The New South Wales Sub-Branch and the Victorian Sub-Branch must respectively elect pursuant to RULE 63 METHOD OF BALLOTING - DIRECT ELECTORAL SYSTEM, two persons from each Sub-Branch who, together with the Branch Secretary will comprise the Branch Executive College.

The members of the Branch Executive College must elect one Branch President pursuant to RULE 64 METHOD OF BALLOTING - COLLEGIATE ELECTORAL SYSTEM by and from the Branch Executive.

The members of the Branch Executive College must elect one Branch Vice-President pursuant to RULE 64 METHOD OF BALLOTING - COLLEGIATE ELECTORAL SYSTEM by and from the Branch Executive.

The remaining members of the Branch Executive College must (other than the Branch Secretary) become the Branch Executive Committee Members

There is to be a Branch Executive comprising the following:

- One Branch President (honorary)
- One Branch Vice-President (honorary)
- One Branch Secretary (who is also to be the Sub-Branch Secretary of the Victorian Sub-Branch and the New South Wales Sub-Branch) (full time)
- Two Branch Executive Committee Members (honorary)
- (8) Except as otherwise provided in this Rule, any Commonwealth Territory, other than the Australian Capital Territory and the Northern Territory, is deemed to be part of the Branch closest to or contiguous with any such Territory.
- (9) No Branch is able to be dissolved without the consent of the relevant Branch Executive.

This sub-rule must not be varied in respect to any Branch without the consent of the relevant Branch Executive.

RULE 32 - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

(1) National President:

- (a) There is to be 1 National President who is to be honorary and who is the chief Executive Officer of the Union, and who has the power to convene meetings of National Conference and the National Executive. It is the National President's duty to further the well being and objects of the Union, preside at all Conferences and meetings of National Executive and see that the business is conducted in accordance with these Rules. No salary attaches to the Office of National President, but an allowance as determined from time to time by National Conference is to be paid.
- (b) The National President has a deliberative vote only, and, in the case where he also holds the Office of Branch Secretary, he is entitled to vote in respect to the Office of Branch Secretary in addition to his deliberative vote.
- (c) The National President must carry out such other functions as are determined from time to time by the National Conference, National Executive, or the National Secretary.

(2) National Vice-Presidents:

- (a) There are to be five (5) National Vice Presidents all of whom are to be honorary and one of whom must hold office in accordance with the provisions of Rule.82.
- (b) The National Vice Presidents must carry out such duties and functions as are determined from time to time by the National Conference, National Executive or the National Secretary.
- (c) In the event of the illness of, or in the absence of the National President a National Vice President must act as National President and must carry out all the duties and exercise all the powers of the National President. In the absence of agreement amongst the National Vice Presidents as to whom will act as National President the National Conference or National Executive may determine the matter.

(3) National Secretary:

There is to be 1 full time National Secretary who has the powers, duties and/or functions to:

- (a) Act generally according to the directions of the National Conference or National Executive and be responsible for the care, control, superintendence, management and administration in all respects of the affairs, business, funds and property of the Union, subject to any directions from National Conference or National Executive.
- (b) Appoint, control and dismiss the staff of the National Office.
- (c) Cause to be kept a correct account of all moneys received and expended, but shall under no consideration pay, lend or otherwise appropriate any of the funds of the Union to any member or cause whatsoever, except in accordance with the Rules or resolutions of the National Executive or National Conference.
- (d) Attend all meetings of National Conference and National Executive and have Minutes taken of such meetings.
- (b) Attend to and sign all correspondence and keep copies of and a record of the postage of all correspondence.
- (c) Make demands on employers and prospective employers to advance the interests of the Union and/or its members and/or for the improvement and/or retention of wages and conditions of employment of employees who are members of or eligible to be members of the Union and to add to, vary or withdraw any demand at his discretion.
- (g) Assist the Auditors when auditing the accounts of the Union.
- (h) Correspond whenever necessary with the Branches.
- (i) Supply all Branches with decisions of the National Executive on any questions submitted to it affecting such Branch.
- (j) As far as practicable and subject to Rules 17(11), 44(1)(g) and 46(1)(h) having been complied with, keep the following records:
 - a register of members, showing the name and postal address of each member and showing whether the member became a member under an agreement entered into under Rules made under Section 202 of the Workplace Relations Act (1996);
 - (ii) a list of the Offices in the organisation and each branch of the organisation;
 - (iii) a list of the names, postal addresses and occupations of the persons holding the Offices.

