU will be notified about the scope of the investigation although, as is the ROC's routine practice and approach to procedural fairness, such correspondence will not be made public.

Re: AWU membership records

Background

- We write in response to your letter dated 16 November 2018. This letter invited The Australian Workers' Union ("AWU") to provide submissions regarding whether the Registered Organisations Commission ("ROC") should commence an investigation into the AWU's membership reporting.
- 2. The AWU appreciates the opportunity to provide submissions on this matter and they appear below.

Extensive steps taken by the AWU in this matter

- 3. The AWU considers your letter dated 16 November 2018 presents the AWU's recent efforts in relation to its membership register in an unfair, incomplete and inaccurate manner.
- 4. The AWU's membership register has been a paramount recent concern and numerous significant steps have been taken to improve the AWU's internal processes.
- 5. Recent steps taken by the AWU include:
 - the commissioning of an external review into the maintenance of its membership register by RSM Australia Pty Ltd ("RSM");
 - (ii) the development of a detailed policy titled 'AWU Policy Membership Register' which has been specifically designed to promote consistent approaches to the maintenance of the AWU's membership register across Branches.

As you are aware, the AWU sought input from ROC in relation to this policy and then made an array of amendments to incorporate feedback from ROC. The development of this policy also involved proposing changes to the AWU's registered rules to resolve ambiguities in terms of issues that relate to the maintenance of the membership register - such as a member's financial status. Many significant issues identified and rectified by the AWU during this process had not previously been identified by ROC or its predecessors;

- (iii) the AWU National Executive ultimately approved the 'AWU Policy Membership Register' on 14 June 2018 along with various rule changes. The National Executive also directed AWU Branches to assess their 31 December 2017 membership figure with reference to the terms of the policy so the AWU's annual return for 2018 could be completed. This occurred and the AWU provided its 31 December 2017 membership figure to ROC on 10 July 2018.
- (iv) The Fair Work Commission approved AWU rule changes many of which are directed at rectifying ambiguities about matters relating to the maintenance of its membership register on 17 October 2018: *The Australian Workers' Union* [2018] FWCD 5834; and
- (v) At the request of the ROC, AWU is currently completing a historical review of membership figures reported in financial returns and annual returns since 2009. This is a significant exercise. We are not convinced ROC understands the magnitude of this task. It is an exercise that the AWU wishes to conduct carefully in order to avoid generating any inaccuracies.
- 6. Indeed, we note your comments at Senate Estimates on 27 October 2017 when you described the AWU's dealings with the ROC on this issue as "a cooperative piece of work between the Australian Workers' Union and the Registered Organisations Commission to improve and enhance their compliance with reporting of membership."

2018 Annual Return Membership Figure

- 7. Your letter refers to alleged contraventions of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act* 2009 arising from the AWU submitting its 31 December 2017 membership figure after the prescribed due date.
- 8. ROC is well aware of the reasons for the delay in the provision of the membership figure. The AWU was not convinced about the accuracy of its figure at the due date and needed additional time to undertake further reviews.
- 9. You and other ROC representatives met with me and other AWU representatives on 31 May 2018 in Sydney. During this meeting, you accepted the timeframe nominated by the AWU for the filing of its figure, being after its then upcoming National Executive meetings in June 2018, to be reasonable in the circumstances. It is disingenuous for you now to use this issue to threaten further proceedings against the AWU.

General approach of ROC

- 10. The AWU understands the importance of complying with its statutory requirements. At the request of the ROC, it has devoted considerable time and resources in recent times towards rectifying historical issues.
- 11. Unfortunately, it appears ROC is primarily focused on trying to identify how many contraventions it can establish against the AWU as a key performance indicator rather than trying to engage genuinely with the AWU to further compliance and the best interests of AWU members.

An investigation is not required

- 12. The AWU is confident its membership register is now being maintained in a consistent manner across its Branches.
- 13. The AWU is working diligently to reassess its historical membership figures but does not consider it appropriate to declare any amended figures until it is fully satisfied with the accuracy of the figures. This process is taking longer than was initially anticipated.
- 14. The AWU considers accuracy should take precedence over haste in this process and it is not apparent why ROC seemingly has a different view.
- 15. The AWU does not accept the interests of its members are best served by ROC commencing a formal investigation into this matter. A compliance message does not need to be sent to the AWU when its actions clearly demonstrate the message has already been received.
- 16. The AWU remains willing to meet with ROC representatives to further discuss this matter if that is considered helpful.

The Australian Workers' Union (AWU) membership records

I refer to the above matter and to previous communications between the Registered Organisations Commission (ROC) and the AWU, most recently my letter of 7 November 2018 (which requested a response by Wednesday 14 November 2018) and a brief response letter from you today foreshadowing future consultation with an external provider associated with additional delay and further steps.

Recent request

In my letter of 7 November 2018, I noted the following:

'The AWU membership records issue has now been the subject of ongoing communications between the relevant regulator and the AWU for a period of two (2) years and the ROC is considering what further action is required'.

I sought your advice about the outcome of reviews which you had previously advised would be completed by 30 September 2018 and which you subsequently extended to 31 October 2018 as well as advice relating to declarations concerning any consequential membership number adjustments.

The ROC has continued to raise extensive and increasing levels of concern about the accuracy of AWU membership reporting, and the need for corrective action, over the entire 2 year period. This is important for reasons which have been set out in previous correspondence including, for example, the following comment you made in your letter dated 18 May 2018:

'This report has primarily identified that AWU Branches have been implementing differing procedural approaches to the maintenance of their respective membership registers. This obviously has the potential to undermine the accuracy of membership numbers relied upon by the AWU and its Branches' (underlining added)

Potential contraventions in 2018

The ROC has highlighted that as recently as 31 March 2018, potential contraventions of a range of statutory provisions appear to have occurred by the AWU failing to provide the number of members as at 31 December 2017 by 31 March 2018 (such as sections 230(1)(d), 233(1)(a) and 233(1)(b), and regulations 147(f) and 149).

I have previously summarised the progress of our communications on this matter in a letter to you dated 31 July 2018, including by referring to our inability properly to understand the circumstances leading to your assessment that the accuracy of AWU membership numbers has been potentially

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undermined. We have made it clear that the AWU's disinclination to provide the relevant RSM Report has made our assessment more difficult and that in the event the ROC was to commence an investigation under s 331 of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act* 2009 (the **RO Act**), it would likely be open to the Commissioner to issue a Notice to Produce under section 335(2)(b) to require production of the report.

Your advice today that 'the AWU is not yet satisfied about the accuracy of its reviewed membership figures...' continues to escalate our concerns about the integrity of AWU membership records.

After a period now in excess of 2 years, it is clearly a matter of significant concern that neither the ROC (nor members of the AWU) appear any closer to developing an understanding about the circumstances leading to the potential undermining of the accuracy of AWU membership numbers or declarations concerning membership number adjustments.

Next steps by the ROC

Your letter today suggests that you 'anticipate' being able to provide a further response by mid-December 2018, although I note that this does not amount to a commitment to provide the updated membership figures by that time. In the meantime, it is unsatisfactory that the nature of the concerns regarding the integrity of the AWU's membership reporting (either historically, or as that might affect membership reporting into the future) remains wholly unresolved.

Before the ROC considers what action it is now appropriate to take in the circumstances, I invite the AWU to make any submissions it wishes which might assist the ROC to determine whether to commence an investigation into matters related to membership reporting. Those submissions are invited by Friday 23 November 2018.

The Australian Workers' Union (AWU) – membership records – AR2016/161

I refer to the above matter and to previous communications between the Registered Organisations Commission (**ROC**) and the AWU, most recently your letter dated 24 September 2018.

In that letter you advised that the AWU National Executive passed a resolution on 14 June 2018 directing all AWU Branches to review membership figures previously filed with the ROC and its predecessors in financial reports and annual returns. While it was not clear to the ROC why the National Executive directed the review to only extend back to 1 January 2011, your letter indicates that a more recent resolution extended the review back to 2009.

Your letter further advised that the reviews of membership records by Branches of the AWU, which you had previously advised would be completed and reported to the AWU National Office by 30 September 2018, would instead be completed by 31 October 2018.

