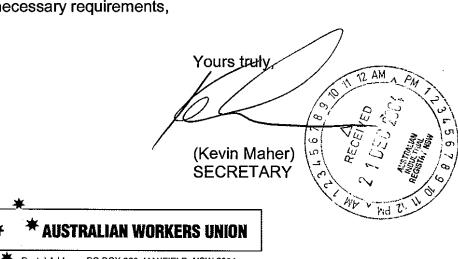

SCOPE

We have audited the financial statements of Australian Workers Union, Newcastle & Northern Regions Branch for the year ended 30 June 2004 as set out on pages 4 to 13. The management of the Union is responsible for the preparation of the financial statements and the information contained therein. We have conducted an independent audit of the financial statements in order to express an opinion on it to the members of the Union.

Our audit has been conducted in accordance with the Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. Our procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial statements, and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects, the financial statements are presented fairly in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards and the Workplace Relations Act 1996 so as to present a view of the Union which is consistent with our understanding of its financial position and the results of its operations.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2004

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles using the accruals basis of accounting.

Australian Accounting Standards and Statements of Accounting Concepts, as issued by the joint professional accounting bodies, have been adopted where applicable.

(a) PROPERTY, PLANT & EQUIPMENT

Property, plant and equipment are brought to account at cost or at independent or directors' valuation, less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation or amortisation. The carrying amount of property, plant and equipment is reviewed annually by Directors to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employed and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to present values in determining recoverable amount.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised leased assets, but excluding freehold land, are depreciated over their useful lives commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Properties held for investment purposes are not subject to a depreciation charge. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Class of Fixed Asset	Depreciation Rate
Building improvements	2.5%
Motor vehicles	22.5%
Fixtures, fittings & equipment	10%-40%

Revaluations of freehold land and buildings have not taken account of the potential capital gains tax on assets acquired after the introduction of capital gains tax.

(b) EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

Provision for employee entitlements in the form of Accrued Annual Leave has been made for the estimated accrued entitlements of all employees on the basis of their terms of employment. Provision for employee entitlements in the form of Long Service Leave has also been made for the estimated accrued entitlements of the Office & Cleaning Staff. Related on-costs are included in these provisions.

(c) INCOME TAX

No provision for income tax is necessary as Industrial Trade Unions are exempt from income tax under Section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1997.

(d) OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTIONS

Union Contributions are accounted for on a cash receipts basis as opposed to the financial report which is prepared on an accrual basis.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2004

(e) COMPARATIVE FIGURES

Where required, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation in the current financial year.

(f) GOODS AND SERVICES TAX

Revenues, expenses and fixed assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) is included as a current asset or liability in the statement of financial position. Cash flows are included in the Statement of Cash Flows on a net basis. The GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to the ATO are classified as operating cash flows.

Financial Return - year ending 30 June 2004 (FR2004/531)

I refer to the documents lodged in the Registry on 21 December 2004.

Further information is required before the documents can be filed. I have set out below what remains to be done to complete the Branch's financial reporting obligations and have also identified other matters which may assist the Branch and its auditor when preparing its next financial return. References unless otherwise indicated are to the RAO Schedule¹.

Provision of Full Report to Members

I note that the "accounts" were distributed to members on 3 December 2004 and were presented to the Annual General Meeting of the Branch on 14 December 2004. I have assumed that the distribution took place through the Branch journal of which you enclosed a copy. There are two issues to which I draw your attention:

First, the RAO Schedule stipulates a minimum of 21 days between the provision of the "full report" of the Branch to its members and the general meeting at which the full report is presented. This period is to enable members to consider the documents and, if they wish, raise any issues at the meeting. The interval, as described in your letter appears not to have been observed. If it is intended to present the full report to a general meeting the 21 day period must be adhered to.

Second, the Branch must not only provide the general purpose financial report and the auditor's report to members but also the operating report. These three reports comprise the "full report" referred to in s265(1).

The operating report does not appear to be included in the journal distributed to members. If the operating report has not yet been provided to members, the Branch should now arrange to provide it.

This can be done in whatever manner will ensure its distribution to members and need not necessarily be through the journal. Please advise when the operating report has been provided to the members.

Committee of Management Statement

In this statement, the committee gives its opinion on certain matters on which it is required to express an opinion. A copy of the form of the statement is attached for your information. In the normal course of financial reporting, this certificate is completed before the auditor makes his or

her report. The committee of the Branch should meet and resolve to make the declaration of opinion as set out. If for some reason, the committee is unable to express an opinion on any matter, it should state why. A copy of the statement showing the date of the resolution of the committee, signed and dated should be lodged in the Registry.

Operating Report

The Operating Report omits the "prescribed information" referred to in s254(2)(f) which is detailed in RAO Regulation 159. In summary this information is:

- the number of members of the Branch at 30 June 2004
- the number of employees of the Branch measured on a full time equivalent basis; and
- the name of each person who has been a member of the committee of management during the financial year and the period he or she held that position

I note that information concerning the committee of management membership is contained in Note 16 to the Financial Statements and that the number of members is specified in the "statement by the accounting officer". There does not appear to be any reference to the number of employees.

This information is however part of the operating report and should be included in that report in future.

References to Legislation

Some documents lodged include references to, or were required by, the former provisions of the Workplace Relations Act which are no longer applicable. These documents include:

- Auditor's Report
 - o references to former s273 of the Workplace Relations Act in the "Audit Opinion"
 - o the form of the opinion also reflects the matters which were required to be stated under the former provisions of the legislation
 - o an auditor is now required to express an opinion on the matters referred to in s257(5) of the RAO Schedule.
- Note 15 to the Financial Statements the notice is in the form required under the former provisions of the legislation. Under the RAO Schedule, the financial report must include the notice specified under s272(5).
- "Statement by the Accounting Officer" this document is not required under the RAO Schedule
- "Committee of Management's Certificate" this document is not required under the RAO Schedule - the Committee of Management Statement replaces it.

Please note that each section of RAO Schedule has its own separate numbering to that of the main body of the Act. These should be cited as, for example "s272 of the RAO Schedule" if the reference is to RAO.

I have forwarded a copy of this letter to the Branch auditor for his information.

To complete the Branch's reporting requirements, please arrange for the committee of management to meet and complete the Committee of Management Statement and lodge a copy in the Registry and advise when the operating report has been provided to members.

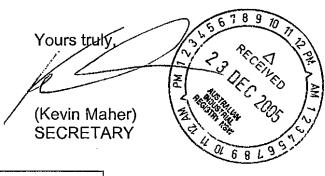