)

- (k) Prepare or have prepared such documents, including notifications of industrial disputes, for such tribunal as are required from time to time by National Office and to conduct cases before the tribunal on behalf of the Union and be empowered to authorise and direct any Officer or paid employees of the Union to prepare papers for presentation to the tribunal, conduct cases before the tribunal and the National Secretary or such Officer or any authorised employee may if necessary act on behalf of the Union in any dispute which may arise which is within the province of National Office.
- (l) Carry out such other functions as are determined from time to time by the National Conference or National Executive.
- (m) Engage legal assistance if deemed necessary to assist the Union or any Officer or employee of the Union in any of the above matters or in regard to any matter which the National Secretary is entitled to have brought before any tribunal or in regard to which the National Secretary is entitled to give assistance to a member under the Rules.
- (n) Report the result of any ballots conducted by the General Returning Officer to the next meeting of National Conference insofar as delegates to Conference are concerned, and to the next meeting of the National Executive insofar as members of the National Executive are concerned.
- (o) Hold property on trust on behalf of the Union upon such terms and conditions as the National Executive shall determine from time to time in its absolute discretion.
- (p) Require any Officer or employee of the Union to assist the National Secretary in the performance of any of his duties and/or functions.
- (q) Require the production and supply of any information or record from Branches which in the opinion of the National Secretary will assist him in the performance of his duties and/or functions.

(4) Assistant National Secretary:

There is to be I full time Assistant National Secretary who is to act generally according to the directions of the National Conference, National Executive or the National Secretary.

TEMPORARY APPOINTMENT OF NATIONAL OFFICERS

(5) The National Executive may if it thinks it necessary, empower any member thereof to exercise all or any of the powers and to perform all or any of the duties

of any National Officer during any temporary absence of such Officer from duty, or while he is carrying out the duties and exercising the powers of another Officer pursuant to this Rule, or pending the holding of an election to fill a vacancy in the position of any such National Officer. Any act of a person so empowered is, within the limits of his authority, to be of the same force and effect as the acts of the Officer whose power and duties he had been empowered to exercise and perform. For the avoidance of doubt periods of annual leave do not constitute temporary absence from duty.

In addition to my letter dated 22 January 2001, please find attached a more detailed outline of the positions for nomination taken from Rule 33 of the Rules of the Australian Workers' Union for the upcoming 2001 Elections.

In the attached document you will note that the whole Branch structure for the Tobacco Workers Branch has been listed. However it may not be necessary for all the positions to be nominated. In the AWU 1997 Election the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) insisted on conducting the election for the Executive College and the Branch Executive that resulted in nominations for the positions on the Executive College being posted on Election Notices contrary to the rules of the Union.

However, prior to the 1997 Election the Tobacco Workers Union would nominate its own Returning Officer under the rules of the Union and conduct its own Election for the Executive College and Branch Executive. If you would like further clarification on this issue please contact Tobacco Workers' Branch Secretary Norman McBride on 02 9311 1958.

Furthermore, in the letter dated 22 January it was mistakenly noted that the electoral system was a collegiate voting system however this is only true with certain in house Branch elections. The 2001 Australia Workers' union Elections will be determined on a first past the post system in line with the Australian Workers' Union Rule 62 (17).

National Executive: Each Branch is entitled to representation of one member on the AWU National Executive for every 11,000 members or part thereof.

The Branch Secretary is automatically selected for a position on the National Executive. If a Branch has enough members to entitle it to more than one member on the AWU National Executive then this position goes to an election.

National Conference: Each Branch is entitled to one delegate for representation at the National Conference for every 5,500 members or part thereof.

AWU Elections 2001

I refer to letters dated 22 January 2001 and 29 January 2001 from you regarding the arrangements for the elections within the Union this year.

Your letter dated 29 January 2001 provides the most up-to-date information regarding the proposed election arrangements on a national basis and the following comments relate to the issues raised in that letter or the attached prescribed information. I have also received a letter dated 20 February 2001 from Mr Bill Ludwig, Queensland Branch Secretary, that I will consider in the context of the Queensland Branch positions.

In this letter I propose to set out the differences between the information that I have received from the Umion and the offices and positions that I am proposing to make arrangements with the Australian Electoral Commission for the conduct of the elections. In the majority of instances, I believe that these are mainly issues of detail but consider that it is desirable to set these out and confirm my understanding with the Union. However, there are some substantial issues in connection with the Queensland Branch.