The AWU membership records issue has now been the subject of ongoing communications between the relevant regulator and the AWU for a period of two (2) years and the ROC is considering what further action is required. We seek your advice on the outcome of the reviews, including:

- a) The membership figure identified by each Branch as at 30 June and 31 December of each year from 2009 onwards; and

The Australian Workers' Union (AWU) membership records

Purpose

In the context of ongoing concerns about the integrity of AWU membership reporting and potential contraventions of civil penalty provisions in ss 230, 231 and 233 of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act* 2009 (the **RO Act**) as recently as March 2018, the purpose of this correspondence is to:

- a. Summarise the chronological progress of the matter; and
- Articulate the current status of the matter as understood by the Registered Organisations Commission (ROC).

Summary of membership records issue

I refer to a range of previous correspondence in relation to regulatory concerns about the validity of membership reporting and the lodging of an additional declaration for the AWU's 2018 Annual Return of Information (**Annual Return**) in respect of 31 December 2017 membership figures.

The lodging of that additional declaration on 10 July 2018, acknowledged by ROC correspondence dated 11 July 2018, was some three and a half months outside the statutory period required under section 233(1) of the RO Act and regulation 149 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 (RO Regulations).

In earlier correspondence dated 28 June 2018, you referred to 'ongoing communications between the ROC and the AWU concerning the AWU's membership figures.' Given that relevant communication has been ongoing since 15 November 2016 and that the integrity of membership reporting continues to remain at issue, I have reviewed the matter and I now consider it timely to set out a chronological summary of the matter to date. I note that this summary is not intended to refer to all of the extensive correspondence sent or received relevant to the membership records.

Commencement of inquiries in 2016

You will be aware that as at 15 November 2016, regulatory functions relevant to federally registered organisations were assigned by the RO Act to the General Manager of the Fair Work Commission (FWC) who delegated the majority of those functions to me in my then role as the FWC's Director of the Regulatory Compliance Branch (RCB).

First correspondence on 15 November 2016

While performing the delegated regulatory functions relevant to registered organisations, on 15 November 2016 I wrote to the then National Secretary of the AWU, Mr Scott McDine advising that in 2015, the RCB had commenced research into a range of matters associated with the requirements in the RO Act that registered organisations maintain a register of members and report on membership to the FWC (as the then regulator). As part of that research, the FWC had requested that the AWU complete a survey / questionnaire to assist the regulator to better understand how its membership registers were populated, maintained and purged and the circumstances in which a person was recorded as a member of the AWU.

I noted in my correspondence that the AWU had declined the FWC's survey / questionnaire request and that consequently the regulator's understanding of the AWU's situation was more limited than its understanding of the many other federally registered organisations who had participated in the survey.

Further, I advised that the RCB had commenced a review of historical membership data of a number of federally registered organisations, including a preliminary review of AWU membership data from Annual Returns and Financial Reports for the years 2009 to 2015. It was this preliminary review which raised concerns about the integrity of AWU membership reporting leading to the commencement of the communications with the AWU which remain ongoing. It was essentially the reporting of membership numbers in Financial Reports which replicated the previous year's Annual Return membership numbers which had raised concerns because it was entirely unlikely that the reported data could have been accurate.

My letter dated 15 November 2016 pointed out the AWU's statutory obligation under s 233 of the RO Act to lodge a declaration that the register of its members had, during the reporting period, been kept and maintained as required and that s 233 was a civil penalty provision.

Acknowledgement of historical errors

On 25 November 2016 in your role as the then Acting National Secretary of the AWU, you acknowledged that membership numbers which had been included in the AWU's Financial Reports over a number of years had erroneously reflected the membership numbers reported in the Annual Returns up to and including the 2014 Financial Report. You advised that the AWU revised its reporting of membership numbers for the 2015 Financial Report and the number provided for that report reflected a compilation of branch membership numbers as at June 2015.

In essence, your letter of 25 November 2016 acknowledged errors in historic membership reporting in the period June 2009 to 2014 although you advised that having had the benefit of a detailed FWC review of its 2015 Financial Report, the AWU 'further improved its financial reporting for 2015' and that 'These improvements are also incorporated in the 2016 Financial Report.

In your correspondence you indicated that you hoped that regulatory concerns about the integrity of membership data had been resolved by acknowledging erroneous historical membership reporting and describing improvements to the AWU's financial reporting in 2015 and 2016 (each containing AWU membership numbers).

On 20 December 2016, I provided you with some preliminary observations about AWU membership reporting while noting that a more detailed response would be provided at a later date. I advised that the regulator's concerns about what you had conceded to be inaccurate historical membership reporting were not resolved merely by an acknowledgement of error and that instances of incorrect membership data giving rise to potential contraventions of the RO Act, at the least from 2009 to 2014, were required to be remedied.

In summary and notwithstanding your expressed hope that the integrity of AWU membership data had been resolved, my correspondence made the following clear:

'The Commission does not currently have a sufficient level of confidence in the statutory membership reporting of the AWU'.

I requested that the AWU conduct an internal audit of its membership for financial and calendar year periods covering 2009 to 2014.

Correspondence in 2017

On 6 March 2017 I wrote to you to ascertain what steps had been taken by the AWU to remedy its inaccurate membership deficiencies for the period 2009 to 2014 and what the outcomes of those steps had been. I requested specific information about whether the membership reporting deficiencies had been remedied and whether the AWU proposed to conduct an audit.

On 21 March 2017 you wrote to the FWC attaching a document prepared by the AWU's National Office Financial Controller in relation to his review of the membership numbers reported by the AWU for 2009 to 2015. The document outlined the basis for the resolution by the AWU National Executive on 2 March 2017 to conduct an internal review, the methodology used and the documents examined, including a recommendation on the action to be taken to remedy any differences between membership reporting as between the Annual Returns and Financial Reports.

I note here that the ROC commenced its operations on 1 May 2017 and assumed the relevant regulatory role with respect to federally registered organisations. Having commenced these inquiries while at the FWC, I continued to be responsible as the newly appointed Executive Director of the ROC.

On 19 May 2017, I wrote to you confirming that relevant amended operating reports pursuant to ss 254(2)(f) of the RO Act and regulation 159 of the RO Regulations were required to be lodged.

In my letter, I provided a summary of the matter to that time and extensive information and data reflected in a series of graphs about the AWU's historical membership dating back to 2003. I made a number of observations which raised further concerns about the integrity of historical membership data lodged by the AWU.

More specifically, I recommended that having regard to the ongoing and historical data integrity issues, the AWU commission an external audit of membership reporting in Annual Returns and Financial Reports between 2009 and 2015 which would take into account and seek to explain the various issues referred to in my letter.

On 2 June 2017 the AWU lodged amended sections of the relevant Operating Reports for each of the financial years 2009 to 2015 correcting the membership numbers in each year.

In your letter, you hoped the matter had thereby been resolved by including the following:

'We trust that this finalises the matter. If necessary we would be pleased to discuss this matter with your further'.

On 3 July 2017, you wrote to the ROC referring to my letter of 19 May 2017 in which I had recommended an external audit of membership reporting in Annual Returns and Financial Reports for the years 2009 to 2015. While the AWU resisted commissioning the membership data audit I had recommended, you advised that the AWU had instead decided to commission a project entitled the 'AWU Modern Membership Project' (**the Project**) to be conducted by an external consultant. You referred to the terms of the Project and advised that its purpose would be to report on improvements the AWU could make to systems, process, rules and reporting methodology in order to facilitate a high level of compliance with the AWU's membership reporting obligations.

You anticipated that the Project would result in changes and optimisation of AWU practices, systems, reporting and possibly also rules. You advised that the AWU intended to notify and consult with the ROC and the FWC about relevant changes prior to implementation as part of the AWU's desire to maintain a constructive engagement within the regulatory framework.

Finally, you anticipated that the Project would take a number of months to complete and that you would communicate further with the ROC.

On 3 August 2017, with the ROC noting that the AWU had resisted the recommendation to commission an external audit of membership reporting for the period 2009 to 2015, a meeting

was held involving you, the AWU's legal adviser from Maurice Blackburn Lawyers Mr Kamal Farougue, myself and ROC Senior Adviser Andrew Schultz to discuss the matter.

On 17 October 2017 I wrote to you requesting an update about the status of the matter in which I highlighted that your letter of 3 July 2017 did not indicate whether the AWU would commission an external audit of its membership records.

On 23 October 2017 you wrote to the ROC advising that the AWU had engaged RSM Australia Pty Ltd (**RSM**) to conduct what you described in your letter as 'the independent external review of the AWU's membership records and reporting and provided the terms of reference'. It was apparent that a new term of reference had been added to the terms previously provided in Appendix A of your 3 July 2017 letter. The new term (which was underlined) was 'Identify case studies arising from correspondence from the Fair Work Commission and the Registered Organisations Commission which are indicative of how processes and practices can be improved'.

