Re: The Australian Workers' Union - Greater South Australian Branch Financial Reporting Obligations under *Workplace Relations Act 1996*

This is a courtesy letter to remind you of the financial reporting obligations of the abovenamed body under the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* ('the Act') for the financial year ended 30 June, 2003.

The legislative scheme set out in Part IX, Division 11 of the Act is directed at ensuring that a registered organisation or a branch of such an organisation discharges obligations of accountability to its members in relation to its financial affairs through proper and regular disclosure of financial information. The various steps of the financial reporting requirements must be carried out within the time-scales prescribed by the legislation so as to ensure the relevance of the financial information provided to the members.

Now that the financial year has ended, it is timely that you put in train the various steps of the financial reporting requirements. To assist you with this process I have enclosed for your information a notice summarising these requirements including the time-scales prescribed by the legislation.

Please note that a branch of an organisation may be exempted from the obligations arising under Part IX, Division 11 in respect of a financial year by satisfying a Registrar that the branch did not have any financial affairs during the financial year. An application under subsection 271A(1) of the Act must be made within 90 days (unless extended by a Registrar) after the end of the financial year.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2003

Recoverable amount of non-current assets (e)

The carrying amount of non-current assets are reviewed to determine whether they are in excess of their recoverable amount at balance sheet date. If the carrying amount of a non-current asset exceeds its recoverable amount, the asset is written down to the lower amount. The write-down is recognised as an expense in the statement of financial performance in reporting period in which it occurs.

Where a group of non-current assets working together supports the generation of cash inflows, recoverable amount is assessed in relation to that group of assets.

In assessing the recoverable amounts of non-current assets the relevant cash flows have not been discounted to their present value, except where specifically stated.

(f) Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on all items of property, plant and equipment so as to write off the assets progressively over their estimated useful life. Both the straight line and diminishing value methods of depreciation have been used.

The average depreciation rates applied for each class of asset are as follows:

Furniture & Fittings Computer Equipment 33.3 % Straight line

20% Straight line

Motor Vehicles

22.5% Diminishing value

Leased Plant and Equipment (g)

Leases of Plant and equipment under which the union assumes substantially all the risks and benefits of ownership are classified as finance leases. Other leases are classified as operating leases.

Finance leases are capitalised, recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments. Contingent rentals are written off as an expense of the accounting period in which they are incurred. Leased assets are depreciated on a diminishing value basis over their estimated useful lives or the term of the lease where it is likely that the Union will obtain ownership of the asset. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

Payments made under operating leases where substantially all the benefits and risks remain with the lessor are charged as an expense in the periods in which they are incurred.

2. INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED TO MEMBERS OR REGISTRAR

In accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act, 1996 the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of Section 272 which reads as follows:

- (1) "A member of a reporting unit, or a Registrar, may apply to the reporting unit (The Union) for specified prescribed information in relation to the reporting unit to be made available to the person making the application;
- (2) The application must be in writing and must specify the period within which, and the manner in which the information is to be made available. The period must not be less than 14 days after the application is given to the reporting unit.
- (3) A reporting unit must comply with an application made under Subsection (1).

(ii) Committee Members' Remuneration

Payments totalling \$1,622 (2002: \$2,012) were paid to rank and file committee members of the Executive as sitting fees for attending Executive meetings. No other amounts were paid to committee members during the financial year in their capacity as committee members.

(iii) Transactions with the Amalgamated AWU (SA) State Union

During the year, the Australian Workers Union Greater SA Branch charged the Amalgamated AWU (SA) State Union a management fee of \$240,000 for services rendered during the year ended 30 June 2003 (2002: \$250,000). All dealings are in the ordinary course of business.

As at 30 June 2003, the Union is owed a balance of \$57,110 by the AWU (SA) State Union (30 June 2002: \$56,031 owing to AWU (SA) State Union). The management fee and various operating costs met by the AWU (SA) State Union during the year on behalf of the Union have been charged and credited to the loan balance respectively

Scope

We have audited the financial report of Australian Workers Union Greater SA Branch for the year ended 30 June 2003 as set out on pages 1 to 18. The Union Executives are responsible for the financial report. We have conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the members of the Australian Workers Union Greater SA Branch.