Please refer to the annexure to this letter.

Honorary or Full Time?

To avoid any doubt I propose to indicate for each position whether it is a full time or honorary position under the rules.

Positions held on an ex officio basis

There are a number of positions, most notably the Branch Secretary positions, that hold other positions on an ex officio basis under the rules.

I propose to describe in the decision the position of Branch Secretary as 'Branch Secretary/Delegate to National Executive/Delegate to National Conference'. As discussed in my telephone conversation yesterday with Mr Sam Wood, Assistant National Secretary, it is a matter for the Returning Officer to determine whether to include within the title of a position other positions that are held on an ex officio basis. I set out the Branch Secretary position and other positions in this way to make it clear how a position will be filled under the rules of the Union.

I will now consider specific issues that arise in relation to National and Branch positions.

National

The number of National Vice Presidents is specified to be five (5).

Please note that the positions of Delegate to National Executive and Delegate to National Conference are set out under each Branch.

Greater New South Wales Branch

Except as already described, no changes are proposed to the information supplied on 29 January 2001.

Newcastle and Northern Regions Branch

In addition to the changes already described, I propose to set out the Branch Executive Committee Members to be elected from the Sub Branches as Branch positions insetad of listing them as positions under the Sub Branches. My intent is to make clear that the Branch Executive Committee positions are Branch positions, this does not affect the relevant electorate which is set out in the rules.

Port Kembla, South Coast and Southern Highlands Branch

Except as already described, no changes are proposed to the information supplied on 29 January 2001.

Queensland Branch

As mentioned above, I have received information from the National office and from the Queensland Branch in relation to the positions for which elections are required. There is some conflicting information specifically whether or not to make arrangements for the conduct of elections to fill the positions of District Secretaries (full time), Delegates to Branch Delegates Meeting (honorary) and Branch Organisers (full time). In the following I set out my views on whether it is in accordance with the rules of the Union to make election arrangements for these positions.

The positions of District Secretaries (full time), Delegates to Branch Delegates Meeting (honorary) and Branch Organisers (full time) for which the Queensland Branch is seeking elections to be conducted were positions that were conducted in the last quadrennial elections (E No. 2010 of 1997).

I have examined the rules of the Union that applied immediately prior to the 1997 elections (Rules last altered on 6 March 1997) and compared these to the current rules (Rules last altered on 1 March 2001).

Firstly, it should be noted that none of these positions were set out in rule 38 of the 6 March 1997 rules which set out the positions for all of the Branches but provision was found elsewhere in the 6 March 1997 rules for this positions. I will consider each position separately against the applicable rules.

District Secretary

There seems to be little difference between the 6 March 1997 rules and 1 March 2001 rules as they relate to the position of District Secretaries. The applicable 6 March 1997 rules are rules 45, 46 and 64 and the applicable 1 March 2001 rules are rules 40 (combines the former rules 45 and 46) and rule 61. Neither the 6 March 1997 nor the 1 March 2001 rules made express provision for the position of District Secretary to be full time. It appears to me that it would be consistent with the 1997 election arrangements and the rules in force then and now to make provision for the District

Secretary positions in the election arrangements and to specify them as full time as proposed by the Queensland Branch.

Branch Organisers

In relation to the position of Branch Organisers, the 6 March 1997 rules contained rule 65 which provided that the Branch Executive, subject to the approval of the National Executive, was to determine the number of full time positions of Organisers, not being Organiser-Branch Executive Committee Members to be elected. A copy of rule 65 as it appeared in the 6 March 1997 rules is attached.

There does not appear to be any comparable provision in the 1 March 2001 rules. This gives rise to some doubt as to whether there is provision in the rules for Organiser positions to be established separately to the specific provision for Organisers found in rule 33 for other Branches. In my view rule 61 of the 1 March 2001 rules does not make provision for sixteen Organisers (full time). Rule 61 contemplates that there may be Organiser positions due for election not the number of positions nor there location which must be ascertained from elsewhere in the rules.

I appreciate that it is a serious matter for the Union and particularly the Queensland Branch if the Organiser positions are not called for as part of the quadrennial elections. However, in the absence of compelling arguments that the rules make provision for the sixteen organisers in the Queensland Branch, I consider there are only two possible courses of action. The Union could decide to make an urgent alteration to the rules and proceed with the election once provision is made for these positions or the national elections are not further delayed and the Organiser positions are the subject of separate elections.