In your correspondence you attached the RSM proposal to the AWU dated 12 October 2017 which had been endorsed by you on 23 October 2017.

You indicated that the findings of the review would be presented to the AWU's National Executive on 6 December 2017 and that the outcome of the review and any motions passed by the National Executive relevant to the matters subject of the terms of reference and the findings of the review would be provided to the ROC by 12 December 2017.

On 21 December 2017 I wrote to you referring to your advice of 23 October 2017, noting that the ROC had not received any further advice from the AWU. On 22 December 2017 the Acting National Secretary, Misha Zelinsky, advised that the matter had been delayed and was expected to progress early in 2018.

Correspondence in 2018 and potential further contraventions of ss 230, 231 and 233 of RO Act

On 19 January 2018, the AWU advised the ROC by letter that the Project had been delayed and that it was anticipated a Final Report was due by 21 March 2018

On 1 February 2018, as part of a routine and courtesy reminder regime for all registered organisations, the ROC provided the AWU with a courtesy reminder letter reminding it of the obligation to lodge an Annual Return with the ROC by 31 March 2018, including a statement concerning the number of members as at 31 December 2017.

On 5 March 2018, again as part of a routine and courtesy follow up regime, the ROC provided the AWU with a further courtesy reminder letter referring to the previous ROC letter dated 1 February 2018, which included a requirement for a statement concerning the number of members as at 31 December 2017.

On 28 March 2018, you provided the AWU's Annual Return to the ROC which you stated was lodged pursuant to the RO Act and RO Regulations. However, in potential contravention of a number of statutory requirements (such as ss 230(1)(d), 233(1)(a) and 233(1)(b) of the RO Act and regulations 147(f) and 149 of the RO Regulations), the AWU did not provide the number of members as at 31 December 2017. Instead, your Annual Return included the following statement:

'A register of members has, during the immediately preceding calendar year, been kept and maintained by The Australian Workers' Union ("AWU"). However, a recent external review process, which has not yet concluded, has identified some inconsistencies amongst practices adopted by AWU Branches in terms of their register of members. I intend to urgently submit an additional declaration once I am satisfied these issues have been resolved. The Registered Organisations Commission ("ROC") is aware of this external review'.

A particular aspect of concern in relation to the AWU's Annual Return was that although the integrity of AWU membership data had been specifically raised as a regulatory concern as early as 13 November 2016, almost one and a half years later the AWU appears to have failed to meet

its statutory obligation to provide membership numbers in its Annual Return because of what was described as inconsistent practices by AWU branches in terms of the register of members.

On 4 April 2018, you wrote to the ROC advising that the RSM's review was close to completion and that the AWU would inform the ROC about decisions made by the National Executive in response to the report provided by RSM (**RSM Report**). You indicated that your preference would be to thereafter meet with ROC representatives to discuss the AWU's response to the report.

AWU declines to provide the ROC with the RSM Report

On 9 May 2018 I wrote to you advising that the ROC would be pleased to meet with the AWU. Having regard to the fact that in its 23 October 2017 letter to the ROC, the AWU foreshadowed providing the outcome of the review to the ROC, I indicated in my 9 May 2018 letter that to ensure a meeting would be meaningful, it would assist if a copy of the RSM Report and its recommendations were to be provided beforehand.

On 18 May 2018, you wrote to the ROC advising that the RSM Report had been provided to the AWU although you declined to provide either a copy of the report or its specific outcomes to the ROC.

You indicated the following in your 18 May 2018 letter:

'This report has primarily identified that AWU Branches have been implementing differing procedural approaches to the maintenance of their respective membership registers. <u>This obviously has the potential to undermine the accuracy of membership numbers relied upon by the AWU and its Branches'</u>. (underlining added)

You further advised that the AWU had agreed that prompt action needed to be taken and that a draft document titled 'AWU Policy – Membership Register', (**Draft Policy**) had been compiled with the intention that it be approved by the National Executive. In preparation, you sought the views of the ROC about the policy and whether any improvements could be made. You also indicated that the AWU would welcome an opportunity to meet with ROC representatives following a review of the Draft Policy.

On 21 May 2018 I wrote to you referring to previous correspondence and noting that the AWU remained in potential contravention of a number of statutory provisions (such as ss 230 and 233 and regulations 147(f) and 149) by failing to provide the number of members as at 31 December 2017.

I expressed concern about the implication of the advice in the AWU's 18 May 2018 letter upon the accuracy of amended Operating Reports which had already been lodged with the ROC.

I advised that I would make myself available to meet with the AWU about the Draft Policy although I made it clear that the ROC had little or no information about the particular findings that gave rise to the proposed amendments included in the document. For that reason, I again highlighted that it would add significant value to the contribution the ROC could make if the AWU were to provide the ROC with a copy of the RSM Report.

While a face to face meeting was arranged for 31 May 2018, once again the AWU declined to provide the ROC with a copy of the RSM Report or its specific findings or outcomes.

On 31 May 2018 ROC Principal Lawyer Bill Steenson and I met with you, your legal representative from Maurice Blackburn Lawyers Mr Kamal Farouque, and Senior AWU Legal Officer Stephen Crawford at the ROC office in Sydney. We again made it clear that although we would be able to provide detailed feedback about how to improve the Draft Policy, it continued to be difficult because a copy of the RSM Report had not been provided.

Verbal feedback was provided during the meeting and the ROC undertook to provide detailed written feedback about the Draft Policy as soon as possible.

During the meeting, the AWU offered to lodge its membership number as at 31 December 2017 albeit that it could not attest to the accuracy of that membership number. Alternatively, in the circumstances of the statutory reporting obligation having already expired on 31 March 2018, a

validated membership number would be lodged following the 13 June 2018 AWU National Executive meeting.

The AWU continued to decline to provide a copy of the RSM Report or its specific findings or outcomes.

On 4 June 2018, I wrote to you providing extensive ROC feedback about how the Draft Policy could be improved.

Current status

On 28 June 2018, you wrote to the ROC about the detailed feedback the ROC had provided in relation to the Draft Policy and advised that much of the feedback had been adopted. Further, you attached fifteen (15) resolutions passed by the AWU National Executive on 14 June 2018 concerning the policy steps to be taken by the AWU in relation to AWU membership and provided the approved version of the Policy.

You further advised that AWU Branch Secretaries had been directed to review membership figures provided to the ROC and its predecessors from **1 January 2011** and to notify the National Secretary if corrections were required by 30 September 2018.

In the circumstances that the majority of correspondence to date has referred to the period 2009 to 2015, it is unclear why the AWU is now advising of instructions to Branch Secretaries to review membership figures since 1 January 2011 only.

Notwithstanding the extensive communication between the ROC and the AWU in this ongoing matter, including discretionary feedback about the AWU's Policy and the numerous requests made by the ROC to view the RSM Report, the reason(s) that the AWU continues to decline to provide the ROC with the RSM Report or its specific findings remains unclear.

Amended Declaration lodged on 10 July 2018

On 10 July 2018, you lodged an additional declaration regarding the AWU Annual Return for 2018 indicating that the AWU's total membership figure for 31 December 2017 was 69,786. I have indicated above that potential contraventions of a range of statutory provisions occurred on and from 31 March 2018 by the AWU failing to provide the number of members as at 31 December 2017 by 31 March 2018 (such as ss 230(1)(d), 233(1)(a) and 233(1)(b) and regulations 147(f) and 149).

Table 1: AWU membership from Annual Returns and Financial Reports

AWU	2016	2017	Difference
AR	87,206	69,786	- 17,420 (19.64%)
FR	87,412	84,984	- 2,428 (2.78%)

The table above reflects that the membership number of 69,786 as at 31 December 2017 represents a 19.64% reduction from the membership number reported by the AWU as at 31 December 2016. The table also reflects that the financial membership number of 84,984 as at 30 June 2017 represents a 2.78% reduction from the financial membership number as at 30 June 2016.

The difficulty that emerges however, is that it is by no means clear whether the significant 19.64% reduction in Annual Return membership figures between 2016 and 2017 has occurred because of actual membership reduction or because of flaws in the integrity of membership reporting. The fact that there is only a 2.78% decrease in financial members between the 2016 and 2017 financial years potentially indicates that inaccurate data integrity may be a cause of the decrease. The AWU has not, however, provided an explanation for the change.

Conclusion

The purpose of this letter is to summarise the extensive exchange of correspondence and meetings held between the AWU and the relevant regulator (FWC / ROC) since 15 November 2016 in relation to the regulator's concerns about the validity of membership reporting, the lodging of an additional declaration regarding 31 December 2017 membership figures in the AWU's 2018 Annual Return and a range of potential contraventions of the RO Act.

It has been clearly articulated throughout the range of correspondence referred to above that validation of AWU membership data for the years 2009 to 2015 has been the minimum expectation. Having regard to your recent advice about the RSM Report identifying differing procedural approaches that had the potential to undermine the accuracy of the entire membership numbers reported by the AWU, validation of membership data from 2009 to 2017 reporting years seems entirely appropriate.

I note that you have required Branch Secretaries to report to you by 30 September 2018 about their review of membership data and in particular, whether further corrections are required.

The facts and circumstances surrounding the inconsistent membership reporting by AWU Branches continue to remain unclear to the ROC and while I repeat my advice that this matter is not currently the subject of an inquiry or investigation under s 330 or s 331 of the RO Act, I take the opportunity once again to request a copy of the RSM Report and its specific findings and recommendations. The provision of the report would assist the ROC to determine what further action may be required regarding the matter. You will be aware that in the event that the ROC decides to commence an investigation under s 331 of the RO Act, it would be open to the Commissioner to issue a Notice to Produce under s 335(2)(b) to require production of the RSM Report.

In the meantime, I look forward to receiving further advice concerning the reviews by Branch Secretaries.

AWU Membership figures - AR2016/161

I refer to previous correspondence regarding the membership figures of the AWU lodged in purported accordance with its statutory obligations under the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 (Cth) (RO Act), most recently my letter dated 9 May 2018 and your letter dated 18 May 2018.

Membership audit

I welcome your advice that the membership audit by RSM Australia Pty Ltd (**RSM**) has been completed and I note from your letter that the RSM report identified that AWU Branches had different approaches to the maintenance of membership registers.

While I have not of course seen the report, it raises the question about the extent to which the different approaches you refer to may have had the effect that membership numbers submitted to the regulator (previously FWC and now the ROC) as part of the Annual Return (AR) and Financial Reporting (FR) processes may have been inaccurate.

I am aware that amended operating reports have been lodged by some AWU Branches where a discrepancy had been identified in membership numbers previously declared. Noting that the RSM report was completed after the amended operating reports were lodged, it is not clear what the different approaches to membership registers had, or may have had, on those amended operating reports.

AWU 2008 Annual Return

I note that the obligation in sections 230(1)(d) and 233(1)(b) of the RO Act and Regulation 147(f) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 to lodge with the ROC 'a record of the number of members on 31 December in the previous year'

I also note that your declaration in the AWU's 2018 Annual Return, in relation to reporting of membership numbers, includes the following observation:

A register of members has, during the immediately preceding calendar year, been kept and maintained ... However, a recent external review process ... has identified some inconsistencies among practices adopted by AWU Branches in terms of their register of members. I intend to urgently submit an additional declaration once I am satisfied these issues have been resolved.

It is this statement that causes me the concern I have expressed above about the implications on the accuracy of amended operating reports already lodged with the ROC.

Your letter dated 18 May 2018 also enclosed a draft 'AWU Policy – Membership Register'. While I very much welcome the AWU's engagement with the ROC in relation to the draft Policy, the ROC currently has little or no information about the particular findings that gave rise to the proposed amendments.

As I have previously indicated, it would therefore add significant value to the contribution the ROC can make if the AWU were to provide the ROC with a copy of the RSM report.

I will be in Sydney in the morning and early afternoon of **Thursday 24 May 2018** and both Mr Bill Steenson and I would be pleased to make ourselves available to meet with you and any relevant AWU representatives in relation to this matter if that is convenient.

We confirm RSM Australia Pty Ltd ("RSM") has now provided their final report to the AWU. This report has primarily identified that AWU Branches have been implementing differing procedural approaches to the maintenance of their respective membership registers. This obviously has the potential to undermine the accuracy of membership numbers relied upon by the AWU and its Branches.

In response to the RSM report, the leadership of the AWU has agreed that prompt action needs to be taken to ensure Branches apply a consistent approach to the maintenance of their membership registers. To that end, the AWU has developed a draft document titled 'AWU Policy – Membership Register'. The intent is for the final version of this policy to be approved by the AWU National Executive and then strictly implemented. Following approval of the final policy by the National Executive, 'work flows' will be developed and implemented for the AWU's electronic membership register so the system can automatically apply many aspects of the policy. The policy includes reference to Branch Secretaries declaring that their Branch has complied with the policy ahead of the submission of each annual return and financial report by the AWU and/or its Branches.

Given the membership policy deals with relatively complicated matters that are regulated by a range of legislative provisions and various parts of the AWU rules, the AWU wishes to seek the views of the Registered Organisation Commission ("ROC") regarding the terms of the policy and particularly whether any improvements could be made. To that end, please find attached a copy of the draft policy for ROC's consideration.





AWU Membership figures

Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 (Cth) - AR2016/161

I refer to previous correspondence regarding the membership figures kept by The Australian Workers' Union (**AWU**) under the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 (Cth)* (**RO Act**).

The most recent correspondence consisted of your letter dated 21 March 2017 which included a copy of an internal audit of the membership figures disclosed in annual returns and financial reports by the AWU and its branches from 2009 to 2015. The letter and membership audit report advised that erroneous membership figures had been provided in national financial reports from 2009 to 2015. The report also stated that:

It is proposed that the AWU provide FWC a separate statement for each of the Financial years impacted; 30 June 2009 – 2015, which is to be read in conjunction with the Financial Report for that financial year which restates the membership numbers reported in the Financial year.

Your letter also indicated that:

It is the intention of the AWU to provide the relevant remedy documents referred to ... in the attached audit report for lodgement and uploading to the Fair Work Commission's website.

Given that the relevant membership figures were originally provided in the AWU's national Operating Reports (which form part of the financial report), pursuant to subsection 254(2)(f) of the RO Act and subregulation 159(a) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 (Cth) (RO Regulations) I confirm that the lodging of remedy documents is required.

Accordingly, a separate signed statement should be lodged for each financial year stating that it:

- amends the Operating Report that was previously lodged for that year;
- provides the correct membership figure for that financial year; and
- provides the reason why an incorrect figure was included in the original Operating Report.

Mail: GPO Box 2983 Telephone: 1300 341 665 Melbourne VIC 3001 Email: regorgs@roc.gov.au In addition, to assist you in complying with the requirements of the RO Act regarding membership figures, I provide below some general analysis and commentary about AWU membership figures and references to relevant provisions in the RO Act, although as I noted in my correspondence of 15 November 2016:

For the avoidance of doubt, I advise that my queries...are not in any way related to the current investigation into the Victorian Branch of the AWU which was commenced on 2 November 2016

The relevant correcting statements, together with additional information as set out below, should be lodged by Friday 2 June 2017.

1. Introduction

As you will be aware, the Registered Organisations Commission (ROC) commenced operations on 1 May 2017 and relevant amendments to the RO Act commenced on 1 and 2 May 2017 accordingly. The jurisdiction relating to the lodgement of annual returns and financial reports now resides with the ROC and thus the previous matters raised in the context of the Fair Work Commission (FWC) are now within the jurisdiction of the ROC.

Section 329AB of the current RO Act lists the functions of the Registered Organisations Commissioner (the **Commissioner**) which relevantly include:

- a. to promote:
 - (i) efficient management of organisations and high standards of accountability of organisations and their office holders to their members; and
 - (ii) compliance with financial reporting and accountability requirements of this Act; including by providing education, assistance and advice to organisations and their members

As I indicated in my correspondence to the AWU dated 15 November 2016, an important aspect of being an efficient and effective regulator involves a continuing process of building an understanding of relevant regulated entities, such as the AWU. In seeking to develop a better understanding of entities registered under the RO Act, pro-active steps continue to be taken on, among other things, issues related to the obligations of registered organisations to report membership in financial reports and annual returns.

Prior and subsequent to receiving your letter of 21 March 2017, I have continued the process of reviewing membership figures the AWU has lodged in statutory returns over time. While I propose to refer in some detail to my review later in this correspondence, it is convenient to provide here some examples of issues I have noted.

For example, I noted that:

 membership figures in AWU annual returns were, on average, 2,985 higher than those in financial reports from 2009 to 2015.

I also noted that the Queensland Branch:

- had purportedly more than 20,000 unfinancial members from 30 June 2009 to 30 June 2012 (and in late 2012 it purportedly had 28,320 unfinancial members); and
- has reported that the average number of *financial members* fell from about 47,000 (in 2004 to 2006) to about 33,000 (in 2007 to 2014) without any apparent decline in the

membership income of the branch (see further information in Table 4 and Table 5 below).