Delegates to Branch Delegates Meeting

Again, there is little difference between the 6 March 1997 rules and the 1 March 2001 rules as they apply to the position of Delegates to Branch Delegates Meeting. Provision was made for these positions under Rule 41 and a 2 year term of office was provided by Rule 64 under the 6 March 1997 rules. In the case of the current rules, the 1 March 2001 rules, Rule 36 provides for these positions and Rule 61 provides that elections will be conducted quadrennially for these positions.

However, rule 36 provides for the calculation of the entitlements of the Districts to Delegates to Branch Delegates Meeting by reference to the financial membership of the different Districts. It will therefore be necessary to obtain these figures before the arrangements for each District's Delegate positions can be made.

Greater South Australian Branch Whyalla/Woomera Branch Tasmania Branch Victoria Branch

Except as already described, no changes are proposed to the information supplied on 29 January 2001.

TAPS Branch

In addition to the changes already described, I propose to set out the Branch Executive Committee Members to be elected from the Sub Branches as Branch positions insetad of listing them as positions under the Sub Branches. My intent is to make clear that the Branch Executive Committee positions are Branch positions, this does not affect the relevant electorate which is set out in the rules.

Glass and Container Industry Branch

Except as already described, no changes are proposed to the information supplied on 29 January 2001.

Tobacco Workers Branch

In addition to the changes already described, I confirm that in my view it is convenient to set out the different election stages within this Branch and thereby set out all of the positions requiring an election. It is usual for the Registry to set out the positions on a descending basis (e.g. Branch, Sub-Branch) rather than the chronological order of the election within the Branch.

I note that Mr Muscat's letter refers to the Tobacco Workers Branch formerly conducting its own elections. There is no current exemption under s211 of the Workplace Relations Act to permit the Branch to conduct its own elections. It would appear there was an exemption prior to the amalgamation but this exemption ceased effect when the Tobacco Workers Union was deregistered and there is no provision for the exemption to be carried over to the Branch.

The fact that the Branch has a history of conducting elections in relation to particular offices would be favourably considered if an application for an exemption from the requirement that the Australian Electoral Commission were lodged in the Registry. Such applications usually take between 6 weeks to 3 months to process.

I trust this letter adequately explains any variations from the information supplied by the Union. It would be appreciated if the matters raised could be confirmed at the Union's earliest convenience. My telephone number is (02) 8374 6504.

- (6) Provided that candidates, with the consent of their nominators, may withdraw their nomination for any position within seven (7) days of the close of nominations or such other period as may be fixed by the Returning Officer.
- (7) In an election for any Office referred to in Clause (1) of this Rule a member shall only be entitled to vote in the Branch of which he or she is a member.
- (8) In the event of there being more candidates nominated than are required for any of the Offices, an election shall take place by secret postal ballot in accordance with these Rules.

RULE 65 - ELECTION AND CONTROL OF ORGANISERS

- (1) Prior to the date for calling nominations for the regular elections of Officers in accordance with Rule 64 of these Rules, the Branch Executive shall determine the number of full-time positions of Organisers, not being Organiser-Branch Executive Committee Members to be elected at such election and the number of employed Organisers to be employed in any Branch, subject to the approval of National Executive. In the National Construction Branch the Branch Executive shall also determine the States in which Organisers shall be elected. Any National Construction Branch Organiser for a particular State shall be elected by the members of the Branch usually residing in that State.
- (2) Subject to the approval of the National Executive the Branch Executive may vary the number of employed Organisers from time to time.
- (3) All Organisers, elected or employed, shall in all cases conform to the direction of the Branch Secretary, District Secretary or Divisional Secretary by which they are employed.
- (4) All elected Organisers shall be subject to removal from Office pursuant to Rule 20 or 34.
- (5) All employed Organisers appointed by the National Executive shall be subject to dismissal by the National Executive.
- (6) All employed Organisers appointed by a Branch Executive shall be subject to dismissal by the employing Branch Executive.
- (7) An Organiser-Branch Executive Committee Member shall in performing the duties of an Organiser conform to the direction of the Branch Secretary.

RULE 66 - METHOD OF BALLOTING - DIRECT ELECTORAL SYSTEM

(1) Subject to Rule 62 only those members who are financial members in the Union on March 31st in the year in which the election is held, shall be entitled to a ballot paper. A list of members in each Branch recorded as being financial at this date shall be compiled from the Branch Register of members by the end of April and certified by the Branch Secretary as a list of members entitled to receive a ballot paper.