As I reflected on that reporting, it seemed to me that it may be relevant to:

- whether the AWU has purged unfinancial members within 36 months under s172 of the RO Act and AWU Rule 15 (as set out further below); and
- the accuracy of the AWU membership figures generally given that the Queensland Branch purportedly forms over 40% of the union's membership.

These points are discussed further below.

2. Legislative requirements - register of members

The RO Act requires an organisation to, among other things:

- keep a register of the name and postal address of each member (refer to subsection 230(1));
- enter in the register the name and postal address of a new member within 28 days of the person becoming a member and to remove from the register the name and postal address of a person who has ceased to be a member within 28 days (refer to subsection 230(2)).

The RO Act also includes two separate requirements regarding the lodgement of membership figures as follows:

- An organisation must lodge an annual return each year that states the number of members in the organisation as at 31 December of the prior year (refer to subsections 233(1) and 230(1)(d) and subregulation 147(f)).
- Each reporting unit in an organisation is required to prepare a financial report each year. The Operating Report in the financial report must state, among other things, the number of members in the reporting unit as at the end of the financial year (refer to subsection 254(2)(f) and subregulation 159(a)).

I note that subsections 230(1) and 230(2) and sections 233 and 254 are civil penalty provisions.

3. Legislative and other requirements - purging of unfinancial members

Section 172 of the RO Act requires an organisation to remove from its register, persons who have been unfinancial for more than 24 months within the next ensuing 12 months as follows:

- (1) If:
 - (a) the rules of an organisation require a member to pay dues in relation to the person's membership of the organisation; and
 - (b) the member has not paid the amount; and
 - (c) a continuous period of 24 months has elapsed since the amount became payable; and

An organisation and its branches are, in normal circumstances, separate reporting units – refer s242.

 (d) the member's name has not been removed from the register kept by the organisation under paragraph 230(1)(a);

the organisation must remove the name and postal address of the member from the register within 12 months after the end of the 24 month period.

Note: This subsection is a civil penalty provision (see section 305).

- (2) In calculating a period for the purposes of paragraph (1)(c), any period in relation to which the member was not required by the rules of the organisation to pay the dues is to be disregarded.
- (3) A person whose name is removed from the register under this section ceases to be a member of the organisation on the day his or her name is removed. This subsection has effect in spite of anything in the rules of the organisation.

Note: A non-financial member's membership might cease and his or her name be removed from the register earlier than is provided for by this section if the organisation's own rules provide for this to happen.

I note that similar provisions to section 172 are also included in Rule 15(3) of the AWU Rules as follows:

Rule 15 - Ceasing to be a member and purging the register of members ...

- (3) A member is deemed to have resigned if he or she has not paid the annual contribution for a continuous period of 24 months. In such case the Branch Secretary must remove the name and postal address of the member from the register within 12 months after the end of the 24 month period.
- (4) In calculating the period for the purpose of subrule (3), any period in relation to which the member was not required by the rules of the organisation to pay the dues is to be disregarded.

A person whose name is removed from the register under subrule (3) ceases to be a member of the organisation on the day that the person is removed.

4. Summary of recent correspondence

On 15 November 2016, I advised the AWU that the total membership figures disclosed in recent annual returns (measured as at 31 December) and financial reports (measured as at 30 June) for the AWU National Office had been identical (as set out below). I also noted that such identical figures, six months apart, were inherently unlikely and I sought a response from the organisation.

On 25 November 2016, by return correspondence, you stated that:

 \dots the AWU acknowledges \dots there is an error in its historic membership numbers recorded in its Financial Reports for June 2009 - 2014

You also advised that the AWU financial reports had erroneously 'reflected the membership numbers' in prior annual returns, that the AWU had changed its practices and 'would consider taking remedial action if required to do so'.

On 20 December 2016, I requested the AWU to commence an audit of the membership figures in both its annual returns and financial reports from 2009 to 2014.

On 21 March 2017, you forwarded a three page 'internal audit' of the membership records (membership report) from 2009 to 2015 which stated:

- In relation to national AWU annual returns the membership report stated that the
 national figures 'were referenced to all contemporaneous supporting documentation
 provided to the [AWU] National Office by each Branch' and no discrepancies were
 identified in relation to those figures.
- In relation to national AWU financial reports the membership audit confirmed that duplicate figures from prior annual returns had been included in financial reports. It also provided amended figures for the National financial reports from 2009 to 2015 with the amount of the variances. An excerpt from the table is provided below:

The membership report also proposed that the AWU would provide 'a separate [correcting] statement for each of the financial years impacted; 30 June 2009-2015 as stated further above.

5. General review of the membership figures in the AWU


While dealing with this matter, I have particularly endeavoured to identify and, if possible, understand any apparent trends or patterns in reported AWU membership over time so as to better understand the AWU as a registered organisation. To assist me in that task, I took the opportunity of reviewing the membership figures of the AWU over an extended period between 2005 to 2016.

A table of the membership figures disclosed in both financial reports and annual returns from 2005 to 2016 is provided at Annexure A. These figures include the revised membership figures included in the AWU's membership report.

This excerpt omits from the table the separate columns for each branch and the footnotes.

A graph of the membership figures provided in financial reports of the branches (and the national total of those figures) between 2005 and 2016 is provided in Table 3 below.

6. Membership in annual returns higher than financial reports

Having regard to the membership figures set out in Annexure A (which incorporate the revised figures provided in the AWU's membership report) I note that contrary to the information in the statutory returns previously lodged, membership figures in annual returns were, on average, 2,985 higher than those in financial reports from 2009 to 2015.

The discrepancies are particularly common in certain branches³ – for example:

- Newcastle Branch the annual return figures were, on average, 13% higher than the figures in the branch's financial reports from 2009 to 2015 – refer to Annexure A⁴
- Tasmanian Branch the annual return figures were, on average, 25% higher than the figures in the branch's financial reports from 2009 to 2015 – refer to Annexure A.

7. Queensland Branch - issues regarding membership

Also having regard to the membership figures set out in Table 3 and Annexure A, I note that the most significant changes in AWU reported membership between 2005 and 2016 were in Queensland.

The membership figures in annual returns for the Victorian Branch were also, on average, 7.5% higher than those disclosed in the branch's financial reports from 2009 to 2015.

The separate NSW branches were merged into one branch in September 2016.

In light of that, I have collated the following additional data regarding the Queensland Branch from 2003 to 2016:

- the number of total members reported in financial reports;
- the number of financial members reported in financial reports; and
- the membership income reported in financial reports.

This information is set out in Tables 4 and 5 below.

When considering this membership data for the Queensland Branch, a number of issues became apparent - for example:

- it was unclear to me how the average number of financial members could fall from about 47,000 (in 2004 to 2006) to about 33,000 (in 2007 to 2014) without any apparent fall in the membership income of the branch;
- it was unclear how unfinancial members could rise so substantially from 2007 to 2012;
 and
- given that the Queensland Branch purportedly had:
 - more than 20,000 unfinancial members from 30 June 2009 to 30 June 2012;
 and
 - 28,320 unfinancial members in late 2012 constituting 45% of the branch's membership

it was unclear whether the AWU has purged unfinancial members within 36 months as required under s172 of the RO Act and AWU Rule 15.



8. Identifying and understanding any trends or patterns


As I have earlier indicated, I have particularly endeavoured to identify and, if possible, understand any apparent trends or patterns in reported AWU membership over time so as to better understand the AWU as a registered organisation. I considered that it might be useful to drill down into membership data the AWU has reported and in one approach, a graph was produced at Table 6 below which represents increases or decreases in AWU membership between 2009 and 2015 at six month intervals.

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In each year the Queensland Branch's Operating Report (in the financial report) provided the number of members in the branch as well as the number of financial members and unfinancial members – except for the years ended 30 June 2003 to 2008 when the Operating Report only provided the number of members (and 2003 when no number was provided). However the Queensland Branch also lodged for years ended 30 June 2003 to 2008 an Accounting Officer's Certificate for both the Queensland Branch of the AWU and the Queensland State union ('The Australian Workers' Union, Queensland' (AWUQ)) which provided the number of financial and unfinancial members for both entities.

The Queensland Branch's Operating Report (in the financial report) stated there were 45,250 members in this year – but the related Accounting Officer's certificate for the Queensland Branch and the AWUQ stated that there were 45,250 financial members and 4,457 unfinancial members (which totals 49,707).



Based on this data, I was unable to discern any apparent trends or patterns which assisted my understanding of membership issues in the AWU.

Taking a slightly different approach based on the same reporting period (2009 – 2015), a graph was produced at Table 8 below which represents comparisons between the reported membership in financial reports as compared to annual returns.

Based on this graph, I was unable to discern any apparent trends or patterns which assisted my understanding of membership issues in the AWU, other than the general membership decline and for reasons which remain unclear, that some branch annual return figures are on average higher than the figures in financial reports for those branches.

9. Observations emerging from the AWU reported membership data 2009 - 2015

In my correspondence of 15 November 2016, I noted that the AWU declined to participate in a 2015 voluntary survey of all federally registered unions conducted by the Regulatory Compliance Branch of the FWC concerning the population, maintenance and purging of membership registers. As a result of this the regulator's understanding about those matters in so far as the AWU is concerned, is consequently limited. For that reason, a number of assumptions have been made about membership reporting which I will include in addition to my observations below.

In that context and having had the opportunity of reviewing reported AWU membership data, particularly for the period 2009 – 2015, I noted as I indicate above that it was unclear why in some periods, there appeared to be higher member figures being reported in annual returns than there were in financial reports.

In addition, I make the following observations:

Fluctuations in membership numbers

I note the following points:

- a. According to the revised figures provided, the AWU had 134,174 members as at 30 June 2012 as reported in the relevant financial report but only 121,448 as at 31 December 2012 as reported in the Annual Return.
 - If the figures are accurate, it is not readily apparent to me how the AWU could experience a reduction of approximately 12,700 members in a six month period.
- b. Similarly, according to the revised figures, the AWU had 121,660 members as at 30 June 2010 but 132,956 as at 31 December 2010.
 - If the figures are accurate, it is not readily apparent to me how the AWU could experience an increase of approximately 11,000 members in a six month period.
- c. According to its financial report, the Queensland Branch had 62,726 members as at 30 June 2012. However, that number had fallen to 47,248 as at 31 December 2012 as reported in the Annual Return. This represents a decrease of approximately 25% in a six month period.
 - If the figures are accurate, it is not readily apparent to me how the Queensland Branch could experience a 25% reduction in financial members in a six month period.
- d. According to the revised figures you have provided, the membership of the AWU declined from 139,329 on 31 December 2011 to 121,448 on 31 December 2012 as reported in the relevant annual returns. However, the revised figures for the financial reports for 30 June 2011 to 30 June 2012 indicate that the AWU's membership increased from 131,347 to 134,174
 - If the figures are accurate, it is not readily apparent to me how the membership of the AWU could decline by approximately 18,000 in the twelve months preceding 31 December 2012 in the annual return yet show an increase in the financial report of approximately 3,000 during the period of 30 June 2011 to 30 June 2012.
- e. According the to the revised figures provided, from 30 June 2012 to 30 June 2013 the membership of the AWU declined from 134,174 to 114,356 as reported in the relevant financial reports. However, according to the figures provided in the annual returns for 30 December 2012 to 30 December 2013 the membership of the AWU only declined from 121,448 to 120,289.
 - If the figures are accurate, it is not readily apparent to me how the AWU could experience a decline of approximately 20,000 members in the twelve months preceding 30 June 2013 as reported in the financial report but a decline of membership of only about 1,000 members during the period of 31 December 2012 to 31 December 2013 as reported in the annual return.
- f. According to the revised figures and the figures presented in the relevant annual returns, the AWU has experienced significant fluctuations in its membership from 31 December 2009 to 31 December 2015 (refer to Table 6 which is the graph "Increase/decrease in membership at six month intervals).

If the figures are accurate, it is not readily apparent to me how the AWU experienced a decline of over 8,300 members (or 6.4% of its total membership) from 1 January 2010 to 30 June 2010 but then had a surge in membership of approximately 11,300 members (representing an increase of 9.3%) from 1 July 2010 to 31 December 2010.

Maintenance of register and reporting of membership

Section 230 requires changes to the register of members of an organisation to be completed, in normal circumstances, within 28 days.

Rule 7(2) of the AWU Rules also provides that a person becomes a member from the date that the first payment of his/her membership contribution is received.

It is assumed that the register or data base of each branch is updated to reflect these requirements although it is not readily apparent whether the Branch Executive of each branch formally confirms new members, resignations and cessation of membership during its meetings.

While the statutory responsibility to lodge an annual return set out in subsections 233(1)(a) and (b) of the RO Act falls to the national office of registered organisations it is not readily apparent what oversight the national office of the AWU provides over the registers or data bases kept and maintained by each branch or what systems are in place to ensure the integrity of the membership data kept and maintained by each branch.

For the purposes of reporting the total number of members of the AWU in its national annual returns and national financial reports, it is assumed that the national office requires each branch to provide accurate membership data as at the appropriate date (i.e as at 31 December for annual returns and as at the end of the relevant financial year for financial reports).

Relationship with state organisations

Rule 8(5) of the AWU Rules provides that an application for membership of the AWU is deemed to be an application for membership of the relevant state-registered union in NSW, Queensland, South Australia and Western Australia.

It is not readily apparent whether each branch of the AWU and its state counterpart keeps and maintains separate registers or a single register from which data is extracted. If branches and their state counterparts maintain a single register, it is not known whether that approach has resulted in any particular issues, problems or concerns.

Purging of the register

As previously indicated, Rule 15(3) of the AWU Rules, provides that the relevant Branch Secretary must remove the name and address of a member from the register if he/she has not paid the annual contribution for a continuous period of 24 months (noting the effect of section 172 of the RO Act in this regard). Rule 15(6) similarly provides for the purging of unemployed or ill members at the end of the second year.

It is not readily apparent how regularly purging of the AWU register(s) occurs. For example, it is not readily apparent whether purging occurs on an ongoing basis (i.e immediately after a

particular member or members have not paid contributions for 24 months) or whether it occurs at a particular time or times.

Seasonal variations or fluctuations in membership

Unlike some other trade unions, it is not readily apparent whether there are seasonal variations or fluctuations of the levels of membership within the AWU or particular branches of the AWU and if there are such variations or fluctuations, what the extent of them might be. That type of information might assist the regulator to better understand the AWU as a registered organisation.

10. Conclusion

As referred to above, I have reviewed the AWU's membership audit which you provided and it indicated that contrary to the information in the statutory returns previously lodged, membership figures in annual returns were, on average, 2,985 higher than those in financial reports from 2009 to 2015.

Based on the available membership data provided over time by the AWU, I have also made a number of observations about historical AWU membership figures such as, for example:

- a. If the figures are accurate, it is not readily apparent how the membership of the AWU could experience such significant changes of members (in the order of 12,700 members in one six month period and 11,000 members in a separate six month period);
- b. If the figures are accurate, it is not readily apparent how the AWU experienced a decline of over 8,300 members (or 6.4% of its total membership) in one six month period but then had a surge in membership of approximately 11,300 members (representing an increase of 9.3%) in the very next six month period; and
- c. If the figures are accurate, it is not readily apparent how the Queensland Branch could record such significant variances in financial and non financial membership (including a decrease of 25% in one six month period) without observable and concomitant variations in membership subscriptions.

I acknowledge that the AWU has invested time and resources in the conduct of an internal audit, the results of which were attached to your 21 March 2017 correspondence. However, it has become apparent to me that having regard to the observations I have made in this letter, it would be important for the AWU to arrange for the conduct of an independent audit of its membership data between 2009 – 2015. The purpose of such an independent audit would be to provide a level of confidence to members, the regulator and the community more broadly about the integrity of AWU membership reporting and the ability of the AWU to meet its statutory reporting obligations.

11. Recommendation

It is my recommendation that the AWU commission an external audit of AWU membership reporting in annual returns and financial reports between 2009 – 2015 which takes into account and seeks to explain AWU membership issues including but not limited to:

a. The significant variances in reported membership generally;

- b. The variances between membership reported in annual returns as compared to financial returns;
- c. Whether the AWU is meeting its statutory obligations to purge registers in accordance with the RO Act and AWU Rules; and
- d. How the Queensland Branch (representing approximately 40% of AWU membership):
 - could experience a significant increase in the number of its total members until about 2012 (which appears to have commenced in about 2007) without any apparent increase in the branch's membership income;
 - ii. could experience a significant increase in the number of its unfinancial members (which appears to have commenced in about 2007) without any apparent increase in the number of financial members beforehand (given that a new member would typically commence as a financial member and then, in some cases, lapse into being an unfinancial member due to a failure to pay membership subscriptions);
 - iii. could experience a significant decrease in its total membership from 2012 to 2015;
 - iv. could experience significant reductions in financial membership over time without any apparent reduction in membership income (noting this was particularly prevalent from about 2012 to 2015 and also in the earlier period of 2003 to 2006);
 - v. could experience such significant changes to its membership as set out above without similar changes being reflected in other branches of the AWU.⁷

12. Lodging of remedy documents

As I earlier indicated, in your letter of 21 March 2017, you stated that the AWU intended to provide the relevant remedy documents referred to in the membership audit. I have indicated that lodging of those remedy documents is required to ensure that section 254 has been complied with for the relevant financial years.

While I have previously highlighted that subsections 172(1), 230(1) and 230(2) and sections 233 and 254 are a civil penalty provisions, I also draw to your attention the following power available to the Commissioner in the RO Act regarding the register of members kept by an organisation under sections 230 and 231:

235 Commissioner may authorise access to certain records

(1) A person (the *authorised person*) authorised by the Commission may inspect, and make copies of, or take extracts from, the records kept by an organisation under sections 230 and 231 (the *records*) at such times as the Commissioner specifies.

Apart from a rise and fall in the membership of the Victorian Branch during some of that period.

13. Timeframe for lodging documents

I request that you provide the remedy documents by Friday 2 June 2017. I also request by that date, your advice about the recommendation I have made above.

I refer to previous correspondence regarding the above matter.

In your last correspondence you requested the AWU to advise what steps had been taken to remedy membership differences between the Annual Return and Financial Report for the period highlighted.

Attached to this letter is a document prepared by the AWU's National Office Financial Controller in relation to his work in reviewing the membership numbers reported in each document. It outlines the basis for the review, the methodology used and the documents examined. It also includes a recommendation on the action to be taken to remedy any differences identified.

I also note that the FWC is currently conducting an investigation (INV2016/5) into certain referrals made by the Trade Union Royal Commission. As you are aware, an aspect of the FWC investigation relates to the members' register in the AWU Vic Branch.

The work conducted by the AWU's National Office Financial Controller has not sought to deal with the matters, which are presently the subject of the FWC investigation. The AWU will of course further consider these matters after the FWC investigation and/or any subsequent processes.

It is the intention of the AWU to provide the relevant remedy documents referred to under the heading "Remedy of Discrepancies" in the attached audit report for lodgement and uploading on to the Fair Work Commission's website

MEMBERSHIP REPORTING

INTERNAL AUDIT PERIOD 2009-2015

BACKGROUND

In their letter of 15 November 2016, the Regulatory and Compliance Branch (**RCB**) of the Fair Work Commission (**FWC**) identified discrepancies in membership reporting by the AWU National Office for the period 2009-2015.

The discrepancy identified by the RCB was that AWU membership numbers as at 30 June, reported in the General Purpose Operating Report (Financial Report) were identical to the membership numbers reported in the immediately previous Annual Return.

The AWU acknowledged this discrepancy in its response in its letter of 25 November 2016, noting an incorrect practice of replicating Annual Return membership numbers in the subsequent Financial Report.

In its acknowledgement, of the AWU's response, on 20 December 2016 RCB requested that AWU prepared to conduct an internal audit.

On 2 March 2017, the AWU National Executive resolved to conduct the internal audit.

The RCB in its letter of 6 March 2017 requests a response on the actions AWU planned to take to resolve the discrepancies and if an audit is proposed

- How the audit is to be conducted, including its terms of reference;
- The documents such an audit would examine
- How correct figures may be verified; and
- The proposed completion date

AUDIT & TERMS OF REFERENCE

TERMS OF REFERENCE

The purpose of the internal audit will be to identify AWU membership numbers for necessary amended reporting to RCB for the period 2009-2015.

The process undertaken by the AWU National Office Financial Controller is outlined below.

ANNUAL RETURN

- The AWU's Annual Return was examined for the reporting periods ending 31 December 2009-2015
- The Annual Return membership numbers were referenced to all contemporaneous supporting documentation provided to the National Office by each Branch in support of their membership numbers reporting.

The number of members identified by this process for the purposes of the Annual Return was recorded in a *Reconciliation document (Attachment A*

- Annual Report Table)

FINANCIAL REPORTS - General Purpose Financial Reports

- The audited General Purpose Financial Reports of each Branch (Reporting Unit) of the AWU will be examined for the financial years ended 30 June 2009-2015
- The number of members reported in the Branch Executive Committee Operating Report and Statement will be recorded in a Reconciliation document (Attachment A – Financial Report Table)

VARIANCES AND COMMENTARY

- All variances between those reported in the Financial Reports of each Branch and those reported in the National Office Financial Report have been recorded in the *Reconciliation document (Attachment A)*
- Commentary was included in the *Reconciliation document* where the reasons for any variances were known

AUDIT PERIOD

The Internal audit was conducted from March 6th - 17th 2017

REMEDY OF DISCREPANCIES

It is proposed that the AWU provide FWC a separate statement for each of the Financial years impacted; 30 June 2009-2015, which is to be read in conjunction with the Financial Report for that financial year which restates the membership numbers reported in that Financial year.

Concerns about the validity of AWU membership reporting AR2016/161

I refer to previous correspondence, including my letter dated 20 December 2016, regarding what the AWU has conceded to be inaccurate historical membership reporting.

As you would be aware, the Fair Work Commission (**FWC**) takes the statutory reporting obligations of registered organisations seriously, particularly when inaccuracies in that reporting may amount to contraventions of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act* 2009 (the **RO Act**).

As previously advised, the acknowledgement of membership reporting discrepancies in your letter dated 25 November 2016 (while welcomed) did not, of itself, resolve the matter. The intention of my letter was to articulate that the FWC expects instances of incorrect membership data – which give rise to potential contraventions of the RO Act – to be remedied.

I had anticipated that the expectations of the FWC were clear when I provided the following in my letter of 20 December 2016:

'The Commission takes the statutory reporting obligations of registered organisations seriously and in these circumstances, expects that potential contraventions of the RO Act, at the least between 2009 and 2014 are remedied.'

The purpose of this letter is to ascertain what steps have been taken by the AWU to remedy its inaccurate membership deficiencies, at the least between 2009 and 2014 and what the outcomes of those steps have been.

If the AWU has not yet remedied the membership reporting deficiencies, please advise, by 21 March 2017, what steps the AWU proposes to take to resolve the question of membership reporting discrepancies.

If an audit is proposed, please outline:

- how the audit is to be conducted, including its terms of reference;
- · the documents that such an audit would examine;
- how correct membership figures may be verified; and
- the proposed completion date.

Concerns about the validity of AWU membership reporting AR2016/161

On 25 November 2016 I acknowledged your letter responding to concerns about the validity of AWU membership reporting in AR2016/161. I advised that the contents of your response would be considered and a detailed response provided.

A number of significant priorities are currently impacting on the Regulatory Compliance Branch (RCB) of the Fair Work Commission (the Commission) not least of which is the focus on a transition to a Registered Organisations Commission, work being conducted on transitionally registered associations which expire on 31 December 2016 and the release of an online permit application form on 21 December 2016. I apologise that attention to these and other issues have not yet enabled a proper consideration of your response to concerns about the validity of AWU membership reporting in AR2016/161.

I propose to return to the AWU membership issue as soon as possible but in the meantime, I provide some preliminary observations for your consideration.

- The RO Act sets out the standards required of registered organisations, including that they be efficiently and effectively managed by demonstrating high standards of accountability to their members;
- The Commission's concerns about what you have conceded to be inaccurate historical membership reporting in contravention of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 (the RO Act) are not resolved merely by your acknowledgement of error;
- The Commission takes the statutory reporting obligations of registered organisations seriously and in these circumstances, expects that instances of incorrect membership data giving rise to potential contraventions of the RO Act, at the least between 2009 and 2014 are remedied:
- I note your explanation of error by the previous Financial Controller and also note that it is the statutory responsibility of designated officers to conduct due diligence to ensure the correct membership numbers are reported before certifying they are correct.

There are a range of regulatory options open to the Commission to ensure that the AWU meets its statutory reporting obligations and the Commission intends to consider those options to ensure that members of the AWU, other registered organisations and the community more broadly are able to have confidence in the AWU's membership reporting. The Commission does not currently have a sufficient level of confidence in the statutory membership reporting of the AWU.

In your letter of 25 November 2016, you included the following:

'We hope this resolves your concerns about the AWU historical membership reporting. However, if you consider that there is remedial action that the AWU should take to correct this error, we would be pleased to discuss this matter with you.'

It will be clear from this interim response that the concerns of the Commission are not resolved by a mere acknowledgement of error. As I indicated above, I propose to return to this issue as soon as possible. In the meantime, I request that the AWU begins immediate preparations to conduct an internal audit of its membership, for both financial and calendar year periods, between 2009 and 2014 inclusive for the purpose of correcting the errors.

Thank you for your extension to allow us to further consider the information raised in your letter dated 15 November 2016.

The AWU acknowledges that the membership number reported in the Financial Reports reflected the membership number reported in the Annual Reports for the periods specified. We note that this occurred in periods in which the AWU's membership numbers were growing and also declining.

The preparation of the Financial Reports was delegated to the Financial Controller of the AWU. The Financial Reports for 2009 – 2013 were prepared by a Financial Controller who is no longer employed by the AWU.

In relation the financial report for 2014, this financial report was prepared by the current AWU Financial Controller. He had commenced employment with the AWU in April 2014 and prepared the 2014 financial report which was lodged in December 2015. In preparing this Financial Report, he reviewed the previous Financial Reports and Annual Reports and noted that the previous Financial Reports had replicated the membership number of the immediately prior Annual Report. In light of this, he continued this practice for the 2014 Financial Report.

In 2015, the AWU revised its reporting of membership numbers for the 2015 Financial Report. In that regard, it obtained information of AWU membership numbers of its individual branches as at 30 June 2015. Consequently, the AWU membership numbers reported in the 2015 Financial Report reflects a compilation of branch membership numbers as June 2015.

The AWU acknowledges that there is an error in its historic membership numbers recorded in its Financial Reports for June 2009 – 2014. However, in 2015, it optimised its reporting on membership numbers in the 2015 Financial Report. Furthermore, it has had the benefit of the FWC's detailed review of its financial reporting conducted in respect of its 2015 Financial Report. As, you will be aware, arising from this detailed review, the AWU further improved its financial reporting for 2015. These improvements are also incorporated in the 2016 Financial Report.

We hope this resolves your concerns about the AWU historical membership reporting. However, if you consider that there is remedial action that the AWU should take to correct this error, we would pleased to discuss this matter with you.

Concerns about the validity of AWU membership reporting - AR2016/161

Since 2015, the Regulatory Compliance Branch (RCB) of the Fair Work Commission (FWC) has been actively seeking to develop a better understanding of entities registered under the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 (the RO Act).

An area of interest for the RCB is the reporting of membership of registered organisations. As you would be aware, there are obligations on registered organisations to report membership numbers as part of the annual return of information required to be lodged with the FWC by 31 March each year as well as separate obligations to report financial membership numbers as part of the requirement to lodge an operating report at the conclusion of each financial year.

In 2015, the RCB commenced research into a range of matters associated with the requirements in the RO Act for registered organisations to maintain a register of members and to report membership to the FWC. As part of that research, the FWC requested the AWU to complete a survey / questionnaire to assist the regulator to better understand how its membership registers are populated, maintained and purged and the circumstances in which a person is recorded as a member of the registered organisation.

The AWU elected not to complete the FWC survey /questionnaire. Consequently the RCB's understanding of the AWU's situation is more limited than its understanding of the many other Unions who participated in its survey.

Since 2015, concerns have emerged about the validity of membership reporting to FWC as a result of the identification of serious and systemic inaccurate membership reporting by a separate registered organisation. This has resulted in the RCB commencing a review of historical membership data of other federally registered organisations.

I have conducted a preliminary review of AWU membership data from Annual Returns and Financial Reports between 2009 and 2015 and I provide the table below based on that review:

Preliminary analysis

It has emerged from my preliminary analysis of reported membership data, that between 2009 and 2014, the AWU financial report (FR) for each year cited the exact number of members from the previous Annual Return (AR). For example, in the June 2014 FR the union reported 120,289 members. The identical number as had been reported in the AR for 31 December 2013. This pattern has occurred in each of the years between 2009 and 2014.

The AWU has a financial year which ends on 30 June and it is of course inherently unlikely that the number of financial members of any registered organisation, including the AWU as at 30 June each year would be exactly the same as the number of members as at 31 December the preceding year over a period of years. The reported declining trend in membership in Table 2 adds weight, in my view, to that inherent unlikelihood. I note that the pattern operating between 2009 to 2014 inclusive, appears to have changed for the 2015 reporting period.

While I do not propose to speculate about what might have been occurring at this stage, I advise that the integrity of AWU historical membership reporting has become an issue.

Statutory reporting

Section 5 of the RO Act sets out the intention of Parliament to, among other things:

- ensure that employer and employee organisations registered under the RO Act are representative
 of and accountable to their members, and are able to operate effectively;
- b. encourage members to participate in the affairs of organisations to which they belong; and
- encourage the efficient management of organisations and high standards of accountability of organisations to their members.

The obligation to lodge Annual Return information under s 233 of the RO Act falls directly on the National Office of the AWU and this includes the lodgement of a declaration signed by the Secretary or other prescribed officer certifying that the register of its members has, during the immediately preceding calendar year, been kept and maintained as required.

An important part of the regulatory framework requires the FWC to be satisfied that an organisation has met the legislative obligations set out in the RO Act and the various civil penalty provisions (including in s 233) are designed to ensure compliance with these obligations.

It may be of interest for you to observe the current membership inquiries currently being conducted with the Communications Electrical, Electronic, Energy, Information Postal, Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia (CEPU) which are publicly available via https://www.fwc.gov.au/documents/documents/organisations/registered-orgs/128v/128v-ar2016-148.pdf to CEPU AR2016/148. It may provide you with some context about the work the RCB is currently undertaking in the area of membership reporting.

For the avoidance of doubt, I advise that my queries above are not in any way related to the current investigation into the Victorian Branch of the AWU which was commenced on 2 November 2016 and appears on the FWC web site.

I request that you provide a response to the concerns I have expressed above by Friday 18 November 2016.



Dear Colleagues,

Re: National Executive Resolutions – Rule change regarding SA Branch Executive composition & filling of National VP position

RULE CHANGE

The Australian Workers' Union, South Australian Branch Executive has recently endorsed some amendments to its composition as specified in Rule 33 (7) (j) of the AWU Rules.

It is proposed to delete the current Rule 33 (7) (j) and insert the following:

- (j) In the case of the South Australian Branch there is to be a Branch Executive comprising the following:
 - One Branch Secretary (full time)
 - One Branch President (honorary)
 - One Branch Assistant Secretary (full time)
 - Two Branch Vice Presidents (honorary)
 - Three Branch Organisers Branch Executive Committee Members (full time)
 - Nine Branch Executive Committee Members (honorary)

In addition there is to be one elected Branch Organiser (full time) who is not a member of the Branch Executive.

The effect of the variation is to reduce the number of Branch Organiser – Branch Executive Committee Member (full time) positions from four to three and the number of Branch Executive Committee Member (honorary) positions from eleven to nine.

NATIONAL VICE-PRESIDENT POSITION

The National Office has received written confirmation that on Friday, 8 July 2016 Wayne Hanson resigned from his position as Branch Secretary of the South Australian Branch of The Australian Workers' Union. On Friday, 8 July 2016 the South Australian Branch Executive carried the following resolution appointing Peter Lamps to fill the casual vacancy in accordance with Rule 65 (1):

"That this AWU Branch Executive appoints Peter Lamps to fill the casual vacancy of Branch Secretary following the resignation of Wayne Hanson from that position in accordance with the Rules of the Union."

The National Office has also received written confirmation that on Friday, 8 July 2016 Peter Lamps resigned from his positon as National Vice-President.



They must be certified by a declaration stating that it is a correct statement of the information contained in that record, signed by the Secretary or such other elected official who is required under the rules, or by resolution of the organisation, to keep the relevant records (**other prescribed officer** see r.150 of the RO Regulations).

Failure to comply with these obligations is subject to a civil penalty provision – see s.305 of the RO Act.

Obligation to notify of changes within 35 days

If there are any changes during the year to the offices, officeholders, branches (where relevant) or the address of the organisation and/or its branches an organisation must, within 35 days of the change, lodge with the Commission, a notification of such changes certified by declaration signed by the secretary or other prescribed officer of the organisation to be a correct statement of the changes made [RO Act s.233(2) and RO Regulations r.151 refer].
